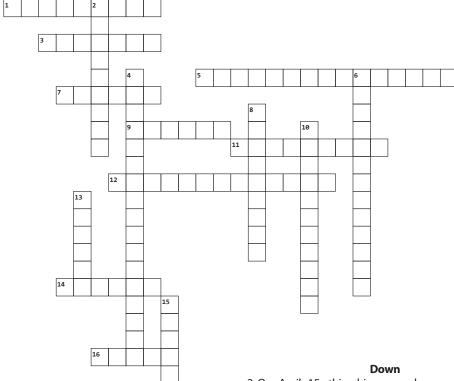

Bored? Think Twice Before Taking That Facebook Quiz

Social media is used as a fun distraction for some people, and taking a Facebook quiz may seem like a harmless way to pass the time. But are you giving away more information than you think?

How the scam works

A fun quiz pops up on your Facebook feed or another social media platform. A few questions are answered to prove how well you know a friend. Or a short personality test is offered to match you with a character from a favourite TV show.

These quizzes appear to be meaningless, but the intent behind them is to collect information. For example, questions like: "What was the first car you owned?", "What is your mother's maiden name?", or "What is the name of the street you grew up on?" These are common security questions for insurance, banking, and credit card accounts. Sharing this information can lead to accounts being hacked, and personal and financial information being stolen.

Not all social media quizzes are data collection scams; however, BBB cautions users to be careful about what they share online and to check the privacy settings on the account. Social media data and quiz answers can be used to steal identity or enable a scammer to impersonate you to your friends and family.

Tips to avoid social media scams

- Be skeptical: Before answering a quiz, figure out who created it. Is it a brand you trust? Just because something appears to be fun and innocent, doesn't mean there isn't an inherent risk.
- Adjust privacy settings: Review the social media account's privacy settings and be strict about any information that is shared - and be mindful of who you are sharing it with.
- Remove personal details from your profile: Don't share information like your phone number or home address on social media accounts.
- Don't give answers to common security questions: Be cautious if the questions in a quiz ask for things like your mother's maiden name, street you grew up on, previously owned vehicles, favourite foods, or the name of your high school.
- Monitor friend requests: Don't accept friend requests from people you don't know. Also be wary of a second friend request from someone you are already connected with; the second profile may be an imposter trying to access your data and your friends list.

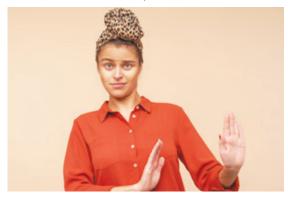

Friends,

In February, the Government of Alberta entered into an agreement with the Government of Canada to increase federal transfers for health care by approximately \$2.4 billion per year. This is a significant increase from the \$5.3 billion that was previously transferred and will result in the federal government contributing approximately 31% of Alberta's healthcare funding through the Canada Health Transfer.

Originally, each of the provinces and federal governments paid 50% of all healthcare costs. In 1995, Prime Minister Jean Chretien had to deal with a structural budget deficit and reduced the federal share of health spending to 23%. This meant that provinces were left to pay for most of our health care expenses.

Over those 28 years, healthcare spending in Alberta has risen from \$4 billion to over \$24 billion. (Inflation alone would have seen that number rise to about \$6.6 billion.) Recognize that this sector's costs are increasing far more quickly than most other expenses, partially due to demographics. As a percentage of provincial government expenditures, it has risen from 30% to 38%.

Out of 30 OECD countries, Canada spends the highest percentage of its GDP (at 12.9%) on health care spending. Unfortunately, this does not mean that Canada produces the best health outcomes:

Canada is ranked 28 out of 30 countries for the lowest number of physicians per 1,000 people at 2.8 physicians.

In 1993, the median wait time from a general physician to a specialist was 3.63 weeks, then a further 6.9 weeks from a specialist visit to receiving treatment. In 2022, the average wait time to see a specialist after a GP referral is 14.1 weeks, then 19.2 weeks from specialist to treatment.

Let's recognize that our metrics on health care are moving in the wrong direction. Increasing backlogs do not reflect proper patient care, and often lead to worse health outcomes for patients. More funding is required, and we need to consider this in light of the mounting debts our federal government is incurring – because 'kicking the can down the road' will hinder our next generation from being able to pay for their own healthcare with their tax dollars.

Rest assured I will continue to advocate for structural solutions that lead to better patient care outcomes.

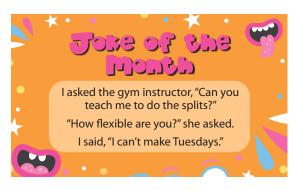

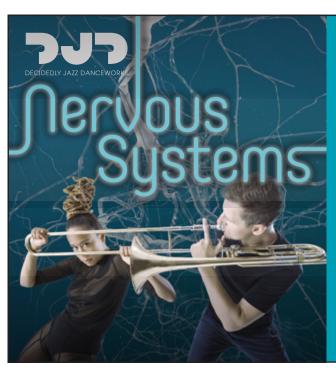
