

### No More Staying Overnight to Dump Buckets of Water

Do you know those long nights when you have to wait for a repair company, all the while someone has to guard the bucket and dump it when it fills with water? We, the board members, remember too many times. We finally wired up a circuit and heat tracing to stop ice from building up in the exit pipe that runs between the roof and the storm sewer in the middle of the parking lot. Ice would build up and not allow the roof water through (which runs down through the inside of the building). There was a weak point that is supposed to break when things get backed up, but we were tired of it backing up. No major long-term damage was ever done as it only happened during the weekdays, so we always caught the issue. If this happened over a holiday season it could be quite expensive in terms of repairs.

Thanks to Jay, our volunteer board member, and companies he knows who came quicky with steam trucks, and Kim our favorite overnighter who camped out a few years back until repairs could be made while dumping buckets that are far to heavy to carry. We should be able to use the CFEP grant (see kitchen article) for 50% of the cost and if we are lucky, the CCG grant next year can be back dated, but that is a far stretch. If parts would have been available before November 30, the CCG would have covered the other 50% of the cost. One of our other volunteers did the grant application and wrap up/hand off. If you have not noticed, we really rely on volunteers, and once again – here is a plug to say thanks and to also shamelessly say we need more help. ### **Rink Pole Replacement**

You are safer while skating! We had a rink pole replaced last month and at first, I thought "when are they comi..." – but upon closer observation – the repair people had already been and gone and had replaced the rink pole with one that looks exactly the same as the old one! Last spring, we had all rink light poles tested by "Black's" and they mentioned one in particular should get replaced within the year, which we did.

Newhook Trenching was chosen and did a 100% stellar job - so clean and tidy you almost wouldn't know they came in and did it. The only hint that it was new was it had a slightly different green hue than the last rink pole and some new gravel around the pole. Newhook Trenching are those industrial neighbourhood gophers that make dozens of gopher mounds down the street when things like new fibre or communications, or power wires are dug and strung underground in our neighbourhoods. This pole was paid for 75% by the CCG grant (City) and 25% by the CFEP grant (same one as kitchen repairs). If we are fortunate to receive a Calgary Community Grant (City) the other six poles plus the one stump in the ground can be replaced likely around the June timeframe. The Calgary Community Grant provides us each year with up to \$300,000 and the CFEP of up to \$125,000 for a project (we say "scheduled and suggested centre renovations").

The suggestions as to what gets replaced follows a mandatory lifecycle plan developed by an outside contractor (and paid for by the City). The City is determined to have our community centres be successful and to have longevity, hence the yearly funding if we apply for it. Again, we are looking for volunteers (yes, you) to lessen the load by managing small projects like this one, so if you can help, please contact Rob at the center at 403-278-3117 or fill out the web form and let us know.

### **New Weight Room Equipment**



Have you seen the new weight room? The new equipment is here and in use already, just in time for those January new year's resolutions! We have three new units installed (HOIST Mi6 Functional Trainer, Versa Leg Press Calf Press, Versa MultiPress) and the fourth will come in January (Versa Leg Extension Leg Curl Combo). We partnered with Fitness Express to purchase and maintain these units. These are all separate units so if one goes down, we still have other separate units that will work. They were express chosen to back up against the wall to make better use of space in the small weight room we have. Volunteers worked together to move the equipment in and out while the flooring and new equipment placement were done professionally. This saved a lot of money and allowed us to stay within a budget for new equipment to serve our members and residents. Volunteers carried out the old flooring to the garage (we will likely use the old rubber flooring for the skate party).

Your community centre paid for all the new equipment using proceeds from the gym memberships, another source of revenue for the centre. The board vote was close, but the majority of the votes went to ensuring we had the best equipment vs. the best-plus equipment (like voting between Toyota and Lexus – the best vs. the best-plus). Many thanks to Rob and Ken for putting up with the board as they asked a million and one questions - which were all answered before the final decision was made. Thanks to the other volunteers for the emergency labour to ensure the amount spent was within the threshold agreed upon by the board. The main factor driving the decision was to buy the best and stave off future repair costs as the equipment is used over the coming years.

Friends, Happy New Year!

2024 is starting off with some exciting news for clean energy. The recently announced Dow's \$9 billion Path2Zero project in Fort Saskatchewan marks Alberta's largest private sector investment in 15 years. This initiative, a global first, establishes a net zero Scope 1 and 2 greenhouse gas emissions integrated ethylene cracker and derivatives site. The project enhances Alberta's ethylene and polyethylene capacity, boosting export potential and reinforcing the province's leadership in emissions reduction and clean technology. It will also create around 6,000 jobs during peak construction, and around 400 to 500 permanent jobs – meaning more families can count on good jobs.

Alberta has surpassed its methane emissions reduction target ahead of schedule, achieving a 45% reduction from 2014 to 2022 through collaborative industry efforts, early action programs, regulatory requirements, and improved leak detection. The government's commitment to success is evident through initiatives like the Alberta Petrochemicals Incentive Program and the Technology Innovation and Emissions Reduction Regulation.

Finally, I have heard a lot of concerns regarding how the government is capturing feedback for the potential of an Alberta Pension Plan (APP). A workbook with sections covering various APP-related topics is available for public input until February 28, 2024. Details can be found on the Engagement Alberta Pension Plan website at www.albertapensionplan.ca/engagement.

## BEST PICTURE

Oscar season is an exhilarating time of year. With so many categories and nominees, it can be hard to keep track of what's going on! One thing of note is that only three animated films have ever been



nominated for Best Picture. Up, Toy Story 3, and Beauty and the Beast in 1991 which was the first ever animated Best Picture nomination.
