Noble Victory – A Family's Autism Journey

It seems like only yesterday we were nervously sitting in various doctors' offices listening to the struggles and hardships that our son may face as he navigated his autism journey. As a mother, I didn't know how I would make it through. I didn't know anything about autism, and I felt scared, sad, and alone. I felt like I was in a dream, and I just needed to wake up to end all of my anguish, fear, and heartache. How could this be happening to me? To my son? To our family?

So began our journey, and we navigated life raising a child with autism. Although we faced many challenges, disappointments, and uncertainty along the way, we also began to see our son for the amazing person he is, and the unique perspective he brings to this world. By watching him struggle and work ten times harder than a neurotypical child, my anguish, fear, and heartache turned into acceptance, strength, and advocacy. He made me stronger than I ever thought I could be.

When we first received my son's autism diagnosis, we thought we would be the ones helping him navigate his spiritual journey. However, over time, we have discovered that he is the one who has, in fact, helped every member of our family navigate our spiritual journeys. He has taught us so much about individuals in our society who learn and think in different ways, and this has made us more compassionate, more empathic, and fierce advocates for autism.

His younger sister has learned from his example and, every year since grade one, she started raising awareness about autism by doing presentations in her class. My husband and I would also go into our son's class and speak to his classmates about autism, hoping to eliminate the fear and stigma that often surrounds an autism diagnosis. I began volunteering within our community, and started doing autism awareness presentations at malls, childcare facilities, and other businesses. As our passion continued to grow, so did our advocacy. My son inspired me to write my first book about our family's autism journey, which was published this year. I wanted to do anything and everything I could to inspire and help other families as they navigated

through their autism journeys. When our son was diagnosed with autism it became a dream of ours to one day create an autism foundation so we could continue to support those with autism.

Today that dream has come to fruition. We created our not-for-profit autism foundation this year, and we will use the royalties from my book to establish sustainable supports for those with autism. We hope this foundation will be carried on by our children, who will continue our dream of ensuring a supportive, equitable, and inclusive world for those with autism. One little boy with autism was the inspiration, the catalyst, and the creator of a family's legacy. He is a teacher and a mentor.

Was this where I expected to be when we began our autism journey? No, it is not; however, it is better than I ever imagined, and there is no other place I would rather be. Our journey has not been an easy one, but I would not change one moment of it. I am so thankful that our son has given us the strength to help and inspire others as they navigate their autism journeys. It is through this strength and inspiration that we can help other achieve their noble victories.



Transit Safety Strategy



On October 17, 2023, Council approved the Public Transit Safety Strategy.

This strategy includes:

- An integrated response between Calgary Police Service and Transit Peace Officers, who will be strategically stationed along the transit line, resulting in quicker response time to calls for service.
- An increase in the number of Transit Peace Officers on the transit system.
- Enhanced authorities for Transit Peace Officers to respond to safety incidents within a targeted response time.
- Coordinated dispatch of calls of services through Calgary 9-1-1.
- Improved station experiences for riders through standards of cleanliness and community engagement that focuses on building positive environments.
- Measures to ensure transit is used for its intended purpose of getting Calgarians where they need to
- Measures to help connect Calgarians experiencing vulnerabilities on and around the transit system to supportive resources.

Next steps:

- With the one-time operational budget of \$8.7 million that was approved by Council in June, we have already begun moving towards an integrated customer and safety service delivery model
- This fall, our evolution to a district model will further progress with the opening of a third transit safety hub at Whitehorn.

- While The Public Transit Safety Strategy have been approved, implementation is subject to Council approval of the attached \$15 million budget during budget adjustments in November 2023.
- Administration will report to the Community Development Committee on progress made against the strategy.

WET WATER

We all know that water is wet (right?), but did you know that you can actually make water wetter, and that is exactly what firefighters do!? There is an agent these heroes add to water to create a higher evaporation temperature, which can reduce the time it takes to put out a fire by up to 30%!

Prevent Food Scraps from Freezing to your Green Cart!

Wet materials can tend to stick to the cart making it difficult to come out during pickup. In the winter, this can also lead to material freezing inside the cart. Follow these tips to prevent material from sticking inside the cart:

- Crumple up flyer sheets into balls and put them in the bottom of your green cart before putting in any food or yard waste. You can also use newspaper, paper bags, or soiled pizza boxes.
- Use the end of a broomstick to stir and loosen up the material in the bottom of the cart before pickup day.
- If the material is frozen inside, wait for warmer temperatures to thaw the material out. Place your cart in sunlight if possible and use a stick to loosen up the stuck items.

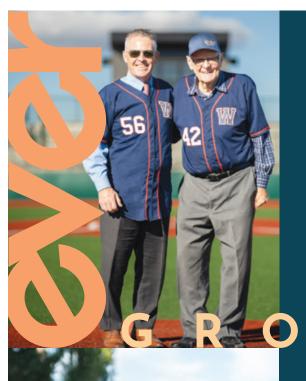
