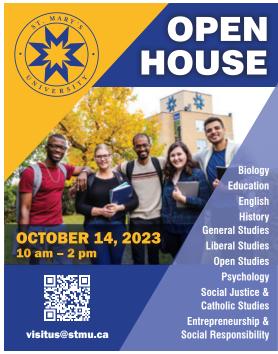

Dementia Advice Line Connects Albertans to Care

from Alberta Health Services



Individuals living with dementia, and their caregivers, can now be connected directly to a specialized dementia nurse through Health Link 811 as part of

changes to the dementia advice line. This will better connect caregivers and those with dementia, including Alzheimer's, to timely advice and care.

Between 8:00 am and 8:00 pm daily, Albertans can call Health Link at 811 and press the option to speak to a nurse specializing in dementia. They will answer your call, go through an assessment, and provide advice and resources for your immediate concerns. Previously, callers needed to speak to a Health Link nurse, get a referral, and then receive a response within 72 hours from a dementia purse

After hours, Health Link staff will assess your needs and provide advice for your immediate concerns. When needed, you will be referred to a specialized dementia nurse for additional advice.

The dementia nurse, who has extensive training and experience in seniors' health, will be able to provide an in-depth assessment to gain an understanding of each situation. The dementia nurse will provide support and advice to patients and caregivers and can connect callers to services available in their community.

Currently, about 40,000 Albertans are living with dementia, a syndrome that affects memory, thinking, orientation, judgment, and the ability to carry out daily activities.

The number of dementia cases is expected to more than double in Alberta as the baby boom generation moves into older age. By 2038, it is estimated that about one in 10 Albertans over the age of 65, and nearly half over age 90, will be living with dementia.

monthly meetings held at Cardel Rec South every first Wednesday of the month at 7:00 pm.

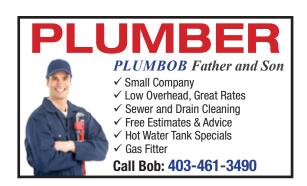

Call for Help with Child Development Questions

from Alberta Health Services

Parents, guardians, and caregivers who have concerns about their child's development and well-being can now receive free advice and guidance through a new phone service.

By calling Health Link at 811, Albertans with concerns about their child's development — including speech, movement, and hearing — can be redirected to the new pediatric rehabilitation line and speak with an occupational therapist or another appropriate allied health professional.

The new pediatric rehabilitation line provides advice to parents and caregivers of infants, children, and youth (birth to 18 years of age) who have concerns about developmental milestones in areas such as:

- Moving and playing (crawling, walking, coordination, playing with toys, using utensils)
- Talking and listening (babbling, using words and sentences, speech sounds, understanding directions, stuttering, voice quality)
- Taking care of self (dressing, toileting, sleeping)
- Managing emotions (calming self, becoming overwhelmed or overstimulated)
- Difficulty eating or swallowing (coughing, gagging)
- Hearing (responding to sounds, noise, voices, words)

The pediatric rehabilitation line can also help callers who are looking for local services and/or current rehabilitation resources (e.g., links to information or webinars), or need support to help a child or youth recover from COVID-19.

AHS also offers free webinars that cover developmental topics for children and youth from birth to 18 years of age. Topics range from toilet training and tummy time to emotional regulation and speech development.

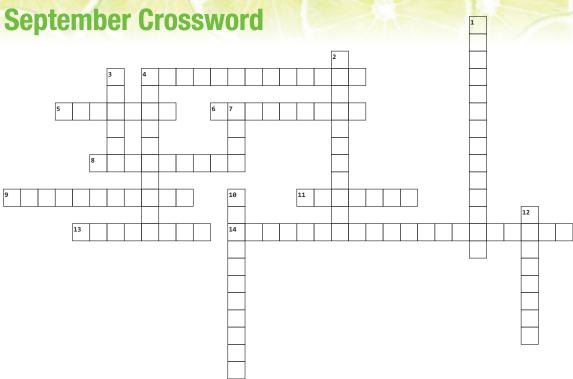
Hosted by pediatric rehabilitation professionals, the AHS webinar series is designed for all parents and caregivers. It may be especially beneficial for those with children and youth who may be developing differently or who have medical conditions that are affecting their development.



Most sessions are live, meaning participants can ask questions during the session. Some sessions are pre-recorded.

Each webinar is free of charge and will focus on a specific developmental skill such as walking, talking, listening, and more. Parents and caregivers will build skills and gain confidence by learning practical ways to help children and youth improve their skills while supporting development.

The free webinars are delivered on Zoom and require registration in advance. Summer may be fading, but the Somerset Bridlewood Community Garden is still going strong! If you've recently walked by the garden, you'll see cheerful sunflowers popping up

high above the fence line, and you might just catch a glimpse of some ripening pumpkins and other winter squash. We're busy pulling carrots and munching on zucchini, tomatoes, and cucumbers. We've been growing potatoes and onions for donation to the food bank, but we're also offering snacks for our Somerset neighbours and passers-by! If you stop by the east side of the garden, you'll find a cute little bucket strapped to the fence. If you spot any fresh produce in the bucket, please feel free to take it. It's for everyone to share. It's our way of expressing our love for our community!

As part of their community orchard program, the City of Calgary gifted the garden with two apple trees. They were planted in the month of July and we're already preparing them for the winter ahead by protecting them with mulch and placing tree guards around the base of the trunks to deter voles and rabbits. Diligent first-year care is particularly essential to a fruit tree's survival in our climate!

