

### **Traffic and Crime Survey Results**

Back in April, we kicked off the "Traffic and Crime Survey." The intention of the survey was to give RCA a better understanding of the traffic and safety concerns of our community to develop appropriate action plans.

The survey was open from April 4 to June 19, 2022. We received over 100 responses! Thank you to all the residents who participated and provided great feedback! Here are the guestions and results of the survey:

# In your opinion, what are the traffic problems in our community? Provide location/address. Results:

- Speeding 18 and 21 Streets, school zones, 18 Street and Riverbend Gate/Riverglen Drive
- No left turn at key intersections
- Inconsistent speed zones
- Too much traffic on 18 Street
- Pedestrian crossing ramp Glenmore Trail (Eastbound) and 18 Street

# Have you previously reported traffic concerns to the Calgary Police Traffic Service Requests (via calgary.ca)? Results:

- No 88%
- Yes 11%
- No response 1%

# In your opinion, what is the main source of crime in our community?

#### **Results:**

- Car break-ins, prowling, petty theft, vandalism
- Drug use, people using Carburn Park
- · No police presence


Have you previously reported crimes in our community through Calgary Police Online Portal (Report a Crime via calgary.ca) or called the non-emergency line at 403-266-1234?

- Yes 43%

### **Sledding Safety**

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) would like to remind parents and children about a few toboggan/sledding safety tips as the winter season continues. Injuries may result from collisions with stationary objects on the hill, such as trees, poles, rocks, or even collisions with other people. Unprotected falls can also result in more serious injury if you lose control at high speeds. However, everyone can be safe and have fun on the toboggan hill by following these reminders.

#### **Equipment**

- Always ensure your toboggan, or sledding device, is in good repair. Inspect it for any damaged or missing parts before each use.
- Be certain the operator is fully capable of staying in control of the sled at all times.
- Wear a ski helmet, designed for use in cold weather and high speeds.

#### Hazards

- Avoid hills that are too steep or too icy.
- Choose hills free of all obstacles such as trees, rocks, utility poles, benches, or fences.
- Beware of loose scarves, or clothing containing drawstrings, which could present a strangulation hazard if they become caught or snagged.
- Look out for others. Move quickly to the side after finishing a run and stay to the side of the sliding path when walking up the hill.
- Children should be supervised by an adult; never toboggan alone.
- Tobogganing at night is not advised.

#### Plan Ahead

- Dress warmly in layers and anticipate weather changes.
- Consider bringing extra sets of gloves and toques to exchange wet garments for dry ones.
- Take breaks out of the cold to warm up.
- Attempt to cover any exposed skin.
- Even when properly protected from the elements, the fingertips, toes, ears, the tip of the nose, and other high points on the face, such as the forehead and cheek bones can be affected by frostbite.
- If frost bite has occurred, treat it by first removing the individual out of the cold environment. Gently warm the affected skin by placing a warm hand over it, or by placing the affected part in warm - not hot - water, until re-warmed.

### **Winter Cart Placement Tips**

from the City of Calgary

Follow these winter tips to keep your cart collection safe and on schedule:

- Clear snow and ice to put your carts on even ground. Don't place carts behind or on top of snowbanks.
- Leave enough space around your carts to easily walk between and around them.
- Store carts in a sheltered spot and move them out on collection day so they don't freeze to the ground. Move carts back by 7:00 pm on collection day.
- Clear snow off your carts and keep lids closed. Snow in your blue cart ruins quality recyclables and makes them difficult to sort at the facility, meaning they can't be turned into new products.
- Prevent food and yard waste from freezing inside your green cart. Use compostable bags or place crumpled newspaper or a pizza box at the bottom of the cart.

Dear Constituents,

Affordability is a challenge faced by many Albertans right now. That is why we are delivering timely and meaningful support. The measures announced so far include, but are not limited to, extending the fuel tax cut, taking action on utilities, including expanding the electricity rebate to a total of up to \$500, reindexing benefits like AISH, PDD, and Income Support, as well as the Alberta Seniors Benefit and the Alberta Child and Family Benefit, providing targeted payments for kids under 18, seniors 65 and over, and vulnerable Albertans with household incomes below \$180,000, and providing additional support for low-income transit programs. Our government is in a position to provide this suite of financial help because of our balanced budget and strong fiscal position.

The Deerfoot Trail expansion project, which is expected to begin in 2023, will ease congestion on Alberta's busiest highway. It will include improving Bow Bottom Trail and Anderson Road, Southland Drive and Glenmore Trail interchanges, building seven new bridge structures at Anderson Road and Bow Bottom Trail, Bow River, Southland Drive, and Glenmore Trail, and adding more lanes to Deerfoot Trail along the highway and through the Anderson Road/Bow Bottom Trail and Glenmore Trail interchanges.

Patients receiving cancer care in Calgary are another step closer to receiving that care in a world-class medical centre. The new Calgary Cancer Centre will increase care capacity by consolidating and expanding existing services to support integrated and comprehensive cancer care. The hospital will serve as a hub for medical education and research activities, providing jobs and educational opportunities for Albertans. AHS is preparing the hospital for clinical services, including installing equipment and furniture, and training staff. Once operational, the 186,000 square metre facility will have 160 inpatient beds, 100 patient exam rooms, and will provide a wide range of health care services for patients.


