

These benefits range from public speaking to record keeping, but recently, members of the Prairie Winds 4-H Club have been attending workshops where they are learning about possible careers.



Members attended an interactive samosa making workshop. This experience demonstrated some of the tasks that one may need to do while working for the food industry. Members started by making the filling, putting the filling

in the samosa shells, and then folding the samosa shells. While there were some challenges doing this, by the end, everyone was able to successfully fold at least one samosa. Then the samosas were fried to make them deliciously crispy, before taking them home.



Another possible field that is of interest to some is caring for animals. The club experienced a bit of this through an informative rabbit raising workshop. This event started with an in-depth presentation on caring for rabbits. Shortly after,

participants got to play with, feed, pet, and pick up the four rabbits that the presenter brought. The whole club seemed to have fun, while learning some important information.

An opportunity for high school students of the club was a scholarship workshop. A post-secondary education can lead to a career after getting some type of designation. This informational event discussed 4-H scholarships available to members. Those in attendance learned step-by-step how to apply, and what to do to increase the likelihood of getting a scholarship.

Overall, this last month has been very beneficial to our members, and we continue to live out the 4-H model of "learn to do by doing."

HVCA – A Few Facts: Who We Are, What We Do

We have been asked by some residents to describe what the Community Association does.

The HVCA includes both Hanson Ranch and Hidden Valley. Our Board of Directors are volunteers who care about our neighbourhood and work hard to foster a sense of community through our events, projects, facilities (rink, Hut), beautification, and communications. Your membership fees help us do all of this!

To supplement the memberships, we run a casino once every two years (fund usage abides by AGLC rules) and apply for grants which also allow us to run events, maintain the rink, run our sports programs, and much more. As grants are not always easy to get, our funding is quite limited.

The Board meets publicly once a month, on the third Thursday of each month. We host external guest speakers that usually includes a representative from the Calgary Police Service, a City of Calgary Neighbourhood Partnership Coordinator, and various political representatives – Ward 3, MLAs, and even our MP.

We can advocate with these representatives on a variety of issues, and they usually have a monthly report of activities in their ridings. We run events to bring people together. This year, we are running a monthly board game bash, a community cleanup, a bike festival (Festivélo), The Dog days of Summer (Pet owners will love this one!), Sounds and Spirits (Music and local brewery, what a match!), and possibly more if we can.

We try to convey information about City projects that are occurring in our area. Things like the Deerfoot Trail improvements and the Hanson Ranch wetland redesign, along with other projects in our area are on our HVCA Facebook page, www.facebook.com/hiddenvalleyhansonranch or our Instagram at www.instagram.com/hvcahiddenhut. Please note that our Facebook page is different than other Facebook group

pages, like the HV/HR community group or the Block Watch page for example. The HVCA Facebook group is strictly for community information. If you would like to submit resident community concerns such as traffic, wetlands, parks, etc., please email info@hiddenhut.org.

We work with the City to bring in City programming to our community such as Skate Park, Community Cleanup, Park n Play, etc.

HVCA owns and maintains amenities such as the outdoor rink at the Hidden Hut, and the Hanson Ranch entrance. We also have leases of property at the Hidden Hut, and 14 St entrance to name a few. We have a beautification committee who works on projects like planter pots and festive lights at our entrances, and the Little Free Library at the Hidden Hut.

We work with the City on replacing old playgrounds in our community, as well as making our Hidden Hut more of a community Hub.

We hope this helps bring some awareness of what the Hidden Valley Community Association does for you, the residents of Hanson Ranch and Hidden Valley!



News from the Friends of Nose Hill

The annual May Plant Count is an event where volunteers survey their favourite natural areas to collect data on the distribution and blooming of flowering plants in Alberta. Collection of plant specimens is not allowed in any protected or restricted areas, such as Nose Hill Park. The survey, which takes place between May 25 and 31, encourages stewardship and is based on appreciation of nature.

Expertise in identification is valuable, but not mandatory. It is open to anyone with an interest in plants and flowering. As a citizen scientist, your photos submitted during the count period will contribute to the databases. To join the project, go to <https://inaturalist.ca/projects/alberta-may-plant-count>. In order to submit observations, you will need to log in and create an account (which is free).


The May Plant Count is part of the May Species Count. It began in 1976 to track bird species across Alberta and, in 2011, over 300,000 birds were counted. In 2022, over 400 people participated in the bird count.
