The Yellow Warbler: A Little Winged Lemon in the Trees

The first warbler we can anticipate arriving in Weaslehead is the Yellow Warbler. ETA: mid-May. This tiny bird is a lemon yellow colour from head to rump, with a little black bead of an eye. It has no markings, other than a few cinnamon streaks on the chest of the male. It hangs around the tops of the trees lining the bike path singing its song. The common mnemonic for its song is "sweet, sweet, I'm so sweet". Truer cheeps were never cheeped, little bird, you are so sweet.

The Yellow Warbler makes little cup nests that are often stolen by the famously parasitic cowbird. When this happens, the warbler will build a new nest on top of the old one, sometimes resulting in layers of nests. I don't think there are many cowbirds in Weaslehead, thankfully for the Yellow Warbler.

These birds are designated as "conspicuous" so if you are a new birder you have no excuse, get out there and find one! It should be easy; they are so bright they are practically lit from within.

After I wrote my article on Downy vs. Hairy Woodpeckers, I saw a great article about them on the Cornell Ornithology website. The best way to tell them apart is to look at the relative size of their beak compared to their head. This way you don't have to create an imaginary bird beside them! All the information is right in front of you.

Neighbour Day Garden Tour and Rhubarb Tea




Glenbrook Social Committee

How to BEE a Community Scientist Help us document the different pollinators in Calgary!





Look around your favourite park or backyard for any insects visiting a flower.




Upload your photos to iNaturalist. **Tip:** Create a separate observation for the insect and plant.



Take a least 2 clear photos of an insect, preferably from multiple angles.



Take at least 1-2 photos of the plant where you can see (1) the flower, and (2) the leaves/whole plant.



Add your insect observations to the Calgary Pollinators Project. Tip: Link your insect and plant observations together.

Alberta is home to hundreds of different pollinators - more than 330 kinds of bees, as well as flies, beetles, wasps, and other insects that are critical to our local food supply. We want to get to know the pollinators that call Calgary home and what plants best support them, and you can help! **Community science** involves the collaboration between scientists and the general public to collect and analyze data. The data you uploaded to iNaturalist can be used in research around the world, and close to home!
