



Calgary Co-op Oakridge Development Update

The newly constructed Oakridge Professional Building is open for business!

Many businesses have relocated from the mall and are now operating from their new premises, including Co-op Cannabis, CIBC, Connect First, Hearing Life, Personalized Bookkeeping, Oakridge Denture Clinic, Oakridge Chiropractic, and The Village Studio. Oakridge Dental Clinic and West Peaks Dental Clinic will be opening in late March. We are excited to welcome Easy Blink Optometry/Vision Therapy to the Professional Building this summer.

Demolition of the mall is planned to begin this spring and should be completed by fall. Once complete, construction of a new food store will commence with a planned opening for late 2024.

All existing businesses including the food store, gas bar, and car wash will remain open during the construction period and all efforts will be made to minimize any interruption.

Once the new food store is open, we will demolish the current food store, and begin the final phase of the project which includes residential development slated to be complete for 2026.


Help your community and become a **BINGO** Volunteer!

Residential Traffic Concerns



The Residential Traffic Safety Unit (RTSU) is a unit created to specifically address residential traffic issues. Our strategy is to utilize citizen feedback to develop our operational response. We focus on playground zones, pedestrian rich areas, and other high-risk locations identified through collision data analysis. The RTSU is attached to the Traffic Section of the Calgary Police Service.

We strongly emphasize public awareness and education, facilitating citizen engagement by attending Community Association Board meetings to discuss the Traffic Service Request System (TSR). The TSR is a key tool to help Calgary Police Service monitor and track traffic safety issues.

The RTSU also utilizes strong collaborative relationships with City partners on traffic concerns requiring resolutions other than enforcement, such as sign changes, installation of crosswalks, Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons, extension of playground zones, etc.

We can further assist by liaising with established community partnerships. This includes MLA offices, City Councillor offices, and Neighborhood Committee Coordinators as we continue to expand events attended by the RTSU.

Commercial Vehicles

Commercial vehicles do not have to be a semi truck pulling a trailer. Any motor vehicle that is being used primarily as a source of employment must be registered and insured as such.

For example, John Doe has an overhead door company and uses his F250 to do jobs, it must be registered as commercial. That Amazon driver in their van must be listed as commercial.

A commercial vehicle may travel off a designated truck route to do a delivery if it is the shortest route in and out. If there is a designated truck route to the site yet going off the route is a shorter distance, they must stick to the designated route.

If you are transporting dirt, gravel, those plastic bags filled with pop cans, or helping a buddy move, all items must be secured in place (tarped or tied

down). That ladder or large object you're moving, and any object that is not a part of the vehicle that extends past the body by more then 1.5 m must have a flag (daytime) and lighting (nighttime) to warn other motorists.

Fines:

- · Over hanging load over 1.5 m with no flag/light 16(1): \$162
- Insecure load 65(2): \$465 (average joe) or 17: \$776 (commercial vehicle)
- Travel off truck route 2(a): \$500

Calgary Connect: Maintaining Ecological Connectivity Thursday, June 8, 7:00 to 8:30 pm

Presented by Nicole Kahal, Conservation Analyst with the Miistakis Institute

What is ecological connectivity and why is it important? What are the challenges to maintaining ecological connectivity in our region? The City of Calgary, in partnership with Miistakis Institute, launched Calgary Captured in 2017, and through this program, Friends volunteers help with wildlife camera monitoring here in Fish Creek Provincial Park. This multi-year wildlife monitoring and citizen science-based program is intended to study urban wildlife populations, their movement and behaviour, and enable informed conservation and management decisions that support healthy wildlife populations in our city. Join Nicole Kahal, Conservation Analyst with the Miistakis Institute, to learn how Miistakis and partners are using wildlife camera-traps, spatial modeling, and municipal planning to understand how we can protect what's left of the natural connections in the Calgary metropolitan region. Stop into the Bow Valley Ranch Visitor Centre

