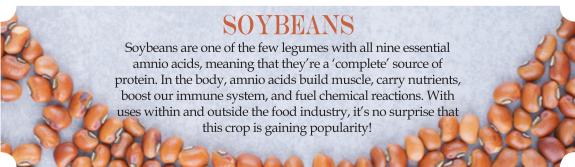

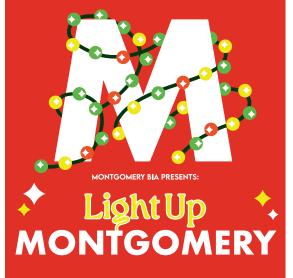

### Fall Candle Care: How to Prevent Tunneling

Fall is a popular time for candlelight and cozy nights in, which means dusting off your candle collection. You might notice that some have developed a deep "tunnel" around the wick, making it difficult to light. Tunneling also shortens the life of your candle as only the wax in the centre of the candle will burn down.

Here are a few easy ways to prevent or fix tunneling so you can enjoy your favourite candles this season:

#### Prevention

When you light a candle for the first time, allow it to burn long enough to melt all the way to the edges of the candle jar. This ensures an even burn for the duration of your candle's life as wax has a "memory" so to speak. The first burn sets the tone for subsequent burns and will help you get the most burn-time out of your new candle.

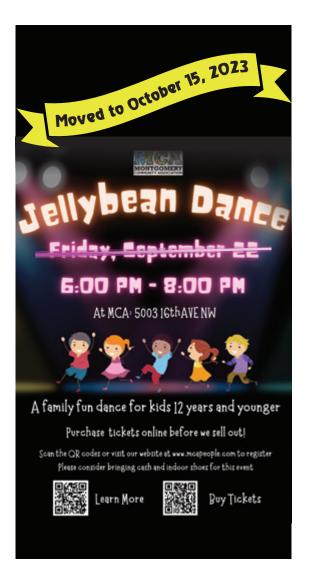
If you find that your candles are constantly tunneling, despite letting the wax melt to the edges of the jar, consider buying higher quality candles. Most candles on the market are made of paraffin wax (a toxic byproduct of petroleum) and are more predisposed to tunneling. Higher grade waxes like coconut, soy, or beeswax burn cleaner, longer, and more evenly.

#### The Fix

If you have an old candle that's already tunneling, here are two easy ways to fix it:

- Set your oven to 80°C (176°F) then remove anything flammable from your candle, such as labels or string.
   Once the oven is hot, place your candle on a baking tray for five minutes. This should heat the entire surface of the wax, making it smooth. With oven mitts, remove the candle and let it cool before lighting it.
- Wrap aluminum foil around the top of your candle and angle it inwards like a dome. Ensure that the flame is far enough away from the foil and that there is still a hole to vent air. The foil will help the wax to heat up evenly. Keep a careful eye on your candle until the top layer of wax has melted, leaving a smooth surface, then remove the foil.

With these easy steps, you can enjoy your candles this season without any tunneling. If this article helped you, be sure to share it with a friend or loved one!

#### Feedback and Assessment

No matter what people say everyone appreciates feedback from their colleagues and their leaders. Feedback is vital in both the workplace and everyday life, but we can pay lip service at best, or ignore it completely at worst.

Without feedback, people are left to their own perceptions as to how they are doing. These perceptions are fueled by ego. If you're confident, you may think almost everything you do is great. Alternatively, if you have low self-esteem, you might imagine that very little that you do is good enough or matters much in the grand scheme of things. People need guidance, even if it's to confirm for them that everything is great, but also to fine-tune. Is anybody so perfect that they need no quidance whatsoever?

There are two common ways to implement feedback: immediate and the formal assessment.

#### **Immediate Feedback**

Immediate feedback is something not only every leader should practice often, but every worker too (to colleagues). Nothing instills pride and sends a message that contributions matter, more than unsolicited, positive feedback. It's the key motivational tool available in the workplace. Immediate positive feedback can be delivered one-to-one, but it has much more impact if it's delivered in front of the team. Add some kind of award as a visual reminder of the kudo, and the aftereffects will last longer.

Immediate feedback is just as important when something needs correcting. If this doesn't happen, and a situation repeats itself and more serious steps are needed, the worker could declare "Nobody ever mentioned this to me before." Just be careful, even a serious mess needs to be handled with wisdom, fairness, lack of judgment, respect, and a sincere offer of help. Unlike positive feedback, correction must be done in private. Nobody wants to be embarrassed in front of their peers.

#### **Formal Assessment**

The formal assessment is more of a record of progression. In my opinion, a formal assessment issued annually is almost as useless as none at all. Do you remember what noteworthy things you or your team did ten months ago?

Assessment writers complain that there's no time to deliver assessments for everyone multiple times per year. Assessments then become a yearly occurrence or disappear altogether. There's a better way. Simplify the assessment and let the person(s) being assessed do some of the work. Suggest that workers keep a list of accomplishments to assist with this, which they will share with you. Weekly or bi-monthly check-ins with each person can accumulate notes that can effortlessly become the next assessment's content.

The problem with many assessments is that they are too complicated. If I can't read my entire assessment in less than two or three minutes, it's too much. The only things that matter are goals, accomplishments, areas of improvement, and requests for resources to work better. Make sure to look at the last assessment(s) briefly to determine if past issues have been addressed.

In summary, create a culture of immediate feedback. Then formalize that feedback more than annually using a short, simple format. Weigh the worker's needs as much as their progression.

### Changes to Green Cart Collection This Fall: What You Need to Know

from the City of Calgary

Starting in November, green cart collection will be once every other week, resuming weekly in the spring. Here's what you need to know:

- Fill Your Green Cart First: Leaves, branches, grass, and plants can go directly inside the green cart. If it's full, use paper yard waste bags for extra waste.
- Extra Yard Waste Bags: Place them at least 0.5 meters (2 feet) away from your cart. Roll the tops closed to prevent spills, and make sure you can lift the bag with one hand.
- No Plastic Bags: They are not allowed in your green cart.

#### Do You Have Too Much Yard Waste?

You can drop off yard waste free of charge at any landfill from Friday, September 22, 2023, to Saturday, November 4, 2023.
