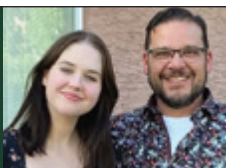

Our BRCA Farmers' Market accepts and approves applications from vendors and food trucks and brings in musicians and other entertainers to create a lively atmosphere. Farmers' Market volunteers set up and take down the tents and tables, and if you have a couple of hours to spare on a Thursday afternoon/evening, feel free to contact the Market committee at bridgelandfm.ca.

Also in this issue are details of our Pub Night, scheduled for July 23 at the Hall. You will be able to cap off your visit to the Farmers' Market by sharing a cold beverage with your neighbours. I hope to see you there.

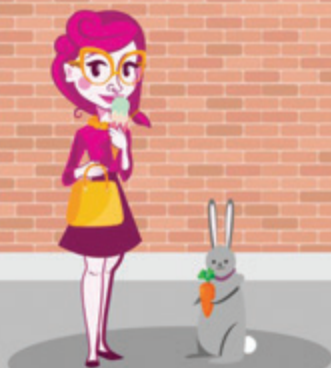

Cigarette Butt Recycling Project Update

The BRCA Beautification Committee started a cigarette butt recycling pilot project in July 2024. Ten collection boxes are at “hot spots” and in parks south of First Avenue (see photo below). The cigarette butts are shipped to the TerraCycle facility in Ontario, where the filters are processed into plastic timbers to make park benches and picnic tables.

Recycling cigarette butts keeps our local environment clean and green. To date, we have recycled approximately 80,000 cigarette butts, and we are part of the Canada-wide Unsmoke campaign to recycle one million cigarette butts annually see: <https://www.agreenerfuture.ca/the-butt-blitz>.

We are encouraged by positive feedback from smokers who use the boxes. We shared our know-how with projects in Crescent Heights, Chinatown, and Hillhurst-Sunnyside communities.

Our project is moving forward in 2026 with additional collection boxes in recently identified hot spots and moving boxes on park benches to more secure installation on standalone posts. These improvements are happening with support from Calgary Parks and Mobility Departments, and generous financial support of Bridgeland businesses through the Business Improvement Association (BIA).

Enjoying Our Parks Safely

Tips for a Safe and Enjoyable Experience in Your Bridgeland/Riverside Community Parks

Our community parks are wonderful spaces to relax, play, and connect with neighbours. A little awareness and consideration go a long way toward keeping them safe and enjoyable for everyone. Here are some helpful tips to keep in mind on your next visit.

Watch Your Belongings

Parks are busy, and unfortunately, opportunistic theft can happen. A few simple habits can protect your valuables:

- Keep bags, backpacks, and personal items within sight always.
- Avoid leaving phones, wallets, or keys unattended on benches or picnic tables.
- If you bring valuables, consider leaving them in your car — out of sight — or better yet, at home.

Keep a Close Eye on Young Children

Parks are exciting places for little ones, but it's important to stay attentive:

- Never leave young children unattended, even for a few minutes.
- Establish a clear meeting spot in case you get separated.
- Stay especially alert near water features, climbing equipment, or busy pathways.

Dogs on Leash, Always

We love our four-legged park visitors! To keep both dogs and people safe and happy:

- Always keep your dogs on a leash, unless you are in a designated off-leash area.
- Always clean up after your dog. It causes significant risk to public health, and the City of Calgary imposes a fine of up to \$500 for failing to pick up dog waste.
- Be mindful of others who may be nervous around dogs.
- Make sure your dog is up to date on vaccinations and is well-socialized before visiting busy parks.

Lock Up Your Bike

Bicycle theft is one of the most common park-related crimes. Protect your ride:

- Always use a sturdy U-lock or heavy-duty chain lock, not just a cable lock.
- Lock your bike to a designated bike rack, not to fences or trees.
- If possible, lock both the frame and the front wheel.
- Consider registering your bike with bikeindex.org so it can be returned if recovered.

Respect the Space and Each Other

- Dispose of litter in the proper bins.
- Keep noise levels considerate of other park users and nearby residents.
- Be welcoming and inclusive. Our parks are for everyone in the community.
- Report any suspicious activity to non-emergency police services.

Use the 3-1-1 App to Report Issues

Spotted something that needs attention? The City's 3-1-1 App makes it quick and easy to report non-emergency issues directly to the right department:

- Overflowing or full litter bins.
- Graffiti or vandalism on park structures (such as the example on the next page, found at Normie Kwan Park).
- Damaged playground equipment or broken benches.
- Overgrown vegetation blocking pathways.
- Burnt-out lights in evening-use areas.

Simply open the 3-1-1 App, select a category, add a photo if you can, and drop a pin on the map. Your report goes straight to City staff.

The more eyes we have on our parks, the better we can maintain them. Together, we can make our parks safe, clean, and welcoming for the whole community. See you outside!

