

In late January we received our account details from the Parks Foundation for the end of 2022. To our pleasant surprise, we are closer to our goal for the Master Plan project than we anticipated. As of December 31, 2022 that account sits at almost \$18,000. While this is a far cry from the \$60,000, we need in the account to start the RFP process, it is a few thousand more than we thought we were at so we couldn't be happier. The extra funds that we had not accounted for based on our fundraising came from community members in the form of either direct donations or through corporate donation programs that match volunteer hours. We encourage you to check with your employer to see if they have a corporate matching program that allows you to make donations to a charitable organization of your choice. The Oh MY Oakridge projects are setup under the Parks Foundation so you can see your donation go directly into supporting the community you live in.

This year we will select our playground vendor for the Oakridge Way Park Upgrade and work with them to design the first revitalized park space as part of this project. We are encouraged by the initial designs we received for grant purposes and can't wait to finalize a design to share with you. Once we have a firm design and have received confirmation of grant funds, we will run a cheque writing campaign for direct donations to the new park.


Additionally, we are discussing opportunities for Oh MY Oakridge to run 50/50 draws and another raffle to support the infrastructure in the new park. Our first raffle, held at our second annual Skate with Santa event, raised just over \$5,000 to put into infrastructure in the park. While we were hoping to raise more with that raffle it was our largest fundraiser to date and we are happy with the result.

We have a few more opportunities to support Oh MY Oakridge coming up:

On March 26 we will be at the Oakridge Community Association from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm with a big truck collecting bottles. All proceeds from the bottle drive will go towards the Master Plan project. Our very first fundraiser in August 2021 was a bottle drive and we raised \$1,800. Our goal with this drive is to beat that! Spread the word around the neighbourhood and to your friends to come out and support upgrading greenspaces in our community.

In May we will most likely run our plant fundraiser again, although we are investigating a different supplier this year, so keep checking our Facebook page for more details on that.

We are always looking for more help and support on our committee. If you are passionate about Oakridge and want to help us create a plan for the greenspaces in our community, we would love for you to join us. The Oakridge Community Association (the association organization) was established in 1970. A volunteer Board of Directors, passionate staff, and countless members and volunteers contribute to making Oakridge one of the best communities to live in in Calgary, voted the 2022 best community in SW Calgary. The G.M. is responsible for the implementation of the strategic plan developed by the Board of Directors, sustainable financial management of the organization, and management of the day-to-day operations of the Oakridge Community Centre and Arena and all events and programs provided by the organization.

Position Overview:



Oakridge Community Association (OCA): Civic Affairs Report

Property Taxes and Oakridge Projects

Property Assessments were mailed out to residents in early January and further details are available at https://www.calgary.ca/property-owners/assessment.html. The 2023 Customer Review Period ends March 13. Regarding the list of common Oakridge projects shared with our Ward 11 representatives, we are cautiously optimistic that some of our projects will get approved and implemented, especially the road safety ones.

Southland Crossing - Co-op Development Plans

Work has begun on the new store, with a completion/move in date of spring 2024. Note, we have yet to understand details of the nine storey tower blocks and their implications on existing and new Oakridge residents. We hope to have more information shared with us soon – the latest details are available at https://www.oakridgemonitor.com/.

OCA Board Meeting with Residential Traffic Safety Unit (RTSU)

In February, the monthly OCA Board meeting was privileged to have representatives from the RTSU visit us and explain their focus. "Their strategy is to utilize citizen feedback to develop operational responses. Their focus is on playground zones, pedestrian rich areas, and other high-risk locations identified through collision data analysis and public feedback." They also utilize the Traffic Service Request System (TSR). The TSR is a key tool to help Calgary Police Service monitor and track traffic safety issues. Please copy the OCA, giving us your Service Request number, so we can evaluate and possibly add to our OCA Oakridge list of projects, mentioned above, that need addressing.

Climate Change Emergency and OCA Mitigation

For overall details of the City's initiatives, see https://www.calgary.ca/environment/climate/climate-change.html. Enmax presented their plan of installing solar panels on the OCA Facilities Roof, subject to several approvals, to the OCA Board at our January meeting. The OCA Board is continuing to support this project with a

potential implementation this May, 2023. We continue to look at other climate enhancing opportunities such as electric charging stations as part of an expanded car park, growing trees, working with the Oakridge Community Garden, etc. We are also discussing other improvements with 'Oh My Oakridge' such as bike routes between green spaces.

District 32

We have been advised that the Local Area Planning (LAP) activities have been delayed further to post-2025. Details at https://www.calgary.ca/planning/projects.html.

However, many developments are proceeding such as the Co-op, and other changes including review of playgrounds and green spaces. Enmax and Telus are also busy with service upgrades to the area. These incremental changes without an overall plan remain a concern for District 32 participants.

We are in parallel monitoring The Heritage Communities LAP or Growth Plan which is currently in Phase four. It will be brought forward to the Infrastructure and Planning Committee (IPC) on April 5, 2023. Details of the LAP can be found at https://engage.calgary.ca/heritage, and we hope to learn more from their experience.

Residential Traffic Concerns

The Residential Traffic Safety Unit (RTSU) is a unit created to specifically address residential traffic issues. Our strategy is to utilize citizen feedback to develop our operational response. We focus on playground zones, pedestrian rich areas, and other high-risk locations identified through collision data analysis. The RTSU is attached to the Traffic Section of the Calgary Police Service.

We strongly emphasize public awareness and education, facilitating citizen engagement by attending Community Association Board meetings to discuss the Traffic Service Request System (TSR). The TSR is a key tool to help Calgary Police Service monitor and track traffic safety issues.

The RTSU also utilizes strong collaborative relationships with City partners on traffic concerns requiring resolutions other than enforcement, such as sign changes, installation of crosswalks, Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons, extension of playground zones, etc.

We can further assist by liaising with established community partnerships. This includes MLA offices, City Councillor offices, and Neighborhood Committee Coordinators as we continue to expand events attended by the RTSU.

SAFE & SOUND

Burns and Scalds

from Alberta Health Services

Each year Emergency Medical Services respond to emergencies involving young children who have sustained severe burns or scalds. These incidents often occur inside the child's own home. Common causes include a child accidentally tipping hot liquids onto themselves, touching hot surfaces such as stoves, or making contact with electrical outlets. Fortunately, incidents such as these can be avoided by taking preventative measures.

Degrees of Burn

- 1°: Affects only the top layers of the skin; appears red like a sun burn; discomfort is generally tolerable.
- 2°: Deeper and much more painful than 1°burns; broken skin or blisters commonly develop.
- 3°: Severe: The deepest layers of skin and tissue are injured; may appear charred or leathery.

First Aid for Burns

- Skin may continue to burn if not cooled. Immediately douse burns with large amounts of cold water.
- Cover the burn with a sterile dressing, or at least clean material to protect infection.
- Over the counter medications may be used for pain. Adhere to directions given on the label.
- Seek further medical attention, as required.

Prevention of Burns

- Check the temperature of your hot water tank. Temperatures as high as 60°C / 140°F will scald a child in just seconds.
- Use placemats instead of tablecloths. Tablecloths can be yanked downward causing hot drinks or food to spill on a child.
- Turn pot handles to the back of the stove and ensure cords from kettles, slow cookers, and other electrical appliances cannot be reached.
- Avoid picking up a child while holding any hot liquids.
- Ensure electrical outlets are made secure by installing commercially available safety devices which prohibit access.
- Keep children away from areas where appliances are in use (kettles, irons, hot stoves).

If you require immediate medical attention, call 911.
