President's Message



"And what is so rare as a day in June? Then, if ever, come perfect days." That's Chaucer's summation of June and he goes on to describe the new blooms and bird songs that we look forward to on a June day. In

Edgemont, the grass is green, the summer displays will be on show, and our community centre is humming with wedding activities. By the way, if you are planning any events, consider the community centre as a venue. We have different room sizes, reasonable price points, and the staff will be happy to help you put your plans in action.

June is a time when individuals and communities are in the throes of spring cleanup. Once the snow has melted, we are faced with the litter that has accumulated over winter. Keep in mind that there are appropriate ways to dispose of that litter. Green bins are being dumped once a week and organic yard waste can be placed in your green bin. If you want to know where to get rid of waste and other junk, go to <https://www.calgary.ca/waste/what-goes-where/default.html>. The website explains what to put in the garbage, what goes in the blue and green bins, and what items can be taken to recycling sites. It is important to make sure that hazardous waste, chemicals, and paint are handled appropriately so as not to injure anyone or pollute our neighbourhood.

Do we have any amateur detectives among our residents? We could use your help. An ongoing problem not just in Edgemont but in Calgary as a whole is illegal dumping. In Edgemont, this is a problem particularly in the Edgeburn Lane development. Illegal dumping has consequences. It creates safety concerns and makes common areas harder to enjoy. If you observe debris or dumped material that needs to be cleaned up:

- Take a picture of the debris or dumped material.
- Record the address of where you have observed debris or dumped material.
- Call 3-1-1 or report online or report using the 3-1-1 app.

If you witness someone in the act of dumping,

- Write down as much information as you can including license plate number, description of the vehicle, people, and items being dumped. The time the incident happened, and the location.

- Take a photo if you are able and it is safe to do so.
- Call 3-1-1 or report online.
- Provide your name, address, phone number, and the details of your concern in case your testimony is required in court.

If the perpetrator can be identified, the city will issue a warning notice to have the situation remedied, and if the perpetrator fails to take action, a violation ticket may be issued.¹

It's Showtime for Edgemont's ELM Program Flowers!

Our flowers are making their appearance for another year full of colour and vibrancy, all thanks to our ELM Program.

Was that a crazy spring? Caught in the middle of the fight between winter and summer? Actually... for Calgary, that was pretty normal! And for Edgemont, our elevation plays a fairly significant role. While Calgary weather forecasts typically do not include the snow level, or the elevation above which snow accumulation is expected, this phenomenon does play a role in Edgemont as it does in our backyard mountains to the west. Our elevation results in cooler evenings, higher snow accumulation, and longer frost seasons.

We certainly got our money's worth from our winter displays; they remained frozen into the pots well into May. Another telltale sign of our microclimate here happens when the annual Lilac Festival is celebrated, often before we see any of our lilacs even leaf out!

We also need to be careful when we plant our delicate flowers to ensure no more killing frosts will occur, even if that means delaying our flowers well into June. The ability to replant flowers to the numbers that Edgemont enjoys is not really possible, but our ELM program is in good hands with Foothills Landscaping ready to take care of everything.

Flower selection is a lot more than colour and texture choices. Through experience, selections are made based on our dry air, high altitude, cool nights, hot days, aphids, and the ability to bounce back from our inevitable hail and wind. No summer season has ever been the same, so we look forward to this summer's journey.

I have received some very good feedback about small, localized improvements and will be addressing those in a timely manner. Thank you for submitting them! If you see anything that needs attention, please send me a note at AskElm@edgemont.ab.ca. A wonderful element of the ELM Program is the ability to address issues rapidly.

Another hot topic this time of year is our dandelions. They will occur and they are no longer considered a noxious or restricted weed under the Alberta Weed Control Act. As such, chemical control of them is not an option. The ELM Program addresses these with weekly mowing and a fresh application of grass fertilizer to give turf a healthy advantage over dandelions, but please understand that this will not prevent them.

Enjoy Edgemont's outdoors with the floral scents of flowering trees, morning dew, budding spruce trees, and the return of the soothing sounds of our trembling aspens and delightful robins singing at dawn and dusk!

News from the Friends of Nose Hill

The City Nature Challenge is a global community citizen science event wherein community groups, experts, and residents collaborate to find all types of nature around them. In the Calgary Metropolitan Region, the top 150 users in 2024 surpassed 10,000 observations. By then, they had uploaded a total of nearly 40,000 observations of Calgary's local flora and fauna. The year marked the tenth anniversary of both iNaturalist and the City Nature Challenge. For the Calgary Area, in 2025, there were 15,923 observations, 28,462 identifications, 891 species, 659 identifiers, and 356 observers. In 2026, the eighth annual Calgary City Nature Challenge focused on data quality for plants, insects, fungi, and wildlife. All information on Calgary's natural areas posted on iNaturalist can be used to revise and update the 1980 Calgary "Green Book" by 2030. Although you do not need an expert to lead a nature walk, John McFaul of Nature Calgary, in cooperation with Bird Friendly Alberta, guided field trips on Nose Hill. The group met near the 64 Ave and 14 Street NW parking lot. Much of their trip was off paved trails and on unlevel ground. A previous walk started at the Berkley Gate and 14 Street NW entrance. Calgary was one of the first certified Nature Canada Bird Friendly Cities. Injured birds can be rescued, in early morning and at night, but, of course, prevention is preferred. The aim is to identify and reduce threats since, in an urban environment, city lights and reflections cause collisions. Window treatments can help. Also turning off unnecessary lights. During fall and spring migrations, downtown is unsafe due to tall buildings, especially at night. 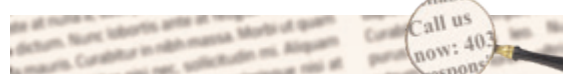
