New Brighton Tool Shed – Spring is Coming

Worried about how you will clean your lawn and how will you give it good start in the spring? The Tool Shed is here to help. We hope this spring you will take full advantage of the tools available in the community Tool Shed. We are listening to you, and we are trying to expand the tool inventory based on demand.

Check our “Tool Shed” page on ournewbrighton.ca and click on the inventory link to see the wide array of tools you can use free of charge. Imagine that your lawnmower breaks down and you want to take your time to find a good deal for your next purchase. The Tool Shed can give you peace of mind until you find the best deal - just borrow the lawnmower from the Tool Shed anytime you want to cut your grass.

For residents who are not familiar with the Tool Shed project in our community – the Tool Shed is an inventory of tools that you can borrow, free of charge, from the Community Center. If there is a particular tool that you only need once per year, and you don't want to buy and store it, then the Tool Shed is the solution for you. A few premium tools require you to purchase the New Brighton Community Association membership (\$20); this way we can put more money towards new tools and replacement of the broken ones.

New Trees in Our Community

You've asked, we've asked, and the City listened. Last year there were a lot of conversations about dead trees and about new trees in our community. Now we have an answer from the City, and it looks good for the future of our community.

The Urban Forestry Team will be planting approximately 180 trees in our community in 2026. Staff are currently plotting locations to ensure suitability and will be reaching out to homeowners who may have a tree planted in front of their property on public land. Homes that are suitable for tree planting will receive a document with all the information.

Safety in Our Community

Overnight Lights and 9:00 pm Routine

Unfortunately, crime is on the rise in our community. Most of the crimes are labelled by CPS as crimes of opportunity because some simple safety habits can deter prowling in our community.

The 9:00 pm routine– take a tour around your property, check if you locked the cars in the driveway, check all doors and windows, and don't make life easy for the bad guys. Let's all stay safe and protect each other.

The overnight lights in front of your house are essential in making thieves feel uneasy and move on. With LED lightbulbs, it is not a big expense to have them on overnight. Streets that are pitch black at night are associated with frequent robberies. Just set your lights on a timer and keep the house brighter. It is a small investment that can have a big impact on the overall safety of your house and your neighbourhood.

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Community Cleanup Day

If you're cleaning around and want a convenient way to dispose of your different types of garbage and recyclables, you should put June 7 in your calendar! This is the Community Cleanup Day that we set together with our friends from Shepard.

The location will be the parking lot at the Sheppard Community Hall, and closer to the event we will provide extra info about the type of things you can bring – in the previous years we had general garbage, electronics, furniture, and a company for shredding documents. We will see what we have this year.

Annual NBRA Fees

Residents of New Brighton are reminded that the Annual New Brighton Residents Association Fees are due as of April 1, 2026. Packages including the annual renewal notice will be delivered via email (if we have your email address on file) or directly by mail to all New Brighton homes in early March. Payments can be made in person at the New Brighton Clubhouse, by cheque, by e-transfer, online (\$5 convenience charges will apply), or over the phone commencing March 1, 2026. Residents are also reminded that all delinquent accounts paid after April 30, 2026, are subject to interest charges of prime plus five percent per annum and other charges related to the collection of these fees. If you have not received your package by March 15, 2026, or you have any further questions regarding annual fee payment, please contact the NBRA office at 403-781-6613, ext. 1. July 1, 2026

Outstanding accounts will be sent to Walsh LLP for collections, incurring additional legal fees. The NBRA no longer accepts fee payments directly.

If you are unable to meet the timelines, please contact the Customer Service Leader by emailing rentals@nbra.ca to make special arrangements prior to April 15, 2026. A payment plan for your 2026/27 NBRA Annual Fees will be tailored to work within your specific circumstances. Those residents who require payment plans, will not incur additional late payment charges or be denied access, so long as the agreement is fulfilled.
