#### **February Is Heart Month**

Do you know the signs and symptoms of a heart attack and what to do if someone experiences these? Knowing may make the difference between life and death. Recognizing and responding immediately to the warning signs of a potential heart attack may significantly improve survival and recovery. February is Heart Month: take the time to be heart safe and learn how you can reduce your risk.

#### **Common Signs of a Heart Attack**

(Any, or all, of these signs and symptoms may occur)

- Chest discomfort described as simply a mild pressure up to a 'crushing' pain; may also be 'squeezing' or a 'heavy' sensation.
- Discomfort may move to the shoulders, arm, neck, or jaw.
- May include shortness of breath, sweating, or nausea/ vomiting.
- Signs may vary person to person and can differ between men, women, and the elderly.

#### **Heart Attack Risk Factors**

- Obesity\*
- Sedentary lifestyle\*
- Smoking\*
- High cholesterol\*
- Age/Gender
- Family history

Speak with your doctor about how to treat your modifiable (\*) risk factors and learn to be heart safe.

#### What To Do When Seconds Count

- Call 911, immediately. Early treatment can greatly reduce heart damage and be the difference between life and death.
- Treatment starts the moment EMS arrives. Paramedics can provide oxygen, start an intravenous, and perform an electrocardiogram (ECG).
- Paramedics can also administer important medication(s) in the early minutes of a heart attack to lessen heart damage.
- During transport, EMS will share information with the hospital so that definitive treatment can begin immediately upon arrival.
- Take a CPR/AED course. Training is widely available from many reputable organizations. It's easy and could make a significant difference in the outcome of someone experiencing a heart attack.

#### **Community Redevelopment**

As development in North Glenmore Park continues to evolve, the community association is receiving

more inquiries about potential redevelopment projects. North Glenmore Park Community Association is committed to supporting area redevelopment that complements the existing community, works within the infrastructure, and supports the quality of life that residents wish to uphold.

Best way to keep apprised of development applications: For the most up-to-date information on any development application, visit https://dmap.calgary.ca and input the address or development permit number. You will then have access to the application details and status, along with contact information for the City of Calgary file manager. This is your best source for current information on specific proposed projects. Additionally, current North Glenmore Park area redevelopment applications are listed on the community association website at https://npgca.ca/area-redevelopment, and on our Facebook page under North Glenmore Park Community Association. Due to publishing deadlines, we are unable to provide a list of development applications in this publication.

Role of the Community Planning and Area Redevelopment Committee (PARC): The community association's Planning and Area Redevelopment Committee (known as PARC) has no formal jurisdiction or authority in planning matters. Rather than rejecting or approving applications, the committee's role is to provide advice, background information, and community context.

How the Redevelopment Committee Helps Community Members with Development Issues: The Planning and Redevelopment Committee (PARC) helps community members advocate for themselves for development that fulfills the vision described in the North Glenmore Park Community Association's Planning Guide but has no jurisdiction over planning decisions. The committee can provide information on developments, advice on how to navigate the planning process, and can advise individual community members on how to engage in the process directly regardless of their views. However, realizing that residents have a variety of viewpoints, the community association maintains a neutral view on development except in special circumstances. Occasionally, the committee hosts an open house for residents to give input and discuss a particular proposed project.