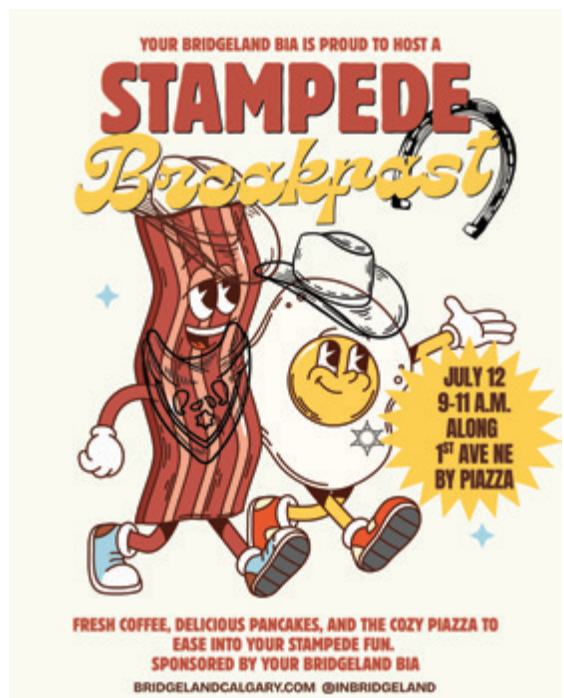

Birds and Trees of Bridgeland

Did you know that over 350 birds live or migrate through Calgary each year? Of that number, 100 to 130 different bird species make Calgary their home to breed and raise their young. Could you imagine what it would be like if they weren't here to serenade us with their songs, to eat the thousands of insects daily, or to pollinate our food supply and beautiful flowers?

Thankfully, the City of Calgary and communities throughout Calgary are focused on planting thousands of trees each year to increase our urban canopy from 8% to 16%. Not only do trees create habitats for birds and other wildlife, but they also improve our biodiversity and reduce the heat island effect, which occurs in areas such as our community of Bridgeland-Riverside. One tree can clean the air, providing oxygen for four people per day, and help cool pedestrian-level temperatures up to 12 degrees Celsius.

Planting native trees in your own yard will bring you and your home not just beauty, but also shelter from the elements, potentially reducing energy costs. Trees have even been shown to increase property values!

The City of Calgary has a lot of information on the right tree for the right place to meet your needs and for your tree(s) to thrive. You can see some of these trees throughout Bridgeland-Riverside. Take a walk, notice our views, listen to the birds, and enjoy our neighbourhood! Oh, and also remember to protect our trees by training your dog to pee on a post, which helps save our trees.

If you see an injured or dead city tree, please call 3-1-1 or use the city's 3-1-1 app to report it.

- Great Horned Owls
- Red-tailed hawk
- Cooper's hawk
- Mallard
- Killdeer
- Canada geese (who disperse seeds and enrich our wetlands)

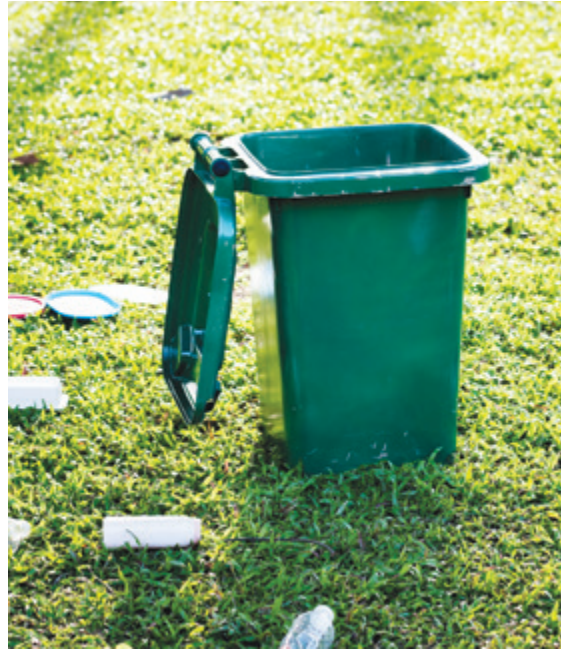

Green Bins Are for Food Scraps and Yard Waste

Food scraps belong in the green cart, but packaging does not. Plastic does not compost and can break into small pieces during processing, which can contaminate the finished compost. All food scraps must be separated from packaging before composting, even if the packaging says it is biodegradable or compostable.

A few simple habits can make a big difference:

- Remove all plastic before putting food scraps in the green bin.
- Empty and clean plastic, glass, and metal containers go in the blue cart.
- Plastic wraps, foam, and other non-compostable packaging belong in the black cart.

Putting food scraps in the green cart and packaging in the right bin helps keep compost clean. If you are not sure where an item goes, visit <https://www.calgary.ca/waste/what-goes-where/default.html>.
