



CRIME PREVENTION AND SAFETY

The Great Disappearing Act

Some things are worth repeating and this is one of them: Parcel theft and thieves. Have you heard the term Porch Pirate? According to the dictionary, a porch pirate is a thief who takes packages left outside doors by couriers.

Winter has arrived and so has the holiday season. It's the time of year that brings a flood of online shopping. This modern service has increased in popularity over the years because of its time-saving convenience, ease, and often free delivery. For some however, this online carefree shopping has not turned out to be so perfect after all and the reason is all over the news.

The question people ask is "why would anyone do this?"

Like many crimes, they are known as crimes of opportunity. It's a crime that is committed when an opportunity presents itself and is taken advantage of. Simply put, offenders look for and choose targets that offer a high reward with little effort or risk. The hope is the package will contain valuable merchandise that could be resold, such as jewelry, phones, video game systems, electronics, or computers, etc. These opportunist criminals may be those who simply seek out the thrill of stealing.

Porch pirates usually strike during the day as many delivered packages sit unattended on people's front porches while the homeowner is away. Some thefts are calculated in advance. These are where the offenders enter a neighbourhood to wait and watch for a delivery truck such as UPS or FedEx. Once they see the package(s) have been delivered and the truck has driven away, the porch pirates simply make off with the goods.

Preventative Measures - Helping Yourself

It's incredibly disheartening and frustrating to have your packages stolen! Whether you've been the victim of porch theft or just want to avoid it happening in the future, the best way to deal with package thieves is through preventative security measures. The following are a few effective tips on how to protect your packages and frustrate porch pirates.

Take Advantage of Package Tracking

These days every major delivery company/postal service will have a tracking number system making it easy to track your package's transport progress, including an

updated time of delivery. Use this tracking information to retrieve your package once it has been delivered. If you aren't going to be home when a package is delivered, ask a trusted neighbour if you can have it sent there instead. Another option is to inquire about having it delivered to your workplace.

Delivery with Signature Needed

A simple way to prevent mail theft is to have your packages delivered to a person who has to sign for the delivery. This is usually set up when your online order asks for shipping information.

Ask That the Package Not Be Left Plain View

When checking out and filling in the shipping information, see if there is a place to leave delivery instructions. Ask that the package be left in a spot that is not visible from the road. It's also a good idea to make it clear you have a home security system.

Take Advantage of the 'Ship to Store' Option

Many retailers offer a 'ship to store' option. That means when you order items that aren't available in the store, they will have them shipped from the warehouse and delivered to the store itself. When notified, you then pick up your order at the store.

Have Canada Post Packages Held at Your Local Post Office

Simply use the address of your nearest post office with PO BOX added at the beginning of the address. Make sure your contact phone number is on the delivery label. The post office will contact you when your parcel arrives.

Install a Home Security System/Doorbell Camera

Advertise it. Make it clear you have a home security system! When a thief sees a package sitting on your porch, (a crime of opportunity), they may think twice about it if they see that your home is equipped with a security system. If the porch pirate is so bold as to steal your package, your security camera may provide evidence and vital information about the thief that can be provided to law enforcement. Police say any kind of video footage is a big help in these kinds of investigations.

Look for Other Options

Investigate other options on the internet such as porch pirate bags, lockbox services, the doorman app, amazon lockers, and/or insuring your packages.

Did You Know We're All in the Business of Crime Prevention?

Yes, we are, and Calgary Police want to know of any suspicious persons you see hanging out in our neighbourhood. If someone seems out of place, don't be afraid to call the non-emergency line at 403-266-1234, and whenever you see a crime in progress, call 9-1-1.

One Other Thing

As long as we have the convenience of parcel door delivery, discouraging porch pirate theft is our responsibility. Help to keep the fun in online shopping and the joy in this holiday season. Spread the news and share these crime prevention tips with family and friends.



Our mornings start with a gentle transition outside. The children are bundled up in their warm winter clothing and they wander into our outdoor space to explore. They are excited to be together and to start the preschool morning with outdoor play. Our outside time provides opportunities for learning that aren't available indoors, including physical literacy and spatial knowledge. Importantly, navigation and nurturing nature, our little "forest", and green spaces provide children with the tools to learn environmental awareness, appreciation, and stewardship. When children are allowed to take risks and choose their own play outdoors, they gain confidence, resilience to overcome challenges, and skills to manage risk on their own.

The children have settled into our preschool community, and I am in awe of the relationships they have fostered with each other both inside and outside our classroom. We have an incredible, supportive parent group and extended families that help support our community building. This time of year, we are incredibly grateful for our community and how much they do to keep our preschool operating and thriving. Our community consists of current families and years of alumni students and families that show up for us each year to support our fundraising efforts, work on our board of directors, and offer support in various other ways. It is what creates such a wonderful place to work, play, and learn.

In the classroom we have been exploring winter and hibernation. The children have been talking about which animals like to sleep for the winter and how other animals change colour and adapt so that they can survive the winter. We have used loose parts and creative activities to foster their learning.

8 Tips for Beating Holiday Stress