If you have been down to the Bow Valley Ranch in the past year or so, you may have noticed that the Visitor Information Centre is now open six days a week. The exhibit area here features cultural artifacts and a wealth of information about the history of the city and the park. Since the beginning of the Friends' Enhanced Partnership Project with Alberta Parks in 2020, we have trained over thirty volunteers in the new role of Fish Creek Ambassador to work in the centre. We invite you to stop into the Bow Valley Ranch Visitor Centre to pick up a park map or outreach material, learn about some of the unique history of this area, and chat with our friendly and knowledgeable Fish Creek ambassadors.

Oakridge Community Association (OCA): Civic Affairs Report

Southland Crossing - Co-op Development and **Construction Plans**

A model and information of Co-op's development is displayed at the entrance to the shopping mall. Demolition of the existing mall is continuing and should be completed by fall. Once complete, construction of the new food store will commence with a planned opening for late 2024, although deliveries of electrical gear may push this into early 2025. Once the new food store is open, Co-op will demolish the current food store, and begin the final phase of the project which includes residential development slated to be complete for 2026.

RioCan Development at Glenmore Landing

An 'open house' on RioCan's plans for its three phased development at Glenmore Landing was held at PBPCA in early May. These 'early' plans involve using the currently green space along 90 Avenue for multistorey apartment buildings. Our concerns are mainly about the appropriateness of the locations and their impact on traffic, especially during construction. We are discussing how to positively influence this development and its impact on current residents within District 32.

Oakridge Area Upgrade Projects

Regarding our list of common Oakridge projects shared with our Ward 11 representatives, we remain cautiously optimistic that some of our projects will get approved and implemented, especially the road safety ones. Oakside Gate and 90 Avenue pedestrian lights installation has started and should be complete this summer. Palliser Drive and 29 St should also get road calming measures at the pedestrian crossing. We will have completed a survey of residents looking at a speed reduction on Palliser Drive from the posted 50km/hr and will share the results with Ward 11 and City representatives. We continue to observe other pedestrian crossing issues, such as Southland Drive and Oakmoor Way where posted speeds are 60 km/hr. Please also use the City of Calgary 311 line or https:// www.calgarv.ca/311.html to document any road safety or infrastructure issues. The more residents document their concerns, the more likely the City will investigate and address them.

Residential Traffic Safety Unit (RTSU)

The Calgary Police Service - CPS RTSU continues to have monthly focus themes with current compliance issues on distracted driving, seatbelts, and speeding. The Traffic Service Request System (TSR) is a key tool to help Calgary Police Service monitor and track traffic safety issues via link: https://www.calgary.ca/cps/traffic/ traffic-service-requests.html.

OCA Facilities

The OCA Board is supporting a two-phase Parking Lot upgrade: upgrade of the existing parking lot during 2023 and an expansion to the North in 2024. The City will be contributing some funds for this effort. The OCA is also continuing to support the Enmax solar panel roof project with a potential implementation during this May 2023. We continue to look at other climate enhancing opportunities such as bike racks and electric charging stations as part of an expanded car park, growing trees, working with the Oakridge Community Garden, etc. We are also discussing other improvements with 'Oh My Oakridge' such as bike routes between green spaces.

District 32

Our next District 32 Meeting #20 will be on Thursday, June 8 and the CA will continue to share local issues of a common nature. Everything from road safety to 'Development Permits' to the RioCan expansion at Glenmore Landing and future LAP issues.



Oakridge Community Garden (OCG)

In May, we had several activities at the OCG such as orientation of new members and our sod cutting and mulch placement around the perennial beds. We also held our Plant Exchange and Sale on May 17 which saw many members and residents attend. Many gardeners have already planted some early seeds and plants hoping we don't get a late frost.

Our fourth growing season should be rewarding with all the learnings we have received in recent years. If you want to stay connected with our activities, please join us as a level one member. Everyone is invited!


