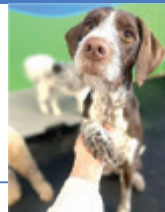

A big thank you to everyone who came out to the WHMCA Annual General Meeting on May 26. There was a very full agenda including updating of the bylaws and objects of the Association, discussion of the Urban Hen Program, and recognition of the outstanding efforts of our volunteers.

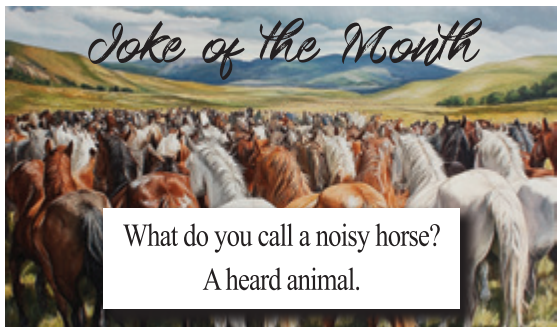

Groundbreaking Marks First Buildings at Midfield Heights

After eight long years of development limbo, exciting progress is underway at Midfield Heights! On Friday, May 1, a groundbreaking ceremony was held for the first buildings in the new development.

The first phase will include two four-storey apartment buildings located on the lot closest to the EMS building. Together, the buildings will provide 176 apartments, along with one level of underground parking offering 176 spaces.

Rohit Homes is constructing the buildings. During the design phase, Rohit Homes approached Calgary Housing with the idea that Calgary Housing would become the owner once construction is complete. Calgary Housing accepted the proposal and was able to secure funding support from both the provincial and federal governments.

Calgary Housing's goal is to create a mixed-income community, with residents from a range of income levels living in the apartments. Most monthly rents are expected to be near or at market rates.

Crime Update

I wanted to provide some information regarding a crime trend within not only District 3, but the City of Calgary. Catalytic converter thefts are again trending upwards, with 90 thefts already reported so far in 2026.

It can take just a matter of minutes for thieves to cut the car part from underneath a parked vehicle. The motivation behind the thefts are the precious metals contained within the converters, which have high resale value.

In 2023, CPS had partnered with Kal Tire locations across Calgary at which time a program to have your catalytic converter engraved with the vehicle identification number was initiated. I would encourage vehicle owners to ensure they park in well-lit areas when possible at night and be vigilant with reporting suspicious persons and vehicles.

These thefts are one of several property crime issues we are managing alongside daily calls for service, and while more resources would always help, we are directing focused attention to this trend based on analysis that identified it as a district priority. We have had success identifying offenders in the past, and our office is currently finalizing an Operational Plan to target the individuals responsible for these thefts. This operation will be implemented in the upcoming weeks and in the meantime, we ask that community members be on the lookout for an older model silver Nissan Xterra with larger tires and black wheels. We encourage members of the public to report suspicious activity to Police when it is seen and to be a good witness when patrol unit attends.

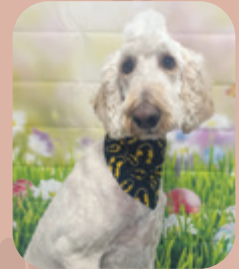

Calgary is a city that builds, competes, volunteers, and shows up. That is why I was pleased to see the Spring Economic Update include \$755 million in sports funding. This investment will help more kids and families become active, support community programs and facilities, and back the world-class athletes who make Canadians proud.

Sport is community-building. It is where youth learn teamwork, where families connect, and where local organizations create belonging — on fields, rinks, courts, and tracks.

The update also includes measures that matter for affordable housing in Calgary. At Midfield Heights, 176 new homes received \$20 million through the Alberta Housing Partnership Program, part of a ten-year, \$678 million cost-matched investment to get homes built for Albertans. These are safe, affordable homes made possible through partnership, showing what happens when governments and community organizations work together to move housing from idea to reality.

The Spring Economic Update continues that work nationally, with measures to unlock new housing supply, accelerate low-cost financing for rental homes, support factory-built housing, and help provinces and territories remove construction barriers. For Calgary families, that means more homes, more options, and stronger, more connected communities.

There is also support for workers and young people, including Team Canada Strong, which will help train and hire the skilled trades we need for housing, infrastructure, and major projects. The update builds on 175,000 employment and work-integrated learning opportunities through Canada Summer Jobs, the Youth Employment and Skills Strategy, and the Student Work Placement Program.

For Calgary, these measures mean stronger communities, more affordable homes, more opportunities for youth, and better pathways into skilled trades. As your MP, my focus is making sure federal policy keeps delivering to build a Calgary, Alberta, and Canada strong for all of us.

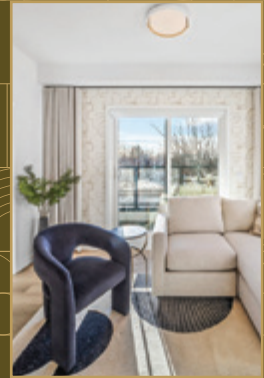
