Being in this room is so off-putting to the senses that no one has stayed inside for longer than 45 minutes!

Gardening

The days are becoming longer, and we are experiencing warmer weather, it's time to think about spring planting. Calgary is now a zone 4a (previously zone 3) for weather, which means we have more options when selecting plants. Of course, Hidden Valley Hanson Ranch has its own microclimate. There have been days where we have had snow, and it has been raining south of Country Hills Blvd. The NW section of Calgary is the coolest, with the SE being the warmest. A North/South facing yard, landscaping, and windbreaks will determine what is successful on your property. If you have a vegetable garden, whether it is above or at ground level will also be a deciding factor on vegetables and water usage. Unfortunately, gardening and landscaping can be trial and error. I've noted consistent perennials that perform well in Hidden Valley Hanson Ranch: Devil Ninebark, Salvia, Hens and Chicks, Yellow Gem Potentilla, Catmint, Japanese Barberry, and Turkish Burning Bush. Soil care is also important, it needs to be replenished in order to maintain a healthy lawn. Fertilizer can help, but providing your lawn with a layer of soil raked in in spring will help keep the lawn healthy. A healthy lawn can fight off weeds. Walking though Hidden Valley Hanson Ranch is definitely one of the perks of living here and I continue to be inspired by our neighbours.



HVCA Fun Facts

Greetings neighbours!

I thought it would be fun to review some fun facts about Hidden Valley Hanson Ranch.

First fun fact most people don't know – HVCA includes both Hanson Ranch and Hidden Valley.

As of the 2016 census, including both Hanson Ranch and Hidden Valley, we had:

- •11,915 people living in our community in 3,845 households.
- Most of us own our homes 91% (compared to 71% for the rest of Calgary).
- 71% of us have mortgages.
- 72% of us are age 15 to 64 years.
- •82% of take a car to work, and for most of us our commute is about 15 to 44 minutes.
- 38% of us identify as a visible minority.
- 31% of us are immigrants, with half immigrating to Canada in the last 20 years.
- 2% of us are Indigenous, with 73% identifying as Métis and 24% identifying as First Nations.
- 60% of us have children at home (compared to 48% for the rest of Calgary) – (Not sure how they define "child" though...some/many of us have adult children living at home).

Our neighbourhood is a vibrant, active community. We hope you enjoyed this quick overview of our community, brought to us by the City of Calgary 2016 census: https://www.calgary.ca/communities/profiles/ hidden-valley.html.

Is It a Bobcat or a Lynx?



You may be seeing a larger-sized cat with long, tufted ears and a short, bobbed tail strutting their stuff through our neighbourhood and wondering if it's a bobcat or a lynx. Oddly enough no matter what you thought, you are right!

While bobcats and lynxes are separate species, they do belong to the same genus, which, coincidentally, happens to be the Lynx genus. There are four different species belonging to the Lynx genus: the Eurasian lynx, the Spanish (or Iberian) lynx, the Canadian lynx, and finally the bobcat.

The bobcat looks a bit like an overgrown house cat with extra-long tufts of fur on its ears and a shaggy mane of fur around its cheeks. Their short,



rounded tails appear to be cut, or "bobbed", and is completed by a band with black stripes ending in black at the top of the tip and white at the bottom.

The bobcats diet includes rabbit, hare, and small prey like birds and mice. Bobcats are opportunistic hunters so keeping cats indoors and supervising small dogs when they are in the yard are ways you can keep your animals safe.

Remember:

- Do not feed wildlife.
- Keep your garbage in containers with tight-fitting lids.
- Put your garbage and recycling out only on the morning of collection, not earlier.
- Do not leave pet food outdoors.
- Do not approach the bobcats they are wild animals.

The bobcats are our neighbours so it's important that we learn how to safety co-exist.

There is an annual global community science competition to document urban diversity. Public bioblitzes will be held across Calgary with local stewardship groups. The challenge engages citizen scientists in finding and documenting plants, animals, and other living organism in urban areas. The 2023 City Nature Challenge involves taking pictures between April 28 and May 1 and then identifying them. Results will be announced on May 8. This will be the fifth year for Calgary region participation and there are awards for the top cities. Although the City introduced two new program, Green Leader and Water Steward, its decision to temporarily discontinue its Adopt-a-Park program was unpopular. Now you can join the Parks Environmental Education team on a Green Initiative project to restore habitat with tree and shrub planting, tree wiring, weed pulling, or painting projects. These group projects are seasonal (May to October) and typically require a 3-to-4-hour commitment. A screening policy is in place, which may include checks by police. Once accepted, volunteers receive orientation, training, and other support. For more information and to register, please call 3-1-1.

Q: Any Update on the Hanson Ranch Wetlands?

A: You may have noticed that throughout March, crews were out working on the wetland. Although construction is expected to begin in 2024, preliminary work is being done for permitting purposes. Keeping Storm Drains Clear This Spring

Storm drains (or catchbasins) are the main way stormwater gets into our underground pipes AKA our stormwater management system, so it's important we keep them clear! There are about 60,000 storm drains in Calgary which capture water off sidewalks, streets, and roads. The City has an online map that shows where storm drains are located and how to care for them: calgary.ca/stormdrains.

With springtime rain around the corner, rain barrel sales are happening right in Ward 3. Capturing rainwater keeps dirt and contaminants out of our rivers and helps our community stay resilient during dry weather by cutting down on water use.
