Bicycle Helmet Safety

from Alberta Health Services

Head injuries are the leading cause of serious injury and death to kids on wheels*. Most injuries occur when a cyclist suffers a fall, strikes a stationary object, or collides with another cyclist/pedestrian. Remember – it's the law in Alberta that cyclists under the age of 18 must wear a helmet (and highly recommended for all ages). Helmets should be CSA approved and worn during recreational activities such as skateboarding, in-line skating, and cycling.

Getting informed

- Wearing a helmet while cycling can prevent a serious injury, or even save a life
- Brain injuries can cause permanent disability or death
- Reduce your risk by always wearing your helmet
- Replace any helmet that has been involved in a crash, even if it appears undamaged

Getting started

- Allow children to assist when buying their helmet Cyclists who choose their own helmet are more likely to wear them
- Start the habit early. Young children learning to ride tricycles need to wear helmets
- Parents must lead by example always wear a helmet when cycling

Getting the right fit

- Take the time to properly fit and adjust your helmet to ensure maximum protection in case of a crash
- When worn properly, helmets should fit level, not tilted up, or down over the forehead
- Helmets should feel snug, but not too tight. To test the fit, the helmet should not fall off when you shake your head from side-to-side while the straps are unfastened
- Adjust the chin straps to form a "Y" below and slightly forward from the ears
- Only one finger should be able to fit under the chin strap when it is fastened
- Do not forget to use the sizing pads included with the helmet. They will help improve the overall fit, comfort, and safety.




DRCA Wildlife and Human Cohabitation Committee Update

We, as a community, share a responsibility to protect ourselves, our neighbours, as well as local wildlife. Tragically, a family of four bears were euthanized after becoming used to feeding on food in neighbourhood garbage and compost bins. Additionally, a bear family was relocated earlier in the fall for the same reason.

Real world experience points to garbage (including compost) as the most significant contributor to human-bear conflicts and supports a strategy of reducing bear access to garbage. In fact, it has been documented that putting garbage and compost out only on the morning of pick up cuts the chances of a bear visit from 70% to 2%! Garbage and compost should be stored securely until it is disposed of.

Please do your part to ensure your bins are not outside. We suggest using the final winter months to organize your garage to make space for your black, blue, and green bins. We urge everyone to put bins out after 5:00 am on the morning of pick up from April 1 to October 31, when bears are the most active. These bins are a potential safety risk to all when they are out as they encourage local wildlife to scour them for food. If we limit the amount of time that the bins are outside, it will be much better for our local wildlife and therefore our community.

Don't like the smell from bins? Consider one of the many companies in Calgary that offer bin cleaning services. Thank you!

It's April, and the best part of this month is celebrating our volunteers (plans are underway)! April 16 to 22 is National Volunteer Week. In Discovery Ridge, we have the most amazing and dedicated volunteers who support our community and make it such a wonderful place to live. Here are some of the ways our volunteers support us:

- **Bottle Shack:** Bottles and cans are dropped off, sorted, and organized in the shack. Once the shack is full, volunteers come in and help with the unload. This involves transferring bags and boxes of bottles onto a depot truck that takes them for recycling. Revenue from donated bottles helps to pay for the operation and maintenance of our recreation facility.
- Rink Crew: This hard-working group comes out to maintain our ice rink for both hockey and recreational skating.
- Wildlife and Human Cohabitation Committee: This newly formed committee is addressing the issues with wildlife, particularly bears in our community, and our need for safe cohabitation.
- Stampede Round Up: A fun, family-oriented event with games and activities with a Stampede feel.
 Volunteers help to keep the afternoon running smoothly.
- Music in the Park: A great event filling our park with neighbours enjoying an afternoon of music! Many hands are needed for this to be a success. Volunteers help with event set-up, ticket sales, in/out flow of guests, and more.
- Casino Fundraiser: About every 18 months, Discovery Ridge CA is offered a casino fundraiser date(s). Funds from the fundraiser support our operations. Volunteers take on roles such as banker, cashier, chip runner, and count room staff.
- DRCA Board Members: Our board members are volunteers! They generously give their talents and time.

Homeowners' Association (NDHA) News

Spring is finally upon us! While all of us wait for the ground to thaw and trees to bud, the NDHA will be working behind the scenes with our ULS team, preparing for the start of another busy growing season. As weather dictates, the main priority will shift away from pathway snow clearing and toward spring clean up of the greenspaces, medians, and boulevards.

