Join the Ranchlands Board of Directors: Shape Your Community's Future!

Be a driving force behind the growth and vibrancy of our neighbourhood. Consider running for a position on the Ranchlands Board of Directors this November! The Ranchlands Board of Directors is composed of seven dedicated volunteers, filling the roles of four executive officers and three directors at large. Each of these roles comes with unique responsibilities, offering you the chance to contribute in a way that aligns with your skills, interests, and availability.

Community Association President: Leading the Way

As the President, you will be at the forefront of community development. You'll oversee all board activities, guide decision-making processes, and represent Ranchlands in liaising with government representatives and city departments. This role requires excellent leadership and communication skills. It's a time-intensive position, but the satisfaction of delivering positive change is immeasurable. You can expect a monthly time commitment of approximately ten to 15 hours.

Community Association Vice President: Supporting the President

The Vice President's role is to back up the President in their responsibilities and preside over meetings in their absence. This position requires a keen understanding of the community's needs and the ability to collaborate effectively with the entire board. You'll be an essential pillar of support and leadership. You can expect a monthly time commitment of approximately eight to 12 hours.

Secretary: Keeping Things Organized

As the Secretary, you'll be responsible for managing communications, taking meeting minutes, and ensuring smooth information flow within the board and the community. This position demands excellent organizational skills and attention to detail. You'll play a vital role in keeping everyone informed and connected. You can expect a monthly time commitment of approximately six to ten hours.

Treasurer: Balancing the Books

The Treasurer takes charge of the budget, financial records, and reporting. If you have a knack for numbers and financial management, this role allows you to make crucial financial decisions and maintain the financial health of our community projects. You will work closely with our bookkeeper. You can expect a monthly time commitment of approximately eight to 12 hours.

Directors at Large: Your Creative Input Counts

Directors at large have the opportunity to bring their unique perspectives and expertise to the board. These roles involve planning events, assisting with event coordination, and spearheading grant applications. If you're looking to be directly involved in community engagement and project execution, this is the role for you. You can expect a monthly time commitment of approximately five to ten hours.

Commitment and Expectations

For directors and executive officers alike, the time commitment involves attending one board meeting per month (approximately two hours) and taking the lead in planning one event, assisting in planning another event, and being the lead on one grant application. On average, you can expect to dedicate around five to 15 hours per month, depending on your role.

If you're eager to shape the future of Ranchlands, we encourage you to consider running for a position on the Ranchlands Board of Directors. The term is fixed at one year. You must be at least 18 years old, reside in the community, and hold a valid RCA membership. RCA memberships can be conveniently purchased online at ranchlandscommunity.com for just \$20. Exploring Nose Hill: A Hands-On Field Guide by Jill Kirker and Diana Kary was published by Grassroots NW: Environmental Awareness Society; it offers an introduction explaining why people should study Nose Hill Park and "how to" use this guide. There are maps of tours such as the NW Interpretive one and those of Meadowlark Prairie, Many Owls Valley, Wintering Hill, (Buffalo) Rubbing Stone Hill, and Porcupine Valley. After Nose Hill geology and an erratic boulder as part of a glacial lake, there is more about Nose Hill human history.

Check out tepee rings, native stories, the Blackfoot Nation, and exploration and settlement. The six habitats are fescue grasslands, previously cultivated land, shrubs, aspen groves, gravel, and wetlands. Suggested activities are for biodiversity, prairie field study, a mural of the prairie community, a grasslands species and food web, or hands-on weed control. With so many animal types there are also activities related to grouse, raptors, bird migration, ants, grasshoppers, gophers, ground squirrels, and mule deer on the Island Game. Learn more about the food chain, ecosystem, and sampling life in the pond-area wetlands. Studies can lead to other native grass areas of Calgary and designing wildlife corridors. Another important topic that is touched on is the world-wide issue of endangered species and grasslands.

Phase 2 engagement begins in October focusing on Calgary's 20-year plan for how we develop, redevelop, and manage parks. Fall 2023 feedback will be on public park policies. Input is also needed from businesses, agencies, and organizations. A 'What We Heard' report from Phase 2 will be published in winter 2023. Phase 3 engagement will inform a draft plan. By spring 2024, the 'Connect: Calgary's Parks Plan' will be final and then presented to City Council in summer 2024. Have your say at https://engage.calgary.ca/parks.plan.
