

Heat Related Illness

from Alberta Health Services

EMS would like to remind everyone to stay safe in the heat and sun this season. While children and the elderly may be more susceptible to the effects of heat and sun, basic prevention measures should be taken by all to avoid a heat related illness during periods of hot and humid weather.

Heat Exhaustion

- Heat exhaustion can occur due to excessive fluid loss during periods of prolonged sweating in a hot and/or humid environment (indoors or outdoors).
- Patients may suffer headaches, weakness, fatigue, nausea/vomiting, thirst, chills, and profuse sweating.
- The patient is usually cold and damp to the touch and the skin may appear pale or dusky gray.

Heat Stroke

- Heat stroke is a medical emergency which, without prompt treatment, could be fatal.
- It occurs when the body can't cool itself naturally (e.g., perspiration). The body's temperature will continue to rise to dangerous levels.
- Due to severe dehydration and the inability to sweat, the patient may appear flushed, and skin may be hot and dry to the touch.

First Aid

- First aid for all heat related illness begins with removing or sheltering the patient from the hot environment.
- Remove excess, or tight-fitting clothing, and allow them to rest in a cool environment.
- If the patient is conscious and alert, provide suitable fluids such as water, juice, or a sports drink.
- If you are concerned, seek medical attention.

Prevention

- Stay well-hydrated by drinking plenty of water at all times.
- Be aware that excessive alcohol consumption will promote dehydration.
- Always wear a broad brimmed hat to keep the sun off your face and neck.



 Apply a broad spectrum, waterproof sunscreen with a minimum SPF of 30+, especially for children. The sun's UV rays peak between 11:00 am and 3:00 pm, even on cloudy days.

Fire Pit Safety

Ahhhh, summer. How pleasant are the sounds of the songbirds, leaves rustling in the wind, and friends enjoying conversation out on the patio. It's one of those beautiful evenings, the perfect time to relax around a crackling cozy fire pit.

A fire pit in the backyard is a wonderful way to unwind and stay warm at night, but when it's not safely used, it can be dangerous and cause a lot of damage. That is why before lighting your first fire, it's important to know the fundamental fire pit safety rules to keep everyone safe.

First, Always Check if a Fire Ban or Advisory is in Fffect.

A Fire Ban is issued because of an increased danger of fire and poor air quality. It lists and restricts for a time certain types of fire use within the city such as fire pits, barbecues, and other forms of open flame devices.

Fines for Violating a Fire Ban Range From \$500 to \$5,000.

The purpose of a Fire Safety Advisory is to notify citizens of conditions that have a moderate to high risk of fire. Typically, it is released prior to the conditions leading to a fire ban. It could be issued for short-term conditions like major windstorms, unusually dry weather, or hot temperatures. This Advisory may continue to be in effect even if the weather changes and it rains or snows because there is still a greater risk of fire. The City's preparedness for any shift in the risk of fire is ensured by the Calgary Fire Department's ongoing monitoring of weather forecasts and conditions that could lead to a fire ban.

Smoke - Important to Consider.

Before using your fire pit for the first time, learn about the best wind conditions. Consider not only the conditions in your yard, but your neighbours as well. High winds not only cause a fire risk but can carry smoke a long way. Low wind speeds make it difficult for smoke to disperse and can worsen the air quality. Until you've taken reasonable precautions, you should not engage in any activity that is likely to allow smoke or any other airborne matter to escape your location as it could adversely affect another person's health.

Where You Buy It - You Burn It.

While often not thought of, your choice of firewood can have a direct effect on the health of the trees in your neighbourhood. Non-native pests and diseases are easily spread when brought in by firewood from outside your area. To keep your neighbourhood trees beautiful, burn wood from within your locality. - Backyard fire pits should be built into the ground, on brick or stone, or in a fire-proof container. Portable fire pits may be used on a deck as long as they sit on brick or stone and not directly on the wood.
- 2. Fire pits must be at least two metres away from your property line, house, garage, or fence.
- 3. Fire pits must not be under any trees, branches, plants, or other materials that can catch fire.
- 4. All fires in your fire pit must be kept to a reasonable size; one metre high and wide. A mesh screen or 'spark guard' is required in order to reduce the spread of embers and sparks from wood-burning fire pits. The openings in the mesh screen must not be greater than 1.24 cm across.
- 5. Only burn clean, dry firewood. Do not burn:
 - Wood that is painted, treated, or contains glue or resin
 - Wood from a different location, region, or province
 - · Wet or green/fresh cut wood
 - Yard waste (cut grass or leaves)
 - Garbage
 - Rubber or plastic
 - Furniture
- 6. Always have a way to put out the fire close to your fire pit. Keep a watering hose or a bucket of water nearby.
- 7. All fires in your fire pit must be continually supervised.
- 8. No Person shall ignite or allow an outdoor fire to burn on a premises:
- between 12:00 am and 10:00 am from Monday to Friday; or
- between 1:00 am and 10:00 am on Saturday or Sunday

To report an unattended fire, such as when the residents have been away from the fire pit for an extended period of time, call 311.

To report an out-of-control fire that is spreading outside of the fire pit, call 911.

In Closing

A crackling fire in your fire pit with family and friends is a wonderful way to create those special memories. Follow the rules, stay safe, and have a fun-filled summer!




