




## We're improving the 4th Avenue Flyover



#### CHCA Citywide Rezoning Ouestionnaire Results

What is your opinion of the City of Calgary Citywide Rezoning proposal?

The CHCA Planning Committee reached out to our residents with a questionnaire that ran from February 15 to March 4 to gauge our resident response to the City's proposed Citywide Rezoning. Thank you to the 82 residents who took the time to respond and share their opinions. We continue to encourage our residents to share their thoughts with the City through attending the April 22 Public Hearing or by submitting comments through the public submissions form at https://forms.calgary.ca/content/forms/af/public/public/public-submission-to-city-clerks.html.

#### The questionnaire provided us with the following results:

- 82% of respondents had received the postcard informing them of this proposed initiative.
- 45% found the City's Engage portal provided them with the necessary information for them to formulate an opinion on the initiative while 31.3% said it did not.
- 48.1% oppose the citywide rezoning while 33.3% support it. (See Figure 1).
- 45.7% felt the matter should be dealt with as a plebiscite vs. 40.7% as a Public Hearing (with 13.6% having no opinion).

Respondents were split on how our committee could be most effective, with the top recommendation (62.3%) being to provide information through The *View*, and the bottom (51.9%) to provide information through social media.

Earth Day is celebrating its 54th year. For 20 years, it remained a grassroots affair before going global. It's now celebrated in more than 190 countries, with an estimated one billion people all over the world participating each year.

Earth Day is now a movement. If more people are aware of the climate crisis and the actions they can take, the more people are empowered to protect the planet. It is all about educating people about conservation, protesting against climate change and global warming, and encouraging volunteering for the good of the planet.

We can make some changes throughout the year to make a positive environmental impact. Earth Day encourages you to build habits that you can sustain year-round. Take small steps and do your best.

#### Here are some ideas:

- Change up your lawn. Choose wildflowers and native plants to attract pollinators and reduce watering.
- Pick up litter as it's everywhere.

- Don't buy as much stuff reduce, reuse, and recycle.

## Off the Shelf

#### BOOK REVIEW BY JUDITH UMBACH

The Shadow King by Maaza Mengiste

History is usually written by the victors. In 1935, Italy under Mussolini invaded Ethiopia in an aggressive war intent on colonization. Over two years of combat and betrayal, atrocities escalated. Ethiopia defeated colonization at a terrible prize.

The Shadow King is a historical novel by Maaza Mengiste, written not just from the Ethiopian perspective but also from a woman's perspective, and a low-caste servant's view at that. As the story begins, Hirut is orphaned by the sudden deaths of her beloved parents, and she is forced into a servitude that certainly resembles slavery. The reader feels her pain through her interior monologue, because otherwise she defends herself through silence. Not always effective.

Kidane is Hirut's master and an increasingly important commander in the Ethiopian army. As part of the country's defensive strategy, he is assigned the area near his home and tasked with the goal of repelling the invasion there. His wife, Aster, who despises Kidane for his many infidelities, in war creates a new strong, active persona for herself and many other local women. At first, they train to support the soldiers, and then they train to be soldiers. Not that Kidane accepts them.

Italian soldiers are given a voice in the novel. They mostly regard the Ethiopians as incompetent barbarians, and thus have no interior questions of morality or humanity. The Emperor, Haile Selassie, is also given a voice – his own interior voice. His voice resides in Bath, England, where he languishes in exile.

Despite training, passion, and local knowledge, Hirut and Aster are captured in their first big battle. Their defeat was inevitable because the odd collection of guns with Kidane's forces are pitiful in the face of Italian ground and air armaments. The women are thrown into an infamous prison built by the Italian area commander. Its one room is remarkably small. No one stays long.

Maaza Mengiste's poetic prose sings of the yearning for freedom by the men, and doubly by the women.

## Two Cleanups in May, There Is Definitely an Echo in Here

#### 2024 Pathway and River Cleanup

This year's Pathway and River Cleanup is scheduled over a three-day window from May 3 to 5. We have settled upon Sunday May 5 from 10:00 am to 1:00 pm. This year's event falls on one of the most jam-packed weekends of events in recent Crescent Heights memory. We had planned to go out as usual on Saturday, but that coincides with a series of Jane's Walks and other community events, so we'll hope for continued good weather and meet by the river on Sunday the 5th.

Our river reach is from 4 Street NE to Centre Street, River Left, or the near (north) bank of the Bow. We hope to see some of our regulars out on the pathway. Crescent Heights has been tackling this river reach for more than 20 years! Let us know if you can join us so we can get a sense of our numbers for securing supplies. We'll meet down by the river at the Reconciliation Bridge and work our way Westward to Centre Street.

#### 2024 Crescent Heights Community Cleanup

Our very popular Crescent Heights Community Cleanup is in the works. We have submitted our registration and site plan and are awaiting word on our assigned date. If you can volunteer for the cleanup, we can certainly use your help, and being on site gives you the first pick of the Free Store's treasures (see below). The City recommends having 15 to 20 volunteers on site, as community cleanup events are increasingly popular and draw people from across the city. The more people we have to direct traffic and activity on site, the better our traffic flow and cycle time will be.

We are poised to begin contacting third-party vendors to determine the scope of materials we can accept, but we hope to be able to take metals and electronics as we have in past years, plus gently used household items for the Women in Need Society (WINS). Watch this space and check the CHCA website as the Spring Cleanup season approaches.

#### What's Likely the Same for 2024?

Same place. CHCA community hall, enter from 2 Street NW at 11 Avenue. Packer trucks will be positioned to accept household waste, the stuff that may not fit in your black cart or green cart. Volunteers will be on hand to direct the traffic flow and maintain distance. Remember to stream recyclables to your blue cart or to a neighbourhood depot so we're not sending recyclable materials to a landfill. Similarly, hazardous waste products (paints, chemicals, etc.) should be disposed of at a designated firehall or landfill equipped for those materials. No concrete rubble can be accepted because it damages the equipment. No glass, please! Make sure your load is properly secured and tarped en route to the hall. Please don't bring materials and drop them before or after the event, we'll be watching!

The Free Store will be in operation once again to help gently used items with life left in them find new homes. Goods that are not claimed will be loaded into the trucks in the last half-hour of the event. If you can help with this effort, please come to the site around 1:30 pm to help us clean up and close up.

Please be prepared to unload your own materials. Volunteers will be on hand but only to manage the traffic flow on site. Our trusted City staff are there to operate the equipment; remember that they are volunteering their time too! Unload as quickly as you can to keep things moving.

Can't wait for our date? The city-wide community cleanup program kicks off in April and events are scheduled at different communities across the city. 
