MESSAGE FROM THE BOARD

Spring, with all its excitement and changes, is on the way! Here are a few updates on what's going on in your neighbourhood, and what we're working on for you.

Don Bosco Playground Update

It is March and Don Bosco School is still working on getting the funding in place for a new playscape to replace the outdated one being removed in June. The school is relying on community and parent fundraisers to raise capital for this endeavor and March is the make-or-break month. If Don Bosco School is unable to get sufficient funding pulled together to match the grant funding for which they have qualified, that funding will go to another, unrelated, initiative in the city. Don Bosco School is the only school within our Deer Ridge community boundaries, and it would be very unfortunate for the children and the families of this neighbourhood to be without a playscape. We commend the parents and school staff who have worked tirelessly to come up with new and interesting ideas for fundraisers - thank you so much, each and every one of you, for your innovation, hard work, and belief that it can be done – we appreciate you.

Rinks Update

Our rink volunteers have worked very hard through this winter of variable temperatures to keep a good surface on each of the two ice rinks. We are very grateful to them for their hard work and dedication, and for being out there in all kinds of weather, looking after this amazing community asset for us. We have been gratified to see that people have been out skating and enjoying the rinks for shinny and pleasure skating, and just getting together, at all times of the day and often well into the evening. Our rink volunteers will try to keep the rink going for as long as the weather for it holds, but in March, anything can happen. Make sure you subscribe to the Deer Ridge email bulletin, so you can get current news and timely email updates on anything that's happening in the community.



Ten Tips for Dealing with Parental Estrangement


Parental estrangement is emotional and physical distancing between a parent/s and their adult child, resulting in a strained or severed relationship. It can be triggered by various factors such as disagreements, misunderstandings, differing values, or more serious issues like emotional or physical neglect or abuse. The reasons behind parental estrangement are complex, and individuals may choose to distance themselves from a parent for their own wellbeing. The experience is emotionally challenging for both the parent/s and the adult child involved.

The following are tips which offer help for either person of the estrangement:

- **1. Acknowledge Your Feelings:** Accept and validate your emotions. Feelings of loss, anger, and confusion are valid responses to the situation.
- **2. Build A Support Network:** Surround yourself with friends or support groups who can offer understanding and encouragement.
- **3. Establish Healthy Boundaries:** Clearly communicate and enforce boundaries that protect your emotional wellbeing.
- **4. Practice Self-Compassion:** Be kind to yourself and avoid self-blame. Estrangement is a complex situation.
- **5. Focus On Personal Growth:** Use the experience as an opportunity for self-discovery and personal development.
- **6. Journaling:** Write down your thoughts and feelings to gain clarity and process your emotions.
- Engage In Activities You Enjoy: Invest time in hobbies and activities that bring you joy and fulfilment.
- **8. Explore Forgiveness:** Consider forgiveness as a personal process, recognizing that it doesn't necessarily mean reconciliation.
- **9. Give It Time:** Healing from parental estrangement is a gradual process. Be patient with yourself and the situation.
- **10. Seek Professional Help:** Consider therapy to help navigate and express the complex emotions that come with parental estrangement. Therapists can teach effective communication skills to navigate difficult conversations if your child wants to talk. Therapy offers a chance to explore the root causes of the estrangement, helping individuals gain insight into their own contribution to the misunderstanding. Therapists will teach you healthy coping strategies to manage emotions. Finally, therapy can help you understand, create, and enforce healthy boundaries for the repaired relationship moving forward.

Therapy is a personalized journey, and the specific benefits can vary depending on individual circumstances and goals. Remember, there is help and hope.

Dear Constituents.

Parliament has been back in session for a little over a month now and continuing from my work in 2023, I immediately delved back into the ArriveCan study. As Conservative Shadow Minister for Treasury Board, I've been leading the charge to get answers for Canadians as to why the app ended up costing \$54 million dollars. Conservatives will continue fighting for accountability and answers from this Liberal government.

Last month, my office continued our annual tradition of delivering Valentines for Seniors in our community of Calgary Midnapore. Thank you to the staff and students at Don Bosco School in Deer Ridge for the beautiful handmade cards! My staff had a great time delivering them to over 100 residents at the Atria – Canyon Meadows retirement facility.

On April 1, Justin Trudeau will be signing off on two tax increases. The Carbon Tax will shoot up to \$80 per tonne, and with this Canadians can expect to see a rise in the cost of everything from gas and heat to groceries. As if one tax increase isn't bad enough, the Liberal governments escalator tax on beer, wine, and spirits will rise by 4.7% at the start of April as well. Since the escalator tax was introduced in 2017 overall taxes on alcohol have increased by a staggering 19%. Alongside my Conservative colleagues, I've been relentless in calling on this government to axe the carbon tax and bring home lower prices for all Canadians.

Childcare and affordability are crucial for families and the government recognizes this. That is why in 2021 the Alberta government signed the Canada-Alberta Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care Agreement. The government believes that all Albertans deserve an affordable, accessible, high-quality, inclusive childcare sector.

To help both families and businesses, the creation of the Early Learning and Child Care Agreement promises a total of \$3.8 billion being invested over five years to bring childcare fees to an average of \$10 per day. Having affordable childcare is what creates opportunities and keeps money in parents' pockets.

Since January 2022, childcare fees that were paid by parents were reduced by 50% across Alberta. In 2024, it is expected that parents will pay an average of \$15 a day and by 2026 that average will be reduced to \$10 a day. In addition, the Alberta government is excited to announce that it has put over \$900 million back into the pockets of parents who use childcare. That is approximately \$550 per month per child. Furthermore, just in 2024 alone the Child Care Agreement will save families in Alberta \$9,000 per year per child.

Supporting Childcare Staff and Operators - Affordability Grant

In order to support both operators and reduce parental fees for childcare, the Alberta government has replaced revenue operators with the Affordability Grants. What is exciting about these grants is that while the fees paid by parents are decreasing, childcare operators have seen an increase in their total revenue from the government, plus an additional amount in recognition of increased costs. In total, most operators have seen an increase of 9% in total program fees over the past three years. The Alberta government is also offering other funding that will support the staff of childcare facilities. These include wage top ups for early educator staff, of up to \$8.62 per hour, and access to \$4,300 per educator per year for professional development and training. These efforts from the Alberta government have and continue to make a difference in the lives of many Albertans.



Winter Cart Placement Tips

by The City of Calgary



Follow these winter tips to keep your cart collection safe and on schedule:

- Clear snow and ice to put your carts on even ground. Don't place carts behind or on top of snowbanks.
- Leave enough space around your carts to easily walk between and around them.
- Store carts in a sheltered spot and move them out on collection day, so they don't freeze to the ground. Move carts back by 7:00 pm on collection day.
- Clear snow off your carts and keep lids closed. Snow in your blue cart ruins recyclables and makes them difficult to sort at the facility, meaning they can't be turned into new products.
- Prevent food and yard waste from freezing inside your green cart. Use compostable bags or place crumpled newspaper or a pizza box at the bottom of the cart.