The garden has been abuzz with several events over the past few months. On July 25, we hosted a garden tour and presentation about mid-season harvesting for members and guests. And over the months of July and August, a library experience guide from the Calgary Public Library visited every second Tuesday morning to offer a story time session for the kids. We are extending this special story time program to Tuesday, September 12, so please join us at the garden for stories and rhymes! It's a drop-in program for everyone to attend free of charge.

Our fundraising efforts are ramping up! The garden membership is hoping to expand our growing space within the next year, as well as replace the older, worn-out garden beds. Keep on top of our socials to find out all the creative and fun plans we have! The more beds we add, the more gardeners can join and grow with us!

More About Our Local Expert!



Sheryl gets her love of gardening from her mom. She became more active within the trade after working in a university garden centre – where she participated in her first land share program. Her specialization in prairie gardening originates from the complexities found within Calgary's climate and shorter growing season. She's encouraged by helping others observe, adapt, and grow bountiful crops right in their own backyards.

Along with primarily overseeing Somerset Bridlewood's Community Association Garden, she's also active within the Calgary Horticultural Society and Master Gardeners Association of Alberta – running many garden-related groups online. Having been published countless

times, and helping to co-author an eight-part mini-series, she holds both a Prairie Horticulture and Sustainable Urban Agriculture Certificate. Even though her reputation proceeds her, she's still a true "small space gardener," regularly tending to a tiny balcony container spread and neighbourhood plot of her own.

Introducing monthly tips for the home gardener! Brought to you by Somerset Bridlewood's Community Garden Director, accredited horticulturist, and *Guides for the Prairie Gardener* co-author, Sheryl Normandeau.

Top Three Tips and Tricks

- **#1** Have twisty carrots? Ensure you have fluffy, soft soil for straight roots. With Calgary's soil commonly containing clay, add compost in the spring before planting, or try deep container growing, which is also great for beets!
- #2 Spinach seeding too quickly? A cool season crop, spinach bolts in warm weather. Plant early in the season to get a few harvests in before it gets too hot out, then plant another crop in late summer to reap the rewards in the fall. Also be on the look-out for "bolt-resistant" varieties or try orach or Swiss chard.

#3 Why is my leaf lettuce so bitter? Since this crop can be harvested so often, try and cut when the leaves are younger. Lettuce also requires regular moisture, so hot, dry weather, and under watering, can cause this taste. Try growing lettuce in the shade or in a movable container.

Back-to-School Safety Tips

A message from the Federation of Calgary Communities

The school year should be safe and educational for everyone – kids and parents should be aware of the following safety tips before the start of the semester.

Safety Tips for Your Child:

Make sure that your child knows the following:

- Their full name, age, address, area code, home phone number, and parents' work/cellphone number(s).
- How to contact police, fire, and EMS in an emergency (9-1-1) and in a non-emergency (403-266-1234).
- To use the same route to and from school.
- Where the safe places are to play (front and backyards, playgrounds).
- What places to avoid (vacant lots or dark, wooded, bushy areas).

If your child is being followed by a person or car, make sure that they know to do the following:

- Turn and run in the opposite direction;
- Get a description and licence plate number of the stranger's vehicle if possible;
- Run to the closest safe place; and,
- Stay in open areas that are visible.

Remember to tell them that uniformed police officers are friends who can be trusted.

The Stranger Rules

Familiarize your child with "the stranger rules." These rules will help keep them safe.

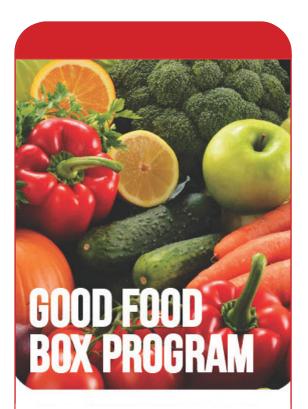
- Never talk to strangers.
- Never take anything from strangers.
- Never go anywhere with a stranger.
- Do not be fooled by tricks or phoney conversation.
- If a stranger tries to grab you, yell, scream, and kick.
- Never tell a stranger that you are by yourself or that your parents or guardian are not home.
- It's a good idea to implement a difficult to guess, but easy to remember, "code word" that an adult must share with your child before your child trusts/goes anywhere with them (e.g., the colour of their shirt, what they had for breakfast that morning, etc.).

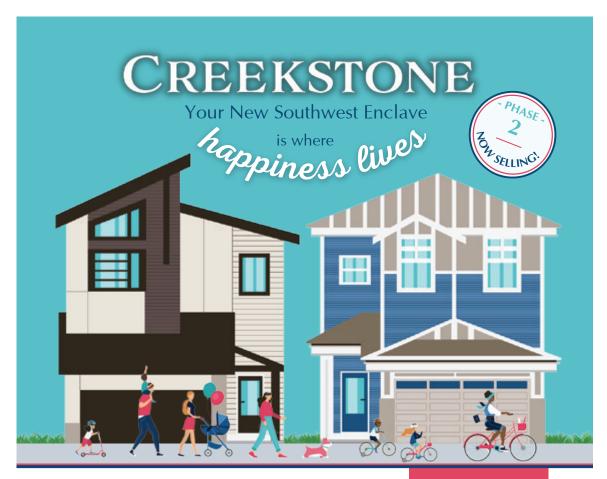

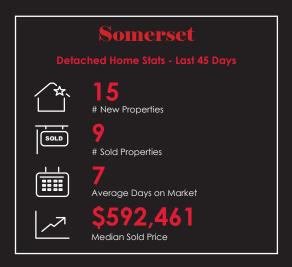
