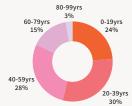

- **3. FUTURE:** What's important to you and for future generations when thinking about how the area could evolve.



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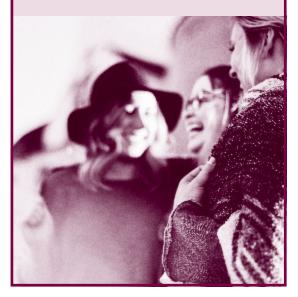

Need Affordable Food?



The Good Food Box makes top-quality, fresh food available in a way that does not stigmatize people, fosters community development, and promotes healthy eating.

What Is It?

The Good Food Box (GFB) is a program under the Community Kitchen Program of Calgary whereby they purchase fresh fruits and vegetables at a very low cost from growers and distributors in Calgary. The Good Food Box is a hand-up program as opposed to hand-out. They offer all Calgarians and surrounding areas sustainable access to nutritious food to ensure that everyone can afford fresh produce, so no one has to go hungry. The boxes are put together by dedicated volunteers who, along with The Community Kitchen Program and the BTCA, desire to see individuals and families accessing affordable nutritious food.

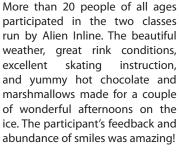

On March 19, 2023, I had the pleasure of visiting Al-Salam Centre in Ranchlands for their open house event. This invitation was sent to communities in the hopes to build bridges between the Muslim community of Calgary and people from other walks of life. This was an opportunity to learn more about the Islamic faith and meet some neighbours.

Perfectly timed before Ramadan, Al-Salam Centre's Open House was very welcoming. I wish to thank you for the vast amounts of food and beverages that you had available. There were so many children! I was especially impressed by the two young boys who stood in front of an audience and spoke about why Islam and prayer are important to them. This was all done impromptu which was very impressive!

The Al-Salam Centre offered the Qur'an to anyone interested which was offered in many different languages. The henna station allowed young ladies and women to get beautiful designs done on their hands, and mine lasted for weeks after. Men were allowed to choose and try on a keffiyeh. Women were allowed to try on a hijab, and I chose a gorgeous grey-silver one which I needed help putting on. There were many different colours to choose from. Children enjoyed creating crafts and colouring but were more preoccupied with the myriad of children to play with.

I am very humbled and honoured by this invitation and I am so glad that I was able to attend. Many thanks to those from the Al-Salam Centre who were very kind, generous, and so very friendly. You were able to answer so many of my questions and I learned more than I could have expected. This was a delightful event for any age group. I got to meet the Imam, Ebrahim, who was very welcoming, had a wonderful sense of humour, and one could easily ascertain that he genuinely cares about people.

Last year, Banff Trail Community was saddened to learn about the passing of Nurul Khan (see February issue, 2022). Nurul was a very active community member as a former member of the board and founder of the Conversation Club at the Banff Trail Community Hall. He was respectfully very curious about my culture and spirituality, and I was very curious about his, so we were always asking questions and sharing.

Last year, I observed Ramadan in his honour. This year, I did the same.

It is my sincere hope that there will be more events such as these that provide educational opportunities as well as build bridges between our diverse people. Many thanks to the Ranchlands Community and the Al-Salam Centre for allowing opportunities for people to connect and respectfully learn from each other.

In 2022, we raised ~\$5,000 in funding, wrote over a dozen grant applications, engaged with four different vendors for design options, and established a relationship with the Parks Foundation Calgary.

This year, our goals are:

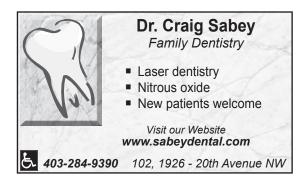
- 1. To raise at least \$5,000 more through fundraising
- 2. Receive funding from the BTCA
- 3. Approach local businesses for donations and support
- Apply for additional grants and improve our success rate of being awarded grants through our relationship with the Parks Foundation
- Complete a formal vendor selection process and finalize a playground design through the Parks Foundation

Our target construction date is the spring/summer of 2024.

Currently, we have five members on the committee and are looking for a few more dedicated volunteers to help with fundraising, grant writing, and playground design. We are going to be establishing monthly meetings on the second or third Mondays of each month at the BTCA hall. Our next meeting will be on May 15.
