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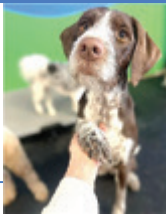

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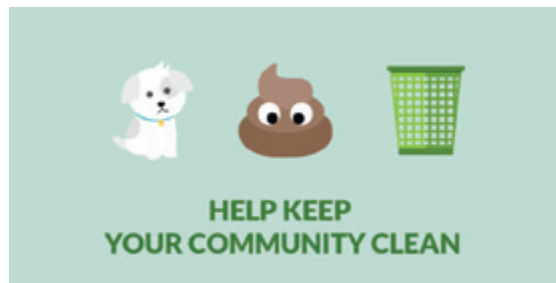
PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Emergency Preparedness in Bridgeland-Riverside—Be Ready Before You Need To

After one of the wettest starts to June on record, surpassing our average monthly rainfall within the first few days, many of us were keeping a close eye on the weather forecast! While the rain may have dampened a few spirits, it's also a good reminder that emergencies such as floods, wildfires, and severe storms can happen when we least expect them. The good news? Emergency preparedness doesn't have to be overwhelming; it starts with a simple plan. Here are some tips to help you build one.

First, identify your main evacuation route, as well as alternate routes in case roads or pathways are blocked. Choose meeting locations where family members can reconnect if needed and make sure everyone knows the plan. Consider the unique needs of everyone in your household, including children, seniors, pets, service animals, and anyone with mobility or medical requirements; assign responsibilities ahead of time such as who grabs the emergency kit, who checks on pets, and who ensures utilities are turned off if needed.

The next step is building a 72-hour grab-and-go emergency kit. A well-stocked kit should include:

- Enough water (two to four litres per person, per day),
- Non-perishable food,
- A manual can opener,
- Medications and copies of prescriptions,
- Personal hygiene items,
- A first-aid kit,
- Flashlight, batteries, whistle, power bank and charging cables,
- An emergency blanket,
- Cash in small bills,
- And season-appropriate clothing.

Be sure to include copies of important documents such as identification, insurance information, and emergency contacts in a waterproof pouch. Don't forget about your four-legged family members either. Pack food, medications, and other essential pet supplies. Store your kit somewhere easy to access and replace expired

items, refresh supplies, and make sure it still meets your household's needs every six months. Consider keeping a separate emergency kit in your vehicle during the winter months, stocked with warm clothing, a shovel, traction aids, extra water, and high-energy snacks.

An evacuation alert means it's time to get ready to leave, while an evacuation order means it's time to go immediately and by the routes identified by emergency officials. Take time to learn about hazards that could affect our area and sign up for municipal emergency alerts. Prepared families also help build a more resilient community. By checking in on neighbours, sharing information, and helping support vulnerable residents, we can all play a role in keeping Bridgeland-Riverside safe when the unexpected happens. After all, emergency preparedness isn't just about looking after ourselves. It's about looking after each other, too.

Plaque to the Future: The Park Plaques Have Arrived!

As many of you know, we have been working on the completion of plaques for our newly named neighbourhood parks. You'll recall that after City Council approved the names for eight parks in 2023, we had designed and installed a plaque recognizing Normie Kwong, a prominent football player and Albertan who was born and grew up in Riverside. The park was formerly known as the 9A Street Park. We had a lovely celebratory event with Normie Kwong's family, friends, and Bridgeland-Riverside residents in October 2024.

Since then, we have received donations from the Bridgeland Business Improvement Association, the Calgary Italian Cultural Centre, and a private individual, as well as the Inspiring Neighbourhoods Grant. This funding has enabled us to work on designs over the past winter for plaques in six more parks, and we have recently heard that the completed plaques have arrived.

We are now liaising with the City of Calgary Parks Department to arrange installation of the posts and plaques in the near future, and we are planning some events, yet to be finalized. We look forward to celebrating the completion of the Park Plaque Project, acknowledging the significance of each of the park names, as well as the people and stories they represent.

This is exciting for our Beautification Committee, and we think you'll be pleased with the new colourful plaques that will soon be beautifying our parks.

Stay tuned for updates about the events on the BRCA website, social media, and emails to BRCA members, and plan to come out and celebrate with us.

Summer and Our Trees

On our hot summer days, our trees get thirsty too! Trees less than three years old need 30 minutes of water once a week, on just a trickle. Trees older than three years need water every two weeks for 30 minutes, on just a trickle.

Putting mulch around a tree will help to retain moisture. The mulch should be 8 to 10 cm deep, forming a doughnut around your tree. Spread it out as wide as possible and be sure to keep mulch 10 cm away from the tree trunk.

Trees should only be pruned in summer if a branch is broken or if the tree is diseased. Elm trees should not be pruned in summer at all. Legally, Elm trees cannot be trimmed April 1 to September 30. This is to prevent the spread of Dutch Elm Disease.

Accidental Poisoning

Emergency Health Services (EHS) paramedics would like to remind parents and caregivers of precautions they can take to help prevent accidental childhood poisonings around the home. Ingesting prescription or over-the-counter medication is a frequent cause of accidental childhood poisonings. Other causes include ingesting or contact with household items such as dishwasher/laundry tablets, mouthwash, chemicals such as paints/solvents, cleaning products, and button batteries.

Storage

- Place all medications in locked containers and store in an area inaccessible to children.
- For easy identification, store all medications in their original packaging; do not mix multiple medications in a single bottle.
- Install child locks on all cabinets, or drawers where medications and button batteries are kept.

Safety tips

- Child-resistant medication bottles are not necessarily child-proof. They can still be opened by a child.
- Take extra precautions with medicines designed to appeal to children such as chewable vitamins or flavoured cough and cold syrups.
- Promptly dispose of any medications or toxic household products no longer in use.

Prevention

- Store household products, cleaning supplies, and cosmetics in locked cabinets or drawers.
- Install child latches on cabinets children might also access by climbing on counters or chairs.
- Label all plants in and around your home and garden.
- Antifreeze, windshield washer fluid, and pesticides are extremely poisonous. Even a small amount can cause serious illness if ingested.

In Case of a Poisoning Emergency, Call 9-1-1

Provide the name of the product ingested and, if it is safe to do so, a sample of the substance for EHS paramedics to inspect on their arrival.

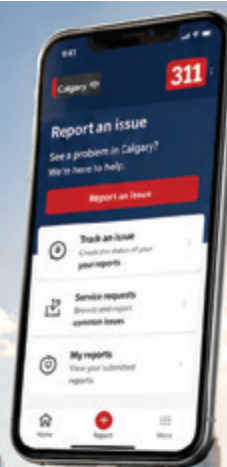
