KING'S CORNER

"How Do You Earn the Right to Sit at a Desk?"

As a retired educator, there was no greater satisfaction than having a former student come up to me in the street and say, "I want to thank you for teaching me about life and for making a difference in my world." Even today, I still remember many of my favourite teachers and the important lessons that they taught me that went far above the classroom. This is one such story of a remarkable teacher who cared about her students.

In September of 2005, on the first day of school, Martha Cothren, a history teacher at Valley Heights High School in Port Rowan, Ontario, did something not to be forgotten. On the first day of school, with the permission of the school superintendent, the principal, and the building supervisor, she removed all of the desks in her classroom. When the first period students entered the room, they discovered that there were no desks. "Ms. Cothren, where are the desks?" She replied, "You can't have a desk until you tell me how you earn the right to sit at a desk." They thought, "Well, maybe it's our grades." "No," she said. "Maybe it's our behaviour." She told them, "No, it's not even your behaviour."

They came and went, the first period, second period, and third period. Still no desks in the classroom. Kids called their parents to tell them what was happening and by early afternoon, television news crews had started gathering at the school to report this crazy teacher who had taken the desks out of her room. The final period of the day came and as the puzzled students found seats on the floor of the deskless classroom, Martha Cothren said, "Throughout the day, no one has been able to tell me just what he or she has done to earn the right to sit at the desks that are ordinarily found in this classroom. Now I'm going to tell you."

At this point, she went over to the door of her classroom and opened it. 27 veterans, all in uniform, walked into that classroom, each one carrying a school desk. The vets began placing the school desks in rows and then they would walk over and stand alongside the wall. By the time the last soldier had set the final desk in place,

those students started to understand, perhaps for the first time in their lives, just how the right to sit at those desks had been earned.

Martha said, "You didn't earn the right to sit at these desks. These heroes did it for you. They placed the desks here for you. They went halfway around the world, giving up their education and interrupting their careers and families so you could have the freedom you have. Now, it's up to you to sit in them. It is your responsibility to learn, to be good students, to be good citizens. They paid the price so that you could have the freedom to get an education. Don't ever forget it."

Now For the Rest of the Story:

This is a true story and Martha Cothren was awarded Veterans of Foreign Wars Teacher of the Year Award in 2006. By the way, she is the daughter of a World War II POW.

Until next time, remember our Canadian history is our legacy and shouldn't be taken for granted.





Winter Garden Reflections

Winter is a good time for reflecting on your yard and garden, critically assessing what is working and what isn't, and deciding if changes need to be made.

Sunlight and Zone

The first thing to consider is the amount of sun that a plant gets in its current home and the plant's zone hardiness. Calgary's zone has changed in recent years, we are now zoned 4a which means that most plants zoned for 2 and 3 will do well here, and many that are zoned for area 4 will too. Keep in mind that the zoning information that comes with plants also indicates what zones they have been tested in. If a plant that can grow well in zone 3 was only tested in zone 4, the label will only say zone 4.

The days are shorter in the winter, but you can still take a good look at your space throughout the day and try to keep track of how much sunlight the area gets. Remember that the days are longer in the summer and the sun is higher, but this can give you a bit of an idea, especially if you do this a few times throughout the year. Also consider the existing plants both in your yard and those around you. Your neighbour's trees are going to have leaves in the summer, so think about how that will affect your yard. If a plant needs full sun, that means it needs at least six hours of direct sunlight for the entire growing season, not just in the middle of summer when the sun is at its highest. Part sun means at least three to six hours.

If you think this might be where the problem lies, you might simply be able to move the plant to another area or perhaps, if you really like where it is, or it isn't a plant that moves well, you can manipulate the climate where it is, creating a bit of a microclimate.

If the space is too hot or too sunny, there are a few things you can do to change the climate. First, you might be able to plant something else to provide shade. This could be a perennial plant or bush, or even just larger annuals. Decorative items or fencing could also be added to provide shade. Any of these might also be considered if the plant in question needs to be buffered from the wind.

If the area is too cold, you might need to find a way to allow more sunlight by trimming neighbouring plants or consider placing more rocks or bricks around the area. At night, these will radiate the heat they collected throughout

the day. Also, could the fence or wall nearby be painted, or would a darker mulch help to attract heat? Should you be covering the plants more in the spring either with row cover fabric, or perhaps clear plastic? Does it need an extra layer of mulch over the winter? Water is also a great insulator, so I wonder if you could fill one or two-litre pop bottles with water and bury them just under the surface, laying horizontally, near the base of a plant you want to keep warm? Throughout the day the sun will warm the water, which will later maintain its heat well into the night. I have not tried this, but you can buy planters with water filled bases, so I imagine it could help, just remember where they are so that you don't hit one with a shovel and create a bit of a surprise!

Soil Type and Moisture

While you are looking at light, look at moisture and soil type. Did you plant in soil you brought in or is this what was here after construction? If the soil isn't the greatest, can it be amended with compost, peat moss, worm castings, or other organic matter? Some plants are heavy feeders and need rich soil that is full of nutrients, while other plants are the opposite and do better in poor soil.

The same goes for moisture. Where does this bed sit in your yard? Is it low and moisture tends to pool there or is it higher and therefore fairly dry? Are you willing to change the elevation? How much watering are you willing to do? Watering is my biggest issue. I really don't like to use a lot of water from both an environmental and economic point of view, so I have rain barrels, but I also don't always have time to be watering them by hand like that system requires, so I need to base my plant choices on the level of effort I am truly willing to invest in my watering.

Appropriateness

Finally, once you have considered the light, temperature, soil, and moisture, ask yourself if you are really willing to put in the time and effort that this plant requires. If something isn't working in my yard, the most likely culprit is neglect. I am a very inconsistent gardener and do best with hardy, independent plants. So, no matter how lovely something is, I need to be realistic about who I am as a gardener and how committed I will be to my plants. If something really isn't working, perhaps someone else can provide a better home for it and then I can visit it there!

Winter Cart Placement Tips

from the City of Calgary

Follow these winter tips to keep your cart collection safe and on schedule:

- Clear snow and ice to put your carts on even ground. Don't place carts behind or on top of snowbanks.
- Leave enough space around your carts to easily walk between and around them.
- Store carts in a sheltered spot and move them out on collection day so they don't freeze to the ground. Move carts back by 7:00 pm on collection day.
- Clear snow off your carts and keep lids closed. Snow in your blue cart ruins quality recyclables and makes them difficult to sort at the facility, meaning they can't be turned into new products.
- Prevent food and yard waste from freezing inside your green cart. Use compostable bags or place crumpled newspaper or a pizza box at the bottom of the cart.
