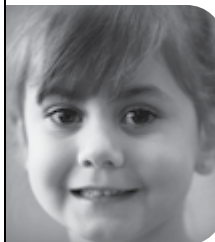

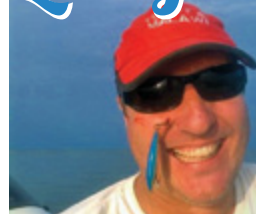

News from the Friends of Nose Hill

Coyote sightings are common in Calgary, in communities along the river and large natural areas, such as Nose Hill. [Living with coyotes](#) was an online tool, using GPS maps to pinpoint the location of their dens, scat, tracks, numbers, and behaviour, to reduce coyote conflicts. More recently, coyotes were radio-collared, in a catch and release program, in urban parks to monitor their movements. When they can find food and shelter, they will adapt to their environments, and may also be seen in backyards, on school grounds, and in playgrounds.

Their natural diet consists of rabbits, rodents, fruits, and berries. They are opportunists and will respond to unnatural food sources or being fed by people. Birdseed or suet, garbage, compost debris, dog feces and urine are attractive to them. Walk your dog on a leash, even in an unleashed area, if coyotes are nearby, and keep your cat indoors. You can call the coyote hotline at 403-297-7789.

Calgary Wildlife Rehabilitation Society deals with orphaned or injured wildlife at 403-266-2282 or 1-888-924-2444. There are potential risks in interacting with wildlife but the City website has information about coyotes, deer fawns, badgers, porcupines, ground squirrels, beavers, bats, magpies; even large animals such as bears, cougars, and moose.

With another month of wintery weather behind us, our toboggans, skates, and snowshoes have been working overtime.

This winter has produced record amounts of snow in Calgary. As a result, City crews have struggled to meet the challenge of ensuring that roads, pathways and bus stops are kept clear of snow and safe for residents. It is not for lack of money spent. By the end of 2013, the City spent more than \$26 million of its total \$34 million snow budget. Nevertheless, Calgarians have had to dig deep to find the patience required to wait for City crews to help dig them out.

The record snow has also produced a record number of calls to my office from residents seeking assistance with snow related issues and requests. I would like to thank the residents of Ward 7 for their level of engagement on this issue to ensure that priority areas are dealt with as soon as possible. The feedback that I received is consistent: that the City needs to do more to ensure that snow is cleared and removed quickly and effectively. As a result, Council has committed to review its policies on snow removal. Residents are encouraged to offer additional feedback by calling 311 or www.calgary.ca/snow.

Since 2004, Calgary has awarded more than 6400 snow pins. We encourage you to be a Snow Angel and help your neighbours.
