

October 2023 Board Meeting

Our new Board received a presentation from Paul Meunier, Director of Education, from the Federation of Calgary Communities (FCC) on community association Board fiduciary responsibilities and accountabilities. It was an excellent foundation for the Board to encourage active and full participation from all members. The FCC offers several free workshops to Calgary's over 155 community associations.

Paul shared that across Calgary, community association membership sits at about 15% of a community's population. Here in Glendale, we have over 750 people receiving our e-news emails, and 251 household memberships (considering 1128 dwellings captured in the 2019 Calgary census, that puts us at about 22%). We are looking forward to increasing membership as events return to the hall!

The Board is continuing to work through deficiencies and final handover items on the hall renovation. In the meantime, rentals have started back up, and stay tuned for a new booking request calendar to be available on myglendale.ca/hall-rentals.

It's a shrub. It's a tree! It's super Schubert!

We're having a fabulous fall, complete with lots of showy colour, even misty mornings. If you've never noticed them, the city park west of 45th has a lovely display of larches. Watch the amazing colour next fall!

A well-regarded tree is the Schubert chokecherry (Prunus virginiana 'Schubert')! Its deep purple foliage is a lovely foil to all the 'normal' greens of trees and shrubs, and it often has a pride of place as a specimen tree. It has notable white flowers and edible purple fruit. The leaves start out green and quickly turn to deep red. The Schubert chokecherry is a cultivar, but the native plant can have red leaves, which got horticulturalist 'Schubert' and others very excited to consistently propagate these deep red leafed trees. The chokecherry (Prunus virginiana) is found in North America, and in some spots is considered invasive. The plant has found its way to English gardens.

It's drought tolerant, hardy, and not picky about soil, but it does better in the sun and grows in areas zone two to seven. It grows relatively quickly up to seven meters with a six-meter spread. Its longevity is about 40 years. It is prone to black knot, a fungal disease, found in Calgary, which affects plums and other cherries.

As a bonus, it has edible dark purple fruit that can be turned into jams, jellies, and wine, but not really tasty as a raw fruit—note the name 'choke' cherry. Birds and bees and other pollinators love this tree too.

The tree form, which is pruned to this shape, can revert to its shrub form. When that happens, you'll see the tidy oval form of the tree sprouting shoots at the base, often showing green leaves. In many people's eyes, this 'suckering' is just a nasty evil that needs to be dealt with pruning shears. The chokecherry has a deep rhizomatous root system that extends beyond the drip line of the tree, which means they will sucker if the roots are damaged. It is best to plant them in an area where suckering can be tolerated. If you find suckers, look at what's happening in the tree part; some branches might be dying off indicating that's a stressed tree.

Nurseries and horticulturalists want to please their customers but should warn buyers that this tree can sucker and may need to be annually trimmed. This may be a small price to pay for a tree that has gorgeous leaves, produces flowers, fruit and attracts birds and bees.

The Schubert chokecherry is a lovely tree and not far from its native origins. Next year I'm planting a species of chokecherry, rather than a Schubert. Birds have already given me a Schubert that is currently growing under my old crab-apple tree.
