Dear Brentwoodians,

Finding Hope in Tragedy

Like many Calgarians, my family received with great sadness the news of the death of 11-year-old Parker. Having lost our oldest son to illness seven years ago, we understand some of the grief felt by his family, and we hope that they are able to find the comfort and support they need at this time and in the weeks, months, and years to come.

It is hard to find a silver lining in a situation like this, but it was heartwarming to see how many Calgarians were touched by the story and volunteered to take part in the search or put up signs in hopes of finding him. In an age where it often feels like corporations and interest groups seek to divide people in order to promote various political or financial goals, it was wonderful to see so many come together in the hope of helping a child. Hopefully part of Parker's legacy can be this reminder that as a community we are better when we are united in a common effort to help one another.

The Shady Side of The Street

It is amazing how a simple patch of shade can offer respite and relief on a scorching day, and increasingly hot summer weather offers a reminder of the importance of trees in keeping ourselves, our pets, and our homes a bit cooler. How many of us have crossed the road to walk in the shade, or even planned our route to avoid treeless streets when the thermometer climbs above 30°? In this issue, Melanie Swailes offers some insight into the rules around tree cover in our neighbourhoods, and the importance of preserving the mature trees that make up our urban canopy.

We are very fortunate in Brentwood to enjoy as much tree cover as we have: there are many areas of Calgary which are virtually devoid of this benefit and unfortunately maps showing more or less tree cover match closely with maps of high vs. low-income neighbourhoods. In addition to the challenges of growing trees in the prairie, part of the issue lies with the way that newer neighbourhoods were designed. If alleyways are eliminated in order to increase housing density in an area, then utility lines all must come in from the front, leaving less area to plant trees. Front

driveways also take up potential growing space. Finally, efforts to build quickly and cheaply lead to a lack of care and effort in fostering tree growth (see www.cbc.ca/newsinteractives/features/calgary-city-of-haves-and-have-nots-when-it-comes-to-trees).

While people in many parts of our city look on Brentwood's canopy with envy and try to plan ways to increase their own, we should take care to enjoy and preserve what we have.

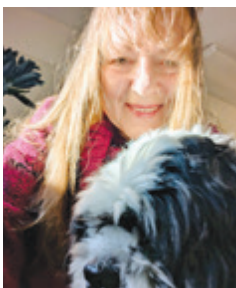
Brentwood welcomes relative newcomer Carole Emes.

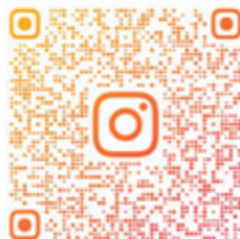

In Praise of Trees

“Suburbia is where the developer bulldozes out the trees then names the streets after them.” - Bill Vaughan

In the heat of the past summer, how many times did you walk, play, or rest in the shade of a large tree? How much difference did a large shade tree make to keeping you or your home cool? On one especially hot day, as I walked along Northmount Drive and then along Brentwood Boulevard, I was grateful for the shade the heavy tree canopy provided (American Elms along Northmount Drive and Green Ash along Brentwood Blvd). Some of those very trees are now threatened by new developments.

Most of those trees are “City” trees, which were planted by the developer or the City many decades ago, usually on the public portion of a property or on a boulevard. Trees are a “public tree” if they are on the right-of-way or easement section of a private property. For example, the strip of land right next to the sidewalk may require that legal access be given for workers accessing utilities, making this the “public” portion of a property. Is a tree on your property a “City” tree or a private tree?

Check the City tree map (www.calgary.ca/parks/trees/city-owned.html), which shows every public tree in Calgary, including the location, a description of the tree, its size, and its value. Calgary has approximately 7 million trees, located on both public and private lands, in parks, natural areas, and green spaces. Approximately 75% of Calgary’s trees are located on private properties.

The Tree Protection Bylaw (23M2002) recognizes that “trees play a vital role in keeping Calgary healthy and liveable. By protecting and caring for public trees and helping Calgarians plant and look after trees on their own properties, we’re building a stronger tree canopy that cools our neighbourhoods, cleans our air, supports local wildlife, and contributes to a more resilient city for future generations.”

The Calgary bylaws do not apply to private trees: property owners have the right to remove (or plant) trees in their yards. There may be many reasons for removing a tree: poor health or disease, outgrowing the space in which they are planted, or interfering with the intended usage of the yard such as planting a new vegetable garden or building a garage.

Based on the many development permits we have reviewed, the biggest threat to our mature tree canopy lies not in property owners who cut down a tree or two, but rather in new developments which remove every single tree and shrub on a property, usually leaving little room left over for future large trees. For existing houses in Brentwood, on average 34% of the lot is covered by buildings, leaving space for the large trees, especially spruce and fir, which are so prevalent in our area. Compare that to R-CG zoning (a 4-plex plus 4 suites) which can now have 55% lot coverage, plus the required spaces for garbage and recycle bins, bike storage, four sets of window wells, four sets of external stairs, four sets of sidewalks, etc. On one application, adding up all the required components totalled 86% of the lot area, leaving only 14% for landscaping.

