PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

As we head into fall, I'm reflecting on a very busy summer of activities in Bridgeland. Despite the ongoing road and sidewalk construction, the good weather allowed people to enjoy our parks, playgrounds, and plazas. It was also a busy time at our Community Hall, with many events using the building and adjoining outdoor spaces. In addition to the weekly Farmers' Market, we hosted Stampede Breakfasts put on by the Own It Institute of Canada and the Eritrean community. Alberta Bass held its Summer Solstice Block Party in early July and the LGBTQ+ Chamber of Commerce put on a Pride Pop-Up Market in late August. The Eastern Slopes Music and Arts Festival brought fourteen bands and artists to the stage beside the Hall for a full day of music on August 31. Lovers of Italian cuisine and culture took part in the Taste of Italy Festival on September 8. As the weather cools, events such as the annual Beacon Original Art Show and Sale on October 19 and 20 and the Paper Story Exhibit and Installation on September 21 and 22 move into the hall.


In addition to these larger events, the Hall is rented by a variety of groups for regular events such as yoga and qi gong classes, Toastmasters meetings, and religious services. The Hall is considered to be a prime location for weddings, with the downtown skyline and Murdoch Park providing a beautiful backdrop. Birthday parties and other family celebrations also frequently take place at the hall.

Hall rentals are the primary source of revenue to fund the operations of the Bridgeland-Riverside Community Association. This revenue decreased significantly during the pandemic and was reduced to zero during the twelve months the Hall was closed following the November 2022 fire. Renters have returned following the Hall re-opening in November 2023, but we are still not back to pre-pandemic levels, with the resulting impact to overall BRCA revenue. The Hall is owned by the City of Calgary and is operated by the BRCA under a licence of occupation agreement that makes the BRCA responsible for all the operating costs, including wages, utilities, and facility maintenance and repair.

One way you can support the activities and programs put on by the BRCA is to consider renting the Hall for your next family or organization event. It is a great venue and its right here in our neighbourhood.

Tips For Using Your Green Cart This Fall

by the City of Calgary Waste and Recycling Services

- Yard waste like leaves, branches, grass, and plants can go directly inside the green cart.
- Always fill your green cart first, then fill paper yard waste bags. Roll tops of bags closed to prevent spills and allow your collector to pick up the bags.
- Place extra yard waste bags at least two feet to the side of your green cart for collection. Make sure you can lift the bag with one hand.
- Do not use plastic bags in your green cart.

Starting in November, the City will pick up your green cart once every other week. Weekly green cart collection will resume in the spring.



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It's Important to Commemorate "The General"

Last month we provided an update about the Calgary General Hospital (CGH) Commemoration Project. We highlighted activities we've undertaken to raise awareness about our project that will tell the decadeslong story of "the General".

In our 2+ years of meeting and planning for the CGH Commemoration Project we've had a lot of opportunity to talk to many people. For those who studied or worked at the hospital, there are many memories of collegial work relationships, stories about long hours, hard work, and a strong culture of caring. Former patients or family members voiced appreciation for the compassionate healthcare they received. And so many people have proudly announced that they were born at "the General", including the renowned actor, producer, director, singer, and writer Paul Gross, who is back in town at the time I write this article, to perform at Alberta Theatre Projects.

For these folks who knew "the General", there is no question that the plan to commemorate and tell the story of our long-standing city hospital is important, even essential. But what about the many Bridgelanders and Calgarians, who were born or arrived here after 1998, who know nothing about the hospital that was the heart of our community for many decades? Why should newcomers care about the CGH Commemoration project?

This project will showcase an important part of our history, in a beautiful setting, to benefit Calgarians. Looking at the setting, the large footprint of Murdoch Park is the actual location of the hospital and most of us would agree that life abounds in this lovely area. The wide sidewalk promenade is ideal for walking and saying hello to our neighbours, while the large

field provides opportunities for activities like soccer, basketball, volleyball, yoga, and in winter, tobogganing, and skating. Focused on the northwest corner of the park, the CGH Project is not only about commemoration but also an enhancement to the park that will create a meaningful sense of place. Incorporating the principles of crime prevention through environmental design (CPTED), a gazebo will provide shade and a place for people to gather for special occasions. Lighting will be improved and additional seating, in different configurations, will ensure visitors feel welcome to pause and engage with others. Some will take the opportunity to look at the interpretive plaques and learn about the important role the CGH played in health care service, as well as its contribution to our community and to Calgary as a whole.

Many will benefit. The school kids who frequent the park will learn about the hospital's historic presence and how health care has evolved in Calgary over the years. Former staff and patients will be drawn back to Bridgeland and will be reminded of their important time spent at the hospital. Hopefully this will enable some degree of emotional closure to the very difficult ending of the hospital. Our community is near the downtown core and close enough for tourists to seek out the commemoration of the city's earliest and largest hospital. Local business will see more foot traffic as visitors explore the area. The city and all Calgarians will benefit because the Commemoration Project will tell the story of the hospital that has not been told and which is at risk of being forgotten as the years pass. The Calgary General Hospital Commemoration is a valueadd project which will enhance not only Murdoch Park but also the reputation of Calgary.

We're continuing with our information sessions throughout the fall (see poster). If you haven't attended already, please join us to learn more about the history of the hospital and the Commemoration Project and to get your questions answered. Stay tuned for more stories about "the General" in upcoming editions of *Bridges*.

Halloween Safety

The members of Calgary's Partners for Safety: Calgary's Child Magazine, AHS EMS, Calgary Police, Fire, 9-1-1, Bylaw, and Transit would like to remind parents and trick-or-treaters of some Halloween safety tips as October 31 approaches. Partners for Safety vehicles will be out patrolling communities on Halloween night to provide a visible safety resource for parents and trick-or-treaters.

Trick-or-Treaters

- Remember: All regular pedestrian rules still apply. Be sure to cross the road at marked crosswalks, or well-lit corners only. It is safest to work your way up one side of the street, and then cross once to the other side.
- Avoid houses that are not well lit. Do not accept rides from strangers or enter any home you feel is unsafe.
- Let your parents know where you are going to be at all times (route) and advise them if you will be late returning.

Parents

- Be certain that young trick-or-treaters are accompanied by an adult. Older children should stay in groups.
- Pre-determine boundaries to trick-or-treat within and establish a firm time to return home.

 Advise children not to eat anything until they return home. Dispose of any items that appear to have been tampered with, or that are not properly wrapped.


Costumes

- Choose bright coloured costumes that are highly visible. Adding reflective tape to costumes further increases visibility.
- Consider sending your children with a flashlight for additional safety and increased visibility.
- When purchasing or making costumes, look for materials and accessories that are labeled flame-resistant.
- All costume accessories, such as sticks, rods, or wands, should be soft and flexible, with no sharp edges.
- Consider using hypoallergenic make-up kits instead of masks that may impair breathing, or vision.
- Be sure costumes are loose enough to be worn over warm clothing, but not so long that they become a tripping hazard. Costumes shuld not be longer than your child's ankles.
- Ensure your child is wearing adequate footwear that takes into consideration weather conditions and walking.
