Signs You May Have Depression


For many people with depression, symptoms are usually severe enough to cause noticeable problems in day-to-day activities, such as work, school, social activities, or relationships with others. Some people may feel generally miserable or unhappy without really knowing why.

Although depression may occur only once during your life, people typically have multiple episodes. During these episodes, symptoms occur most of the day, nearly every day, and may include:

- Feelings of sadness, tearfulness, emptiness, o hopelessness
- Angry outbursts, irritability or frustration, even over small matters
- Loss of interest or pleasure in most or all normal activities, such as sex, hobbies, or sports
- Sleep disturbances, including insomnia or sleeping too much
- Tiredness and lack of energy, so even small tasks take extra effort
- Reduced appetite and weight loss or increased cravings for food and weight gain
- · Anxiety, agitation, or restlessness
- Slowed thinking, speaking, or body movements
- Feelings of worthlessness or guilt, fixating on past failures or self-blame
- Trouble thinking, concentrating, making decisions, and remembering things
- Frequent or recurrent thoughts of death, suicidal thoughts, suicide attempts, or suicide
- Unexplained physical problems, such as back pain or headaches

Some differences in symptoms you may see in teens and children:

- In younger children, symptoms of depression may include sadness, irritability, clinginess, worry, aches and pains, refusing to go to school, or being underweight.
- In teens, symptoms may include sadness, irritability, feeling negative and worthless, anger, poor performance or poor attendance at school, feeling misunderstood and extremely sensitive, using recreational drugs or alcohol, eating or sleeping too much, self-harm, loss of interest in normal activities, and avoidance of social interaction.



Differences in symptoms seen in older adults:

Depression is not a normal part of growing older, and it should never be taken lightly. Unfortunately, depression often goes undiagnosed and untreated in older adults, and they may feel reluctant to seek help. Symptoms of depression may be different or less obvious in older adults, such as:

- · Memory difficulties or personality changes
- Physical aches or pain
- Fatigue, loss of appetite, sleep problems or loss of interest in sex — not caused by a medical condition or medication
- Often wanting to stay at home, rather than going out to socialize or doing new things
- Suicidal thinking or feelings, especially in older men

For some, depression is caused by a neurochemical deficit. While for others, depression is brought on by an event such as a breakup, death, job loss, postpartum, or a major stressful life event. Those with a neurochemical imbalance may need to seek life-time pharmacological treatment and therapy. Others, with less severe symptoms may recover quite well with just therapy alone. Some may need a combination of both for short term (four to six months). Never stop an antidepressant cold turkey as you can have life threatening side effects. Always speak with your doctor first and follow their protocol.

No matter what age group you or a loved one may fall under, it is important to seek help if your symptoms last for more than two to three weeks.

I want to take this opportunity to thank the constituents of Calgary Fish Creek who attended my Meet Your MLA Family BBQ on Saturday, September 16, at the Bonavista Downs community centre. Albertans deserve to be able to access health care services when and where they need it. So, it only makes sense that improving health care is one of the biggest priorities for the government. The Health Care Action Plan will look to recruit thousands of new doctors, nurses and health care aides, reduce wait times, and upgrade hospitals and urgent care centres.

It isn't a fix that can happen overnight, but I believe the government is taking concrete steps to address the issues. The Health Care Action Plan includes improving lab testing and reducing wait times for lab services, working with postsecondary institutions to increase seats in health-related fields, and ensuring Alberta's hospital facilities are upgraded to meet the needs of the communities they serve.

When Albertans access the emergency department it is often during a difficult and stressful time in their lives. Knowing they have access to the care they need in a modern, highquality facility is invaluable. That's why in Calgary, starting Aug. 29, Albertans in need of emergency care will be able to experience a new and improved Peter Lougheed Centre.

When the hospital originally opened in 1988, the emergency department was designed to accommodate 30,000 to 40,000 patient visits each year. Last year the Peter Lougheed Centre emergency department saw nearly 73,000 patients. When fully finished in 2025, the new emergency department will provide 25 additional care spaces. This redevelopment will ultimately double its size helping to decrease emergency room wait times.

Alberta has the best frontline health care workers in the world, and it's important to me that the government is committed to continually modernizing our health care facilities to make sure doctors, nurses and health care aides can do their jobs and ensure health care facilities continue to meet the needs of Albertans and their families.

Yoki's Orange Roasted Squash Soup with Apple & Brie

Ingredients

- 1 1/2 large butternut squash
- 3-4 carrots
- 1 medium onion
- 1 tbsp. finely chopped red chili pepper
- 1 leek (white portion only)
- 1 tbsp. (30ml) butter
- 6-10 fl oz. (2L chicken broth, reduced salt)
- Juice of 1/2 orange and rind
- 2-3 apples, peeled & chopped (Granny Smith)
- 2-3 bay leaves
- 1 tsp. (5ml) sugar
- Ground pepper to taste
- Ground chili pepper to taste
- Ground cayenne to taste
- 8 oz. (250g) Brie cheese
- Snipped chives
- Sour cream
- Sauteed red & green peppers

Serves 8-10

Instructions

- Cut squash in half lengthwise & remove seeds. Place cut side down on pan & bake at 350°F (180°C) until tender, about 45 minutes.
- Chop carrots, onion, & leek into 1" pieces & place in large pot. Gently sautee in butter. Do not brown. Scrape flesh from cooked squash & add to vegetables. Season with salt, pepper, chili pepper, & cayenne pepper to taste. Add stock & bring to boil.
- Squeeze orange juice into mixture & add both halves of orange into mixture. Add apple, bay leaves, & sugar to stock mixture. Simmer uncovered for 40-60 minutes.
- 4. Squeeze orange again. Remove orange & bay leaves. Puree soup in batches.
- 5. Cut Brie into 1/2" pieces and place cheese in bottom of soup bowls & fill with hot soup.
- Garnish with a dollop of sour cream & add chives or parsley & a little bit of sauteed green & red pepper on top for flavour & colour.
