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

I would just like to highlight what has been happening/ going on behind the scenes this past month, in no particular order:

Thank you all for contributing to this wonderful community that we live in!

Thank you, Sue H. and Chantal O., for organizing a wonderful Community Cleanup event! It was great to see how many items were directed to the Free Store and to the Drop-In Centre collection.

As we get closer to the implementation of the payment requirement for restricted parking, we will remind Council of the impact it will have on our residents as we have a lot of institutional pressure from MRU.

A land use redesignation is underway to change some of the Richmond Green Regional Park space into protected park space. We will be reminding Council that out of what is currently a 52-acre regional park, only 5.4 acres will be specifically designated as park space, since Water Resources has claim to, and priority over, the remaining park space. We will continue to oppose the sale of the baseball diamonds and ask that those 5.5 acres be guaranteed as park space as well.

The main hall remains closed due to a structural failure in the floor joists. A final engineering report has been generated by the City and our insurance provider is reviewing the report to determine if they will be compensating us in any way. Thank you for your patience.

CRIME STATISTICS

Rutland Park Crime Activity was Up in June 2023

The Rutland Park community experienced 5 crimes in June 2023, in comparison to 2 crimes the previous month, and 4 crimes in June one year ago. Rutland Park experiences an average of 3.3 crimes per month. On an annual basis, Rutland Park experienced a total of 40 crimes as of June 2023, which is down 37% in comparison to 63 crimes as of June 2022. Currie Crime Activity was Up in June 2023

The Currie community experienced 1 crime in June 2023, in comparison to 0 crimes the previous month, and 2 crimes in June one year ago. Currie experiences an average of 1.0 crime per month. On an annual basis, Currie experienced a total of 12 crimes as of June 2023, which is up 50% in comparison to 8 crimes as of June 2022. Lincoln Park Crime Activity was Down in June 2023

The Lincoln Park community experienced 3 crimes in June 2023, in comparison to 4 crimes the previous month, and 3 crimes in June one year ago. On an annual basis, Lincoln Park experienced a total of 67 crimes as of June 2023, which is up 43% in comparison to 47 crimes as of June 2022. National Peacekeepers' Day is observed on the nearest Sunday to August 9, a significant date in Canadian history. On August 9, 1974, a United Nations Canadian transport plane was tragically shot down by Syrian missiles, resulting in the loss of all nine Canadian peacekeepers on board. This day serves as a solemn reminder of the sacrifice made by 130 Canadian peacekeepers who lost their lives during active missions since 1948. A commemorative event is scheduled for August 13 at Peacekeeper Park in Garrison Green, marking the 75th anniversary of United Nations peacekeeping. This anniversary compels us to recognize the challenges ahead, including rising violence and a more divided world, which hinder the mission of upholding the rule of law and safeguarding democracy.

I will be visiting with many of you that day, as I have a booth at Marda Gras. This is one of our city's most interesting street fairs, and it is always filled with families from the neighbourhood. I will also be at the Chinatown Street Festival later this month, and I hope to see many friends at Calgary Pride.

While the final numbers for collection are not yet available, the amazing results are obvious.
