

Haysboro Crime Activity was Up in June 2023

The Haysboro community experienced 15 crimes in June 2023, in comparison to 11 crimes the previous month, and 28 crimes in June one year ago. Haysboro experiences an average of 18.2 crimes per month. On an annual basis, Haysboro experienced a total of 218 crimes as of June 2023, which is down 10% in comparison to 242 crimes as of June 2022.
