## LETTER FROM THE BOARD

As we move through May, many of us are becoming increasingly concerned about speeding and road safety—especially given the rise in pedestrian related incidents across Calgary this year. This month's Alberta Traffic Safety Calendar highlights speed as a key focus, and recent enforcement activity shows why. Over one weekend alone, Calgary Police Service officers stopped multiple drivers for excessive and dangerous speeds, including vehicles travelling 168 km/h in a 100 km/h zone and 123 km/h in a 70 km/h zone, resulting in mandatory court summonses. These incidents are alarming and reinforce the importance of slowing down so that situations like this do not occur in our own neighbourhood.

Closer to home, the impacts of speeding are most concerning during busy mornings when children are walking to school bus stops and crossing roadways. In addition, recent speedlimit changes within our neighbourhood have reduced limits to 40 km/h, reflecting a citywide effort to improve safety in residential areas. It is important that all drivers adjust to and follow these new limits, as even small reductions in speed can significantly lower the risk and severity of injuries. With only one main road in and out of our community, congestion can be frustrating, but patience and caution are essential. Drivers are reminded to slow down as they approach crosswalks and be prepared to stop, while pedestrians are encouraged to use designated crosswalks and take time to cross safely and visibly.

The DRCA continues to work in partnership with the City of Calgary and the Calgary Police Service to explore traffic-calming initiatives and other safety measures

within the community. These efforts are supported by resident feedback and help identify where further improvements may be needed. Residents are encouraged to remain mindful during peak morning and afternoon periods and to report traffic related concerns, such as excessive speed or unsafe driving behaviour, through the CPS non-emergency line or by contacting 3-1-1. By following posted speed limits, staying alert, and sharing responsibility for road safety, we can help keep our neighbourhood safe for everyone.

After a very successful year serving our community in 2025, our favourite Shirley's Greenhouses farm stand will once again launch in late May. ### Planning

The DRCA continues to advocate for pathway access related to Clearwater Park and pathways, with the demolition of the old Highway 8 bridge and the absence of a pedestrian pathway. Discussions are ongoing to explore restoration and improvements for the Elbow Valley wetlands following the wetlands' removal during ring road construction. In addition, potential pathway connections to the Taza communities from 69 Street SW remain under consideration in future development plans, which could improve walking and cycling access to the east.

## NDHA Annual General Meeting 2026

The Board of Directors will hold the in-person Annual General Meeting (AGM) on Tuesday, June 2 at Ambrose University (150 Ambrose Circle SW). This is a new venue for us and parking can be found behind the main building. NDHA members will be notified of the AGM details by email or Canada Post, and there will also be signage placed at the entrance to the community. At the AGM NDHA Directors will provide updates on NDHA-related matters, share what we see for the coming year, and all participants will elect the new Board of Directors for the coming year. ## Symbolic Tree Program

## Spring Cleanup

In May there is a lot going on to prepare for the growing season. The City will be sweeping streets beginning in mid-April. At the time of writing, the schedule was not available, but last year Discovery Ridge streets were swept in the first week of May. Now is also a good time to check your downspouts and any drainage features you may have in or adjacent to your yard. These need to be clear of any obstructions to function as intended. ULS will be working hard on the turf and planting beds as well as cleaning up the pathways from winter snow clearing. As you tidy up your yard for spring, the NDHA would like to remind you to dispose of your trash in your own garbage, recycling, and composting bins. Using community trash bins for your waste is considered illegal dumping and can result in a fine.

## Discovery Ridge Dam Safety Project

The NDHA Directors are following this project closely. We do not manage the area of the dam itself, but we do maintain surrounding areas, and we want to understand how changes will impact the NDHA's work. We are also Discovery Ridge residents and are very interested in how this initiative will impact our community. We were very disappointed to hear the City's final decision that the dam will be removed (communicated at the 29 January Technical Information Session). Moving forward, we have been told by City staff that they are close to having a conceptual design for the future state of the land. An open house is being planned by City staff for May to share the City's designs and get input. ### Modernizing Canada's Coast: Bill C-264

On March 11, I introduced a private member's bill (Bill C-264), *The Oil Tanker Moratorium Repeal Act*, to repeal the current loading ban (Bill C-48) on British Columbia's northern coast. As the federal government moves toward establishing a new oil pipeline to the West Coast, it is essential that the necessary infrastructure exists to actually export Canadian energy to emerging markets in India, Japan, and throughout Asia.

### A Proven Safety Record

The proposal to lift the moratorium is rooted in decades of safe maritime transport. For nearly a century, tanker traffic has navigated the West Coast without a major spill of Canadian crude. Currently, the Port of Vancouver handles roughly 400 tankers annually, while over 200 Alaskan shipments transit BC waters every year. These figures demonstrate that our safety standards are world-class, comparable to the hundreds of tankers that safely navigate the St. Lawrence River and Atlantic Canada daily.

### Reducing Risk Through Infrastructure

Modernizing our port access actually improves maritime safety. By utilizing deep-water ports in Prince Rupert or Kitimat, we can:

- **Ease Congestion:** Reduce pressure on the heavily trafficked Port of Vancouver and its aging infrastructure.
- **Direct Access:** Allow ships to sail via the Dixon Entrance directly into the open ocean, avoiding the complex coastal navigation sometimes associated with the Hecate Strait.
- **Modern Technology:** Leverage double-hulled vessels, GPS navigation, and mandatory escort tugs to maintain environmental integrity.

Standardizing our regulations supports world-leading environmental safety while fostering economic reconciliation with Indigenous communities through projects like the Eagle Spirit Energy initiative. It is time to clear the legislative roadblocks and realize Canada's potential as a reliable global energy provider.

- Cleaners
- Automotive fluids and chemicals

Placing these items in your carts can increase the chance of fires, toxic fumes, and serious harm in our homes and our community. Taking HHW to a proper drop-off site helps keep everyone safe while protecting the environment.

Before throwing something away, take a moment to check if it's hazardous—and bring it to an HHW drop-off site instead.
