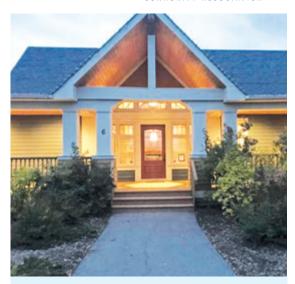

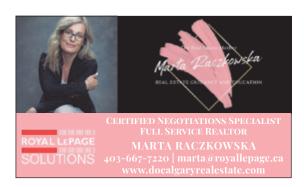

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Hoisin Pork with Pineapple Rice

Deliciously yellow fruit, a pineapple is neither a pine nor an apple but is a group of berries fused together.

Pineapples are indigenous to South America and are believed to have originated in the forests of Brazil and harvested by tribes who lived in the area. Christopher Columbus is credited with introducing the pineapple to Europe and "Pina Des Indes" or "Pinecone of the Indes" were the names used to describe the fruit by the Spanish.

The pineapple plant has a life span of up to fifty years, can take up to three years to grow and mature, and only one pineapple is produced by a plant in a season.

Pineapple goes well with ham, seafood, chicken, tofu, yoghurt, and cottage cheese.

The combination of hoisin pork and pineapple rice fuses together delicious flavours and can be prepped and cooked in a relatively short amount of time. The filet or tenderloin used in this recipe is one of the healthier cuts of meat and is just as lean as skinless chicken breasts.

Prep Time: 15 Minutes

Cook Time: 30 Minutes

Servings: 2 to 3

Ingredients:

- 1 pork tenderloin
- 2 tbsps. hoisin sauce
- 2 tbsps. soya sauce
- 1 tbsp. grainy Dijon mustard
- 2 tsps. honey
- 1 1/2 tsps. rice vinegar
- 2 tbsps. vegetable oil
- 4 cups cooked white or jasmine rice
- 2 tbsps. butter
- ½ tsp. red chilli flakes
- 2 tbsps. chopped coriander leaves
- 1 can (398 ml) pineapple tidbits, drained
- 1/2 tsp. salt



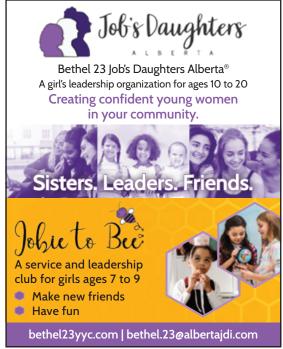


Directions:

- In a small bowl, mix together hoisin sauce, soya sauce, honey, Dijon mustard, and half a teaspoon of rice vinegar. Spread the marinade all over the tenderloin and let it sit for ten minutes.
- Preheat oven to 400 degrees Fahrenheit.
- Add two tablespoons of oil to a large skillet and place the tenderloin in it. On medium heat, brown the tenderloin on all sides, approximately three to four minutes. Remove tenderloin from skillet and place on a foil-lined baking tray. Pour any remaining marinade over it and then place it on the middle rack of the oven. Bake uncovered for 20 minutes or until cooked through.
- On medium heat, melt butter in a wok or skillet, add drained pineapple pieces, chilli flakes, chopped coriander, one teaspoon of rice vinegar, and salt. Stir fry for a couple of minutes and then add the cooked rice and gently blend all the ingredients together. Remove from heat and garnish with coriander leaves and a few pineapple pieces.
- Remove tenderloin from oven, cover and let stand for five minutes. Serve sliced tenderloin with small bowls of Pineapple Rice and use Hoisin sauce as a dip if desired.

Wellness Exchange – Free Online Workshops for You!

Alberta Health Services continues to provide free virtual wellness workshops available to all Albertans.

Wellness Exchange is a series of skill-building workshops designed to help increase a person's ability to cope with change, build resilience, and improve their overall wellbeing. Topics include problem-solving, positive activities, managing reactions, helpful thinking, and healthy connections.

"Wellness Exchange" is a free online class with five topics related to wellness – one topic per week.

Where: Online (via smartphone, tablet, or computer) **When:** Thursdays, 1:30 to 3:00 pm from April 13 to May 11, 2023

Who: Adults interested in learning skills to cope with change and deal with stress

Registration: Register for any or all topics of interest

Week 1: Problem-Solving

It's important to clearly define our problems and look at all possible solutions. Learning ways to problem solve effectively helps us address the entire situation, influence what we can, and increase our confidence in the decisions that we make.

Week 2: Positive Activities

Positive activities provide us with opportunities for enjoyment, improve our mood, increase our sense of control over our life, and create hope.

Week 3: Managing Reactions

Physical and emotional reactions happen as life stressors occur. Having confidence that we are able to effectively manage our emotions is important, as it helps protect our wellbeing, maintain our healthy connections, make effective decisions, and respond in healthy ways.

Week 4: Helpful Thinking

Our thoughts have an impact on how we see the world, how we feel, and how we behave. Shifting our unhelpful thinking to more helpful thinking is important to help increase our confidence in coping with stressors, improve our mood, and reduce the intensity of our reactions.

Week 5: Healthy Connections

Social support and connecting with others helps us feel a sense of belonging and reduces isolation. Building healthy social connections helps increase our confidence and our overall well-being.

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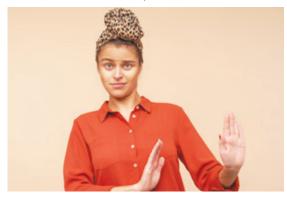
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27 Ways to Say No

- Gee, I wish I could, but I just can't right now.
- I'm sorry but I can't help you at this time.
- I'm just too occupied at this time, so I can't.
- Unfortunately, it's not a good time.
- Circle back to me in few weeks.
- I can't make it this month, week, day, year.
- Perhaps another time.
- I am not available for this.
- Sorry, this is something I can't do right now.
- I really appreciate you asking me, but I can't commit to that right now.
- Sorry, I can't make it, maybe another time.
- I'm afraid I don't have any open time for that/this.
- I can't as I have some other pressing commitments.
- I've filled my schedule.

- I'm really swamped right now.
- I'm so overwhelmed these days that I can't take on any more

*Remember that you do not have to provide any explanations for saying no.

People pleasers are constantly getting manipulated. You are not responsible for other people's emotions. Every time you say yes to something or someone, you are unwittingly saying no to someone or something else at the same time (usually your own needs). In trying to please everyone, you end up disappointing almost everyone, especially yourself.

People will actually learn to respect you more if you stay true to your values. It's empowering to say yes when you truly want to. You are of value; you have the right to say no.

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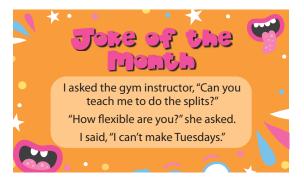
