





Fall Candle Care: How to Prevent Tunneling

Fall is a popular time for candlelight and cozy nights in, which means dusting off your candle collection. You might notice that some have developed a deep "tunnel" around the wick, making it difficult to light. Tunneling also shortens the life of your candle as only the wax in the centre of the candle will burn down.

Here are a few easy ways to prevent or fix tunneling so you can enjoy your favourite candles this season:

Prevention

When you light a candle for the first time, allow it to burn long enough to melt all the way to the edges of the candle jar. This ensures an even burn for the duration of your candle's life as wax has a "memory" so to speak. The first burn sets the tone for subsequent burns and will help you get the most burn-time out of your new candle.


If you find that your candles are constantly tunneling, despite letting the wax melt to the edges of the jar, consider buying higher quality candles. Most candles on the market are made of paraffin wax (a toxic byproduct of petroleum) and are more predisposed to tunneling. Higher grade waxes like coconut, soy, or beeswax burn cleaner, longer, and more evenly.

The Fix

If you have an old candle that's already tunneling, here are two easy ways to fix it:

- 1. Set your oven to 80°C (176°F) then remove anything flammable from your candle, such as labels or string. Once the oven is hot, place your candle on a baking tray for five minutes. This should heat the entire surface of the wax, making it smooth. With oven mitts, remove the candle and let it cool before lighting it.
- 2. Wrap aluminum foil around the top of your candle and angle it inwards like a dome. Ensure that the flame is far enough away from the foil and that there is still a hole to vent air. The foil will help the wax to heat up evenly. Keep a careful eye on your candle until the top layer of wax has melted, leaving a smooth surface, then remove the foil.

With these easy steps, you can enjoy your candles this season without any tunneling. If this article helped you, be sure to share it with a friend or loved one!




Some of her favourite memories living here include playing at the waterpark with her daughter and building lifelong friendships.

ASK THE GARDEN EXPERT

Top Three Tips and Tricks

#1 Can I harvest my winter squash before it's ripe on the vine?

Frost is in the forecast! Squash that have started to turn colour may be cut off the vines (leave about two inches of stalk intact on the fruit). Wash the skins with a soft cloth. Place the fruit in a warm, dry, sunny location and turn them periodically so they can finish changing colour.

#2 How should I store potatoes after they've been harvested?

Do not wash potatoes before storing. Brush them gently to remove excess soil but do not damage skins. Store potatoes in a dark, well-ventilated area at about seven to ten degrees Celsius. Depending on the variety, they will store about four months.

#3 Will green tomatoes ripen off the plant?

Usually, yes. They contain a plant hormone called ethylene that facilitates ripening. Gently wash and dry tomatoes, then place them in single layers in cardboard trays (leave some space between each fruit). Keep them in a warm, dry location out of direct sunlight. There's no need to wrap them in paper. Turn them periodically and remove any that are rotting.

Somerset Bridlewood Community Garden

Can you believe that pumpkin spice season is here already? Plenty of both summer and winter squash (and a few pumpkins!) were grown in the community garden this year. If you grew squash at home and had pollination troubles and therefore poor yields, consider manually helping your plants along next year. Look for the male flowers and female flowers on your squash plants; the males will have long thin stems while the females will have thicker stems with what looks like small fruits forming just beneath the blooms. You can use a toothbrush or an artist's paintbrush to transfer pollen from the male flowers to the female flowers and hopefully increase your chances of getting fruit. Sometimes, the bees just don't show up when we need them to!

The community garden celebrated the gift of four new fruit trees this summer! We received two Evans cherry trees and two different cultivars of apple trees from the City of Calgary as they promote the growth (pun intended!) of the city's tree canopy coverage. It will be a while before the trees bear fruit but we're working hard to make them comfortable in their new homes in the garden. If you planted new trees this summer, ensure that they have had enough water before they enter dormancy; as well, use mulch at the base of the trees to give them their best possible chance of weathering our Calgary winter. Bark chips or nuggets are a great mulch, but you can also use a pile of dry leaves as a temporary and very inexpensive cover.




