The annual May Plant Count is an event where volunteers survey their favourite natural areas to collect data on the distribution and blooming of flowering plants in Alberta. Collection of plant specimens is not allowed in any protected or restricted areas, such as Nose Hill Park. The survey, which takes place between May 25 and 31, encourages stewardship and is based on appreciation of nature.

Expertise in identification is valuable, but not mandatory. It is open to anyone with an interest in plants and flowering. As a citizen scientist, your photos submitted during the count period will contribute to the databases. To join the project, go to https://inaturalist.ca/projects/alberta-may-plant-count. In order to submit observations, you will need to log in and create an account (which is free).

The May Plant Count is part of the May Species Count. It began in 1976 to track bird species across Alberta and, in 2011, over 300,000 birds were counted. In 2022, over 400 people participated in the bird count. ## Tilla the Potentilla – A Much Loved Learning Grounds Shrub

The students at North Haven School were fortunate to be provided with an opportunity in the fall to plant small shrubs in the Learning Grounds. Students in our Paced Learning Program (PLP), for students with mild to moderate learning and adaptive behaviour needs, eagerly looked at our shrub (a potentilla) and explored the water and light needs of this plant. Students took a class vote and decided to name our shrub "Tilla."

Tilla was planted and lovingly tended to by our students until the snow arrived. Three times a week the students would carry water in 4L milk jugs from our classroom out to Tilla and other plants in the Learning Grounds. Students learned the art of cooperation and team work as there were not enough jugs for each student to carry. Some found the task of carrying the jug exhausting, so they would negotiate with a peer to assist with the carrying process. Students formed a connection with Tilla and that connection spread to other shrubs and soon to the larger trees that had been planted. They are eager to watch for the first signs of leaves on Tilla and Tilla's companions in the Learning Grounds.

It is the hope of these students that others in the community will love Tilla and the Learning Grounds as much as they do. Remember to take the time to view the world through the eyes of a child. The fascination of a new discovery awaits all in the North Haven Learning Grounds!

## **Mural Update**

North Haven's pedestrian underpass to Nose Hill Park will have a mural installed this summer! In March, a selection panel of North Haven residents, Indigenous advisors, and other experts met to choose an artist for the mural. We're very excited to announce that Stephanie One Spot, a senior student at Alberta University of the Arts will be creating the artwork and leading the installation this summer.

Stephanie One Spot is an accomplished artist and curator. She has been involved in numerous shows in the Calgary area, including From the Land: Indigenous Ecological Art for a New Era at the ATB Gallery, Our Stories, Our Voices, Our Ways at Fort Calgary, and Forward Together at The Bows. Stephanie grew up on Tsuut'ina reserve, close to the buffalo paddock, where she could always walk out and experience the land. She is inspired by her natural surroundings, gardening with her mother, and the traditional stories told to her by her father.

Her painting practice explores time, memory, and space. Her works are primarily mixed media, working with projection, photographs, spray paint, acrylics, and natural materials such as hide, willow, sand, dirt, trees, and bark. Her concept for the mural is based around traditional stories and the animals who roamed the Nose Hill area for many millennia.

This project is a partnership between the North Haven Community Association, the City of Calgary, and Alberta University for the Arts' Lodgepole Centre. Originally scheduled for the summer of 2022, the project was moved to 2023 after various delays ate up the short window of hot weather needed for outdoor painting. The installation will take place this summer, with the start date determined by the weather.

Stephanie will be presenting her sketches for the mural and holding an informal artist's talk sometime in May. Watch for an announcement of the date and time; we hope to see you there!



#### Our themed cocktail is Sea Glass

#### **Ingredients:**

- 1 egg white or the equivalent using meringue powder
- Salt
- Sprite or 7UP
- · Lemon wedge

#### Instructions:

- Combine the first four ingredients in a shaker with ice and shake for about twenty seconds. Strain into a rocks glass.
- Remove ice from the shaker, add the mixed drink back to the shaker, and dry shake for another thirty seconds.
- Salt the rim of the glass using your lemon wedge to wet the rim. Pour the cocktail into the glass.
- Top with Sprite or 7UP. Garnish with a lemon wedge and enjoy!

## Big News for the North Haven Learning Grounds!

Spring is here and the Learning Grounds are waking up after winter. The project team has been busy closing out Phase 1 of the naturalization project at North Haven Elementary School and is planning for Phase 2. We are very excited to announce that Phase 2 is going to be amazing! The North Haven Learning Grounds was recently awarded \$125,000 through the Alberta Community Facility Enhancement Program (CFEP) fund. This is huge news for the project and means that we will indeed be able to plant more trees, extend pathways, and continue to develop this wonderful space in the heart of our community.

The CFEP award is special because it is a matching grant. This means we had to have \$125,000 raised towards the project in order to win an additional \$125,000, the maximum amount awarded through the CFEP fund. Your donated bottles, school sports day toonies, and cash donations – nearly \$10,000 in individual cash donations – made a huge difference. The Leaning Grounds team would like to sincerely thank everyone who contributed to this project; this is your win, too.


