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Proposed Updates to Your Local Area Plan

City Council directed City Administration to update six of the approved local area plans (LAPs) to limit where rowhouses and townhouses can be developed

The proposed updates would apply the same location-based Limited Scale Policies in the Westbrook Communities and Heritage Communities LAPs to the rest of the approved LAPs.

What are the proposed changes?

The proposed updates would limit where rowhouses and townhouses are supported to parcels that have a rear lane and meet one of the following location criteria:

- within a transit station area,
- along or adjacent to an identified main street,
- on a corner parcel,
- or adjacent to a school, park or open space.

Community Updates: ENMAX Project and Legal Representation

We have a couple of important updates to keep everyone in the loop regarding the ENMAX Central Calgary transmission line project and our community's advocacy efforts.

ENMAX Routing and Siting Status

We received an update from ENMAX regarding the progress of their routing and siting process. They shared the following statement:

"We are still working through routing and siting activities and the decision-making process, and currently forecasting route selection(s) to be available to the public in October."

What's Next

ENMAX is tentatively planning to share these route options at a series of open houses in early November. All project details and documents remain available on the ENMAX Project Website.

Legal Representation Secured

WHMCA has officially signed an engagement letter with Cassels Brock and Blackwell LLP. If we choose to act as intervenors at the next Alberta Utilities Commission (AUC) hearings, Gavin Fitch will represent us under the same terms as before. To support this potential legal action, our community-funded \$15,000 contingency fund has been securely transferred to the firm.

Thank you to everyone who contributed to the fund and continues to help protect our neighborhood.



Volunteer Spotlight: Lindsey Snyder

This month, we're shining the spotlight on Lindsey Snyder, who has been volunteering with the Winston Heights–Mountview Community Association since around 2018.



What first brought Lindsey through the doors? A Santa Breakfast—and as she puts it, “the Mimosas and Baileys.” She remembers looking around and thinking, “These are my people.”

The 2026 WHM Community Cleanup is over for another year. While community members certainly removed a lot of junk from their basements, backyards, garages, and alleys, this year's event was a little quieter than usual. Was it because of the dreary weather, was it because our cleanup fell on a long weekend? Was it because we all still miss Ben? Who knows! The good news is that those who came to drop off trash did not have to wait in a long line, and our lovely volunteers had lots of time to catch up with each other.

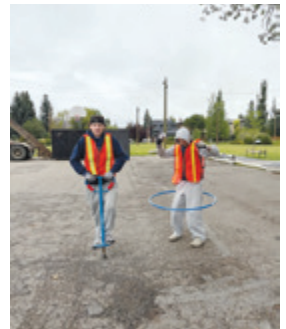
In the morning, when we did have a lineup of cars, Heather, our new Hall Manager, did a fantastic job of pre-screening drivers for hazardous or otherwise unacceptable items. She also had the brilliant idea of encouraging those with small loads or single items to drop off on the lawn in front of the hall then exit the line. The Cowboys Football Team were not always busy with the bottle drive, so they also helped unload cars at different stations. They very generously pitched in whenever and wherever their help was required, whether it was giving others a break, helping to unload at the metal station, or doing lawn pickups. And they all waited very politely for their turn on the pogo stick.



We are grateful to many people for making it a great day, including our own crew of volunteers, along with the staff from Wins, Techno Trash, Alcop, and the City of Calgary. We are also grateful to Josh MacDonald and members of Calgary Rakushinkan, who came out to volunteer with us for the first time.

We would like to offer an honorable mention to Janet Hughes who had to sit out last year's cleanup, but who was back for 2026 with a passion to keep traffic moving safely, and to Gabrielle and Derek for their very dedicated efforts. Not only did they have our breakroom and equipment lined up by 7:30 am, but they both worked all day as unloaders and were the last two to wave us off at the end of a fun day.

Munro Park Is Getting a New Look

There is plenty happening at Munro Park, and while the park may look a little different during construction, the changes taking shape will create a welcoming new space for the Winston Heights–Mountview community.

The City of Calgary is investing approximately \$6 million in improvements to Munro Park, with construction underway through fall 2026. The overall concept is “Urban Rewilding”, which reflects the community’s preference for native gardens and natural spaces.

Many of the features’ residents already enjoy will remain, including the walking loop, open playfield, mature trees, and fitness equipment. The upgrades will also bring several new features, including:

- A new Nature Kids’ Play Zone
- A 3-on-3 basketball court
- A community plaza and gathering spaces
- Additional seating, bike racks and a water fountain
- A naturalized garden perimeter
- Bioretention (rain) gardens to help manage and filter stormwater
- Many new trees and a new irrigation system

The project will also give new life to pieces of Calgary history. Public art that was previously located at Olympic Plaza, including the Centennial Grove installation and colourful Richardson ground squirrel sculptures, has been relocated to Munro Park.

One of the most noticeable changes will be the addition of naturalized areas throughout the park. Rather than maintaining every area as traditional lawn, the new design incorporates native plants, pollinator gardens and tree groves.

According to the City’s August 2026 update, construction is progressing steadily. Hardscape work in the plaza has been completed, and the public art installation is now in place. Playground equipment is being installed, boulder walls have been completed in the stormwater-management areas, and preparation for the future pathways and basketball court is underway.

The park remains closed to the public during construction, with reopening anticipated following completion in fall 2026. Construction hours are generally Monday to Friday from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm, with occasional Saturday work if required.

This project is a key part of our efforts to improve safety, fairness and the ease of getting around, for everyone.
