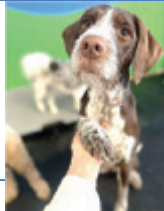

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I hope you are enjoying the heart of the summer of 2026! Early summer was a busy time with a successful Neighbour Day at the hall in June. In July, there was the Stampede Breakfast held jointly with Tuxedo Park and Mount Pleasant Community Associations at Our House restaurant. A big thank you to all of the members who volunteered to make these events great successes!

The next event on the calendar is the Community Cleanup that will be held in the WHMCA Hall parking lot on Saturday, September 5. Bring out your large and small items for the landfill or recycling. Metal objects and electronics will be given special treatment. If you would like to volunteer or need more information, please see the article in this newsletter or email events@winstonheights.ca.

On the projects side, there has been some success with funding initiatives in the past month. The Federation of Calgary Communities has indicated that the Urban Hen Project is eligible to receive a Good Places grant. Please congratulate Jile Meyn for his work to get this grant. This is in addition to a generous community donation of \$4,500 has been pledged in memory of Robin Swiderski, a local resident and backyard chicken keeper who passed away earlier this year. If you are interested in this project, please visit winstonheights.ca/chickens/.

The other project that is ongoing is the Kitchen Renovation. The WHMCA has been working with the City of Calgary and its architects and engineers over the past five years to design a renewed kitchen in the main building. Since this is a very large project which includes electrical, air makeup, plumbing, wheelchair access, and cabinetry upgrades, grants are being pursued with the Province of Alberta and the City of Calgary. In 2025, we submitted an expression of interest to the Alberta Community Facility Enhancement Program Large grant program but were rejected. A new expression of interest was submitted this May which was accepted. A full application was submitted in July, and we will find out if we are successful or not in December. Many, many thanks are due to Jile Meyn, Marcia Xavier, Suzanne Mott, Ben McKenzie, Jeffrey Haussecker, and Tyler Ellis for their work on this project, which at times has been quite intensive. Updates from the City

Rain barrel rebates for \$50 are still available for Calgarians. Keep your lawn watered this summer and save on your water bill by visiting calgary.ca/yardsmart.

Engagement on the City's urban forest strategic plan is ongoing, with interested Winston Heights-Mountview neighbours able to sign up to participate in that engagement process at engage.calgary.ca/UrbanForestPlan. Pop-up events will also be held across Calgary starting on June 9.

Big Chicken Coop News: We're Building This Year!



We have some very exciting news to share: the WHMCA Community Chicken Coop Pilot has received \$15,000 through the Good Places project, supported by the Federation of Calgary Communities and the City of Calgary.

This is a huge step forward for the project!

While this funding is less than what we had hoped for through the larger climate grant stream, it is enough, combined with the incredible donations we have already received from community members, to move the project into the build phase this year, assuming there are no major delays with City permitting.

This grant success was made possible because of the strong support behind the project. Community donations helped show that this was not just an idea on paper, but something residents genuinely believe in and are willing to help bring to life. That made a real difference.

Over the past few weeks, we have also signed the contract for the architectural and engineering work. These plans are the next major step, as they will allow us to properly define the build, submit through the City permitting process, and confirm the final construction pathway.

Once the plans are complete, the project will move into City review. We have been advised that the permitting process may take approximately two to three months, so our timeline is still dependent on that approval process. That said, we are now in a much stronger position and are actively moving forward.

We gratefully acknowledge the support of the Federation of Calgary Communities and the City of Calgary through the Good Places project. Their support is helping bring this community-led pilot project to life.

And most of all, we want to acknowledge all of you.

Whether you donated, shared encouragement, asked thoughtful questions, offered ideas, signed up to help, or simply cheered this strange and wonderful little project along, your support mattered. It helped make this grant application stronger, and it continues to make this project possible.

This coop is not being built by one person, one grant, or one donation. It is being built by a community that saw value in local food, education, sustainability, animal welfare, and creating something a little bit magical together.

More updates will be shared as the architectural plans are finalized and we move through the City permitting process.

ENMAX Central Calgary Transmission Line Update

ENMAX has presented eight different route options for the Central Calgary Transmission Line.

More than 100 residents attended the two ENMAX open houses in early June to provide initial feedback. The online survey was open from June 2 to July 15.

Community and City Alignment

The Winston Heights-Mountview Community Association (WHMCA) maintains that Option Eight on the survey is the only viable route. There is significant institutional alignment on this position:

- The City of Calgary Real Estate and Development Services supports burying the line.
- City Parks and Open Spaces oppose overhead transmission lines through parks and residential areas.
- Councillor DJ Kelly is firmly opposed to overhead transmission lines.
- Alpha Built, the developer for two parcels in Midfield Heights, is opposed to overhead lines and is retaining legal counsel to act as an intervenor.

Further Updates

Our previous lawyer, Gavin Fitch, has moved from McLennan Ross to Cassels. He has agreed to represent WHMCA again under the same terms if we decide to act as intervenors in the next round of Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC) hearings.

Additionally, long-time community volunteer and returning resident Linda Sharp has connected with the property managers at The Munro (the rental complex above the Co-op). They have agreed to let Linda host upcoming information sessions on-site for residents.

Next Steps

In the early fall, ENMAX will review all stakeholder feedback to finalize the routes for its AUC application.

Once finalized, they will circulate these options to stakeholders, though the scope of further community feedback remains unclear.

Later in the fall, ENMAX will formally submit its application to the AUC. Depending on the route options they choose, WHMCA will make a final decision on whether to officially step in as legal intervenors.

Deerfoot Trail Improvements: 16 Avenue NE Bridge Rehabilitation

In July, the Alberta Transportation and Economic Corridors (TEC) and their contractor, Everest Construction, began bridge rehabilitation on the westbound lanes of the 16 Avenue NE overpass crossing Deerfoot Trail. This impacts 16 Avenue westbound and north and southbound Deerfoot Trail traffic.

Construction will be completed in multiple stages, with project completion expected in November 2026.

Construction Impacts

Drivers may experience significant delays on 16 Avenue westbound, and various other construction impacts like dust, noise, and vibrations.

Traffic patterns will be modified throughout the various stages of construction. Please follow on-site signage.

16 Avenue NE Daytime and Nighttime Lane Closures

The rehabilitation will include daytime and night time work, with the speed limit reduced to 50 km/h in the work zone on 16 Avenue NE. Multiple Lane closures on westbound 16 Avenue NE were scheduled to start late July and a minimum of two lanes of traffic will always be maintained.

- Saturdays, 9:00 pm to 8:00 am
- Sundays, 9:00 pm to 5:00 am

Deerfoot Trail Nighttime Single and Double Lane Closures

Double lane closures under the 16 Avenue NE bridge will occur on Deerfoot Trail northbound and southbound lanes on various dates and during non-peak evening hours with the speed limit reduced to 80 km/h in the work zone on Deerfoot Trail.

- Mondays to Thursdays, 11:00 pm to 5:00 am
- Fridays, 11:00 pm to 6:00 am
- Saturdays, 11:00 pm to 8:00 am
- Single-lane closures on Deerfoot Trail northbound and southbound lanes will occur seven days per week from 9:00 to 11:00 pm.
