

It was a lively affair enjoyed by all. In addition, a Volunteer Appreciation night is planned for April 12 at Moose McGuires. As well as giving thanks to volunteers for their efforts over the last twelve months, we also encourage residents to attend who may wish to explore volunteering in the future in support of our community events. Beyond that we have plans to host our third annual Bicycle Day in May and have applied to the City with Rosemont for a Community Cleanup date in May or June. 
In our February issue we outlined a proposal to place a community identification sign in the park that is bounded by Cambrian and Northmount Drives. We are currently in the process of identifying a theme and ultimately some designs to consider. The Board feels that our community identifies as a mid-century modern inner City housing design with its park space and proximity to Confederation and Nose Hill Parks being our main attributes. If you have some theme related or design thoughts feel free to comment through email or phone call to any Board member.

With anticipated changes this year to zoning bylaws by City Council establishing a citywide R-CG designation, we will witness more multifamily housing construction in the future with the corresponding issues of increased density and street parking. This densification will be impacted by the removal of all parking restrictions on new developments and the permitting of both secondary suites and backyard suites on a single parcel of land. This program promises an easing to the housing crisis over time supported by a promise of Federal funding. We encourage individuals to follow developments on the City website (calgary.ca) as these bylaw amendments are promoted. A recent development by five City Councillors is a motion calling for a plebiscite on this issue of blanket re-zoning. The last chance to file comments on this issue will be a public hearing with City Council April 22. Cambrian Heights has joined a number of Calgary communities in submitting a letter outlining our opposition to the blanket re-zoning.

The community continues to need resident participation at Board level. The Treasurer and Social Media director positions remain our most urgent need. Involvement as a Board member offers an opportunity to help develop the programs, events, and residential planning for Cambrian Heights. Help us improve our community resources by volunteering. #### **ROSEMONT PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE**

Howdy Rosemontians!

Here is the rundown:

- 1. Blanket Rezoning Summary
- 2. Pub Night
- 3. Volunteers

Blanket rezoning will continue to be in the news for April. As of this writing, Council is still planning to vote on this proposal on April 22, with talk of a potential plebiscite in the works. We have submitted residents' comments and concerns that we received at our January open house and online. Here is a summary of that feedback:

About 50 folks provided feedback (5% of residents). Approximately >95% were opposed. The primary concerns that folks raised were parking (19), doubting impact on affordability (9), setbacks from property lines/large buildings (7), efficacy of development permit process (6), lack of consultation/plebiscite (6), impacts on trees/water/sewage (6), impact to community character (5), and rezoning should be targeted not blanket (5).

This is an important topic and I want to thank everyone who took the time to come to the open house or provide feedback online. We will see what happens later this month.

Come join your neighbours for some good times at our Pub Night on April 20. Starting at 7:00 pm, we will have lots of food, drinks, and games. All of this for only \$20! If you were there last year, you'll know how much fun it was. RSVP online at RosemontYYC.com. We look forward to seeing you there!

We have submitted an application for a Spring Cleanup event with Cambrian and are just waiting to hear back to see if we have been successful in this application. Stay tuned for details on that and for volunteer opportunities. A big thanks to Bent for putting that together.

There are some great events we want to provide to you, but we can only do it with volunteers such as yourselves. There is a multi-community bike day being planned, as well as our annual Stampede Breakfast and September BBQ on the horizon. But we need people to step up and help lead these or else we won't be hosting them. Even if you have never volunteered or helped

organize events like these before, I promise you it is straightforward and we will provide a lot of support and assistance (after all, we want them to be awesome!). Email us at info@rosemontYYC.com to learn more and see if it is something that's right for you!

The new City Nature YYC website will be online with information on the 2024 challenge (www.citynatureyyc. ca). The dates for the event are April 26 to 29. Follow @CityNatureYYC on Instagram. On May 6, local, national, and global results will be announced.

The Nose Hill checklist contains references to reptiles, fungi and lichen, amphibians, insects, shellfish, birds, and mammals. Sightings are in NW Calgary. This website features the chorus frog, the tiger salamander, the terrestrial garter snake, and more. There are 42 birds, among them hawks, blackbirds, sparrows, chickadees, starlings, wrens, geese, eagles, mallards, teals, kestrels, gulls, partridges, grebes, grouse, and vultures. Some other types are the northern flicker, downy woodpecker, and hairy woodpecker. The great horned, long-eared, and short-eared owls all appear in the list.

The May Plant Count is part of the annual May Species Count. The survey runs from May 25 to 31. The focus is on documenting the flowering status of native plant species across Alberta. This project promotes stewardship and appreciation of Alberta's natural areas. As a citizen scientist, you will collect data to be used for conservation. Here are the basics. Enter the location of your plant. Upload a photo. Enter the date of the observation. Add a report about the flowering stage. Choose the appropriate stage from those listed. There are many ID guides and checklists (in print or flipbooks online). Observations can be made manually on a data sheet and then submitted by email or snail mail. You would need to sign up for the mailing list and then receive data sheets and instructions (www.naturealberta.ca/-may-plant-count). are submitting observations online you will join the May Plant Count project for the flowering codes to be displayed in the iNaturalist phone app (www. inaturalist.ca/projects/alberta-may-plant-count).

#### Don't Be Fooled

As we come to the end of tax season, scammers and fraudsters are just starting to get busy as they look to trick taxpayers with the latest scams. Canadians eager to get their tax refunds are often the victims of these seasoned criminals.

Taxpayers should be vigilant when they receive any communication that claims to be from the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA). Many of these are seeking your personal information such as a social insurance number, credit card number, bank account number, or passport number.

The CRA will only communicate with you via traditional mail to the address on file and if you are uncertain as to the validity of any mail, give them a call at 1-800-959-8281 to verify it is real. They will never threaten to 'send the police to arrest you' and will never ask for payment by interact transfer, bitcoin, or gift cards.

The CRA will only email you to say you have a message in your MyAccount and you should not use the link in the email but instead type Canada.ca/MyAccount into your browser. The CRA will never text you – ever!

These scammers usually insist that personal information is needed so that the taxpayer can receive a refund or access a benefit payment. Often, calls and emails also involve threatening or coercive language to scare individuals into paying a fictitious debt to the CRA. Other communications urge taxpayers to visit a fake CRA website where the taxpayer is then asked to verify their identity by entering personal information. These are scams and taxpayers should never respond to these fraudulent communications or click on any of the links provided. When in doubt, stop communicating.

The fraudsters are becoming more sophisticated and the CRA has a website to help you identify and protect yourself against these scams. It can be found at www.canada.ca/en/revenue-agency/corporate/security/protect-yourself-against-fraud.html.

With the approval of 'Home is Here: The City of Calgary's Housing Strategy', Council directed The City of Calgary to implement actions that will address the housing crisis. One of the proposed actions is citywide rezoning.