Bristles: When snow accumulation is not substantial enough to require a blade, sweeping is the best way to clear down to the pavement. An unavoidable consequence of using the brush apparatus to carry out this task is that some bristles are shed. The NDHA requires ULS to clean up visible bristles on a regular basis throughout the winter. As the snow melts, more of these rogue bristles will be revealed. Please know that we are "on it," and that ULS will do a thorough deep clean of the bristle litter during their spring cleanup measures.



Street Sweeping: The City of Calgary typically launches street sweeping in mid-April. At the time of this writing, the community sweeping schedule is not yet available. Please access the City of Calgary website for schedule updates or to sign up for their "Street Sweeping Service Alert," which will notify you via email or text. Please note the following:

 During the program, daytime crews will sweep in neighborhoods Monday to Friday from 8:00 am to 4:00 pm.

- Major roads are swept overnight to reduce traffic impact.
- Watch for signs in the community indicating when your street is scheduled for a cleanup.
- Parking bans are in place when signs are present.
 Vehicles are subject to be ticketed and towed. Remove vehicles and cart bins from the road on the posted dates and times.

The NDHA will work with ULS to ensure they have completed all median and boulevard cleanups prior to the City of Calgary carrying out street sweeping operations in our neighbourhood.


Yard Cleanup and Garbage Bins: Once the snow is gone and we truly break into spring, many of our residents begin the hard work of cleaning up their own yards in preparation for the growing season. It is always surprising how much garbage and other debris can be collected after a long winter! The NDHA would like to ask that residents use their own green/blue/black bins to dispose of waste from their household and property. We have had instances in the past where community park garbage bins were inappropriately used for the disposal of large cardboard, Styrofoam, plastics, etc. This is considered "illegal dumping" and offenders can be fined. The City empties community bins only a few times a month; please use them as intended so that all of us can benefit from the convenience. If you find a full or overflowing bin, call 311 to have it emptied.

Dog Waste Bag Dispensers: The NDHA installed and continues to maintain several of these stations throughout the community. This initiative was undertaken to help dog owners ensure dog waste is never left behind. Unfortunately, some people have been observed taking out reams of bags at a time, rather than only one or two. This behavior is inappropriate and causes unnecessary expense. The dispensers are not intended to be used as a personal bag supply for pet owners; they are there for occasional need and should only be accessed when unexpected situations arise. We ask that you purchase your own bags at a store and bring them along on the dog walk. Please contact the NDHA to have a pet waste bag dispenser refilled if you see it empty, and also indicate the station location.

Bored? Think Twice Before Taking That Facebook Quiz

Social media is used as a fun distraction for some people, and taking a Facebook quiz may seem like a harmless way to pass the time. But are you giving away more information than you think?

How the scam works

A fun quiz pops up on your Facebook feed or another social media platform. A few questions are answered to prove how well you know a friend. Or a short personality test is offered to match you with a character from a favourite TV show.

These quizzes appear to be meaningless, but the intent behind them is to collect information. For example, questions like: "What was the first car you owned?", "What is your mother's maiden name?", or "What is the name of the street you grew up on?" These are common security questions for insurance, banking, and credit card accounts. Sharing this information can lead to accounts being hacked, and personal and financial information being stolen.

Not all social media quizzes are data collection scams; however, BBB cautions users to be careful about what they share online and to check the privacy settings on the account. Social media data and quiz answers can be used to steal identity or enable a scammer to impersonate you to your friends and family.

Tips to avoid social media scams

- **Be skeptical:** Before answering a quiz, figure out who created it. Is it a brand you trust? Just because something appears to be fun and innocent, doesn't mean there isn't an inherent risk.
- Adjust privacy settings: Review the social media account's privacy settings and be strict about any information that is shared - and be mindful of who you are sharing it with.
- Remove personal details from your profile: Don't share information like your phone number or home address on social media accounts.
- Don't give answers to common security questions: Be cautious if the questions in a quiz ask for things like your mother's maiden name, street you grew up on, previously owned vehicles, favourite foods, or the name of your high school.
- Monitor friend requests: Don't accept friend requests from people you don't know. Also be wary of a second friend request from someone you are already connected with; the second profile may be an imposter trying to access your data and your friends list.


