# **Hall Rentals Basics**

### Can I Rent the Hall?

Any person over the age of 21 may rent the hall. The hall can be rented for independent group programs, presentations, and personal events such as birthday parties.

### When Can I Book Hall Rentals?

Hall rentals must be booked at the Lake office. You must come into the lake office to book your rental, as we must go through a rental contract and necessary information with you.

### What Do I Need to Rent the Hall?

You need your photo ID, payment for the hall rental, and a damage deposit cheque for \$400 at the minimum. If you will be having alcohol at your event, you must obtain a liquor license and Party Alcohol Liability Insurance. Proof of these must be given seven days prior to the event.

# **ALRA MONTHLY UPDATE**

Hi Arbour Lake Residents!

Summer is finally here! The lake is fully open! Come on down for some fun in the sun. See our website for information on the lake status or call the office if you have any questions. A reminder that flagpoles are located around the lake and at the front entrance.

## Watch the Flags!

Red = full closure. Please stay off and far away from the water.

Yellow = partial closure. Please contact the lake office or check the website for updates.

Green = the lake is open for all activities.

### **Water Safety**

As a reminder, here are some safety tips:

- Arbour lake is an unsupervised lake. Use of the lake and its amenities is at your own risk.
- There is no lifeguard on duty. Please watch children at all times.
- Always keep your small children within arm's reach.
- We highly recommend that children wear a PFD at all times.
- Children must remain in the buoyed swim area.
- Swim aids and toys must remain in the swim area.
- Swimming with a buddy is safer and way more fun.
- No diving.
- No swimming, diving, or playing in the water by the fishing docks!
- · No swimming or boating during lightning storms.
- Parents: If your children are under the age of 12, you must remain at the lake with them at all times. They cannot be left unsupervised.

### Remember the Lake Rules

Summer is here and we are all very excited to have fun at the lake, but there are some very important rules to remember!

### Members

- Presentation of a membership card or app code is mandatory to gain access to the lake.
- Members 11 years or younger must be accompanied by a responsible member who is 12 years of age or older.
- Residents under 18 who are not yet registered as a member must be registered by the homeowner.

- Replacement membership cards may be purchased for \$25.
- Arbour Lake staff reserve the right to restrict entry to anyone.
- ALRA has the right to make further reasonable rules and regulations.


### Guests

- · Adult members are permitted a maximum of five guests per household per day.
- Members under the age of 16 are permitted a maximum of two quests at any time and quests must provide photo ID.
- Members are responsible for the actions of their guests.
- All guests must be accompanied by a member at all times and can never be left in the lake alone.
- Members may not check in quests without a current lake card.
- Members under 18 years of age who bring guests must leave their lake card at the office and quests must leave a piece of picture ID with the member's lake card. Members and guests may retrieve their ID upon departure.

### **Prohibitions**

- Open fires or portable BBQs
- Personal watercraft equipment
- Glass bottles, glass containers, glass cups, etc.
- Alcohol, drugs, cigarettes, vapes, or similar substances
- Animals
- Bicycles, skateboards, or other vehicles
- Motorboats or snowmobiles
- Taking sand off the beach
- Digging deep holes in the beach
- Inflatable water toys or equipment. Only infant water wings are permitted.
- There is no smoking inside the park or parking lot.
- · No person shall at any time discharge, deposit, throw, dump, or place any trash or debris of any kind whatsoever in the lake, on lake property, or in lake dumpsters.



# **FISHING**





You CANNOT use barbed hooks, triple hooks or egg hooks!!!

CATCH AND RELEASE ONLY THIS IS FOR ALL FISH OF ALL SIZES AND KINDS!

Injured fish that cannot be returned to the water, MUST be handed over to a staff member for disposal.

# Fishing is Catch and Release Only!

At this time, only catch and release fishing will be permitted at Arbour Lake, until further notice. There will be no keeping of any fish of any kind of size! This is a result of Alberta Environment and Parks shutting sown all fish stocking within the bow river drainage area, of which Arbour Lake is included. Due to whirling disease found in the Bow River and commercial fish culture operations, no fish may be kept. Any fish that cannot be returned to the water, must be surrendered to a staff member.

# **Fishing**

- May only be done from the designated fishing docks.
- Hooks must be Barbless and egg hooks are not permitted.
   No triple hooks are to be used. This ensures the survival of released fish.
- No live bait, corn, bread, minnows, smelts, fish or nets may be used to catch fish.
- Only one rod per resident may be cast at any one time and fishing lines must be attended to at all times.
- Random tackle box, bag and hook checks will be performed to ensure all Rules & Regulations are being followed.

# **Eutrophication**

Here is some information on how important it is to be careful with how much fertilizer you use on your lawn. When you use too much ferilizer on your lawn, the excess nutrients are carried away by the rain and other forms or irrigation. The nutrients mix with water and find their way into our beautiful lake. These nutrients cause the algae and plants in the water to multifply rapidly, creating an algae bloom. This excessive amount of algae prevents sunlight from reaching the bottom of the lake. The plants lacking sunlight will die at the bottom of the lake where decomposers will use up the oxygen. When a bloom occurs, there is too much organic matter ready to decompose and all the remaining oxygen in the water is used by decomposers to decompose dead plants. This can cause all our fish to suffocate from the lack of oxygen. With your help in preventing the overuse of fertilizer, we can work together to keep the lake healthy and beautiful for all residents to enjoy.












Prior to the summer adjournment I raised questions in the House of Commons about the high cost of living and the impact of interest rate increases on homeowners with mortgages, and on those who want to buy their first home.

Many homeowners are concerned about the impact of high interest rates on monthly budgets when their mortgages renew. The cost of government is driving up the cost of living and pushing up interest rates. Persistent deficits, which began well before the COVID crisis, contribute to inflation, which causes interest rates to go up, resulting in higher payments.

Many young Canadians are giving up on the dream of homeownership, and renting is increasingly unaffordable. I urged the government to reign in its spending to get inflation and interest rates under control, and to stop blocking energy infrastructure projects to preserve and create high paying jobs in Alberta.

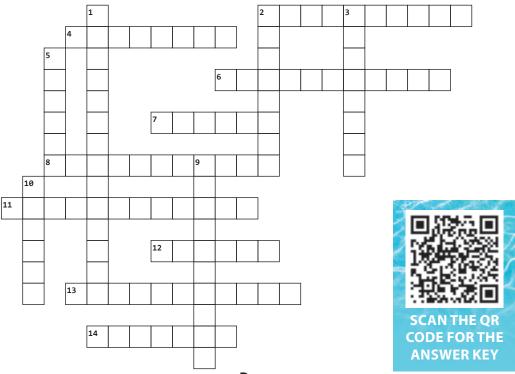
The government has also made necessities like fuel, food, and home heating more expensive with a significant increase to the carbon tax on April 1, and the introduction of a second carbon tax (clean fuel regulation) which came into effect on July 1. I repeatedly asked the government to stop raising taxes that increase the price of basic necessities and disproportionately impact the vulnerable.

I worked on two Parliamentary reports recently tabled in the House of Commons. The Defence committee tabled "Cyber Defence of Canada", and the Access to Information Privacy and Ethics committee tabled "The State of Access to Information in Canada". Both reports contain important recommendations that I hope the government will act upon.