There is a requirement to plant trees on R-CG applications: the Land Use Bylaw requires, “a minimum of 1.0 tree and 3.0 shrubs must be provided for each 110.0 square meters of parcel area.” However, the trees which are planted are usually thin and columnar, often planted within a narrow space or within the shade of a 10-metre (33 foot) dwelling, making them unlikely to thrive long-term. All of our new multi-unit DP applications will have multiple air conditioners, but no large trees to provide shade or relief from summer heat.

A further challenge we have noted on recent applications is that new R-CG buildings can be just three metres from the sidewalk. Along Brentwood Blvd, the trees have a canopy of up to 17 metres (as measured by

an arborist), creating a conflict between the proposed building and the survivability of the tree(s). A Tree Protection Plan is required when construction is near an existing tree, but this does not ensure that roots will not be severed and the tree canopy so drastically pruned back as to severely damage or even kill the tree. Quite simply, it is impossible for a three-metre front setback to be feasible when the existing trees have a diameter which is four or five times that size. It is also extremely unlikely that spruce or fir trees will be planted in small or narrow spaces, yet those are the trees which characterize much of Brentwood, while also providing winter interest, bird habitats, stormwater retention, and many other benefits.

When you stand on Nose Hill in the summer, you can barely see Brentwood houses because of all the trees. We should not take this for granted. Calgary's tree canopy coverage is 9.62% as measured in 2024. This includes trees planted on both public and private property. The City is working to grow and expand our tree canopy coverage to 16% (www.calgary.ca/parks/trees.html).

What to do? First, public trees should be retained. For any development the trees should be a starting point or a constraint on the lot, not just an obstacle to construction. As a community, we can emphasize that we value those trees and will oppose cutting them down. The front setback Bylaws in communities like ours should address the issue of public trees; the three-metre bylaw is not compatible with our tree-lined streets. If the City is serious about increasing the tree canopy coverage, then the bylaws need to reflect that. Maybe developers should pay into a fund so that trees could at least be replaced elsewhere in the area. Why couldn't we plant some trees along the edges of school fields or pathways? As Brentwoodians, we need your feedback and support: if there is an application for a development near you, please review the tree plans and let us know what you think. Thank you.

News from the Friends of Nose Hill

A Nose Hill supporter told me there used to be a plaque in memory of John Lee Laurie at the Brisebois parking lot entrance to Nose Hill Park (Many Owls parking area). It appears that the plaque has now gone missing. He said, "Do you happen to know what happened to it and whether there are any plans for it to be reinstalled in the future?" I responded that my city contact would ask our Infrastructure folks to see if they knew.

A colleague did walk over to read the plaque once, but that was many years ago. It spoke of the help Laurie gave to First Nations. The official name of Mount Yamnuska is Mount John Laurie, but he has no knowledge of the installation of the plaque. When I chaired the Nose Hill Park Management Advisory Committee, the John Laurie Rock Society obtained the City's permission to install the boulder that was moved during construction of the roadway.

John Lee Laurie (1899-1959) was a prominent educator and political activist in Calgary, best known for First Nations advocacy. From 1944 to 1956, he was the honorary secretary of the Indian Association of Alberta. When adopted by the Stoney Nakoda Nations, he was named "White Cloud" and recognized by having a major Calgary roadway and a Canadian Rockies peak named after him. Mount Yamnuska was officially renamed at the request of the Stoney Nakoda First Nation in 1961. Its original Stoney Nakoda name, Îyâmnathka, combines root words of "mountain" and "flat", so "flat-faced mountain". In 1979, concerned citizens collected over 5,000 signatures on a petition and on the Sunday before Monday's Council meeting, marched along John Laurie Blvd in defence of Nose Hill Park. City Council voted against any development rezoning of Nose Hill Park lands.

Hey, neighbour!

While this September promises a few more great weeks of weather, it also means kids going back to school. Over the summer my office has heard from many parents who are concerned about the safety of their children. They want safe routes to school, with more crosswalks and safe ways to cross roads along those routes.

This September I plan on bringing forward a notice of motion before council to introduce safer timing for pedestrian cross lights at intersections. This motion, if passed, will improve safety for pedestrians and provide more certainty for drivers by ensuring that there is less conflict for people crossing roads and turning through intersections. We know that distraction is frequently the cause for traffic collisions, and this motion will reduce conflict between pedestrians and vehicles using the same part of the road at the same time.

This is one way that I am working towards addressing the pedestrian danger crisis in our city, but it isn't the only way. I have been working with the City of Calgary's mobility department to improve safety on some of the most dangerous roads in Ward 4. I also co-sponsored a motion that would allow additional locations for rapid flashing beacons each year.

Though, we can do more, and I want your feedback on what my office can do to even further improve traffic safety. From new turning lights, pedestrian rapid flashing beacons, speed signs, speed bumps, or more, I want to hear from you about what makes sense to make your street safer.
