



### **HVCA – Beautification Update**

This past summer, HVCA purchased new summer inserts which were displayed at the 14 Street and Hidden Creek Drive entrances. It was great to see the decorations appreciated by the community. For Hanson Ranch, this was a new location for the inserts, which has been well received. The winter inserts are now out on display. There are six planters to fill (two in Hanson Ranch and four at 14 Street). Previously, HVCA only had four winter and four summer inserts. Through grant application efforts, HVCA was able to obtain funding to purchase two additional winter and summer inserts. This will enable HVCA to have every planter filled.

It's important to note that HVCA operates with the support of the community. It is through volunteer effort that Hidden Valley and Hanson Ranch place makers are created and maintained. In 2023, Hidden Valley community members supported by maintaining the horses on Hidden Valley drive, a local lawn maintenance company cleaned the shrubs and grasses surrounding the horses, local residents did an extensive cleanup at the Hanson Ranch sign, the Little Library at Hidden Hut doors were fixed, and the 14 Street entrance lights returned courtesy of a local company.

### **HVCA – Facilities Update**

The Hidden Hut facility has been with Hidden Valley for so many years that likely most of the community doesn't give it a second thought. Some community members may be more familiar as they visit during the summer to use the rink for ball hockey, mobile skate park, or other activities. There are also the winter users who are there for recreational youth hockey or skating. Likely, the Hut is a building you see, but aren't sure of its purpose.

Hidden Hut was built in 2000 (wow 24 years). Over the years, the facility has allowed HVCA to run youth sport programs, maintain the outdoor rink, and other community events, including the Sounds and Music festival this past summer. It is important to note that HVCA is responsible for the care the maintenance of Hidden Hut. HVCA assets (Hidden Hut and outdoor rink) are maintained by the community association under an agreement with the City.

Stewardship of the facility in 2023 included electrical, plumbing, and cleaning. Although not outwardly visible, the HVCA board has been planning and completing minor updates to the facility to support future activities. HVCA hired a local plumber and electrician to complete work at the Hut this past summer. Maintenance of the hut not only ensures HVCA is in compliance with regulations, but also the safety of all users.

In addition to the Hut, HVCA is responsible for the garbage receptacles and port-a-potty on site. If you have visited the outdoor rink or accessible playground, you likely used one of the garbage cans. HVCA uses a local company to remove waste.

### **Winter Cart Placement Tips**



Follow these winter tips to keep your cart collection safe and on schedule:

- Clear snow and ice to put your carts on even ground.
   Don't place carts behind or on top of snowbanks.
- Leave enough space around your carts to easily walk between and around them.
- Store carts in a sheltered spot and move them out on collection day, so they don't freeze to the ground.
   Move carts back by 7:00 pm on collection day.
- Clear snow off your carts and keep lids closed. Snow in your blue cart ruins recyclables and makes them difficult to sort at the facility, meaning they can't be turned into new products.
- Prevent food and yard waste from freezing inside your green cart. Use compostable bags or place crumpled newspaper or a pizza box at the bottom of the cart.



## **Top Ten Winter Checklist for Your Home**

## Leapers and Leaplings Special Day



Four million leap day babies? Did you know the odds of being born on February 29 is one in 1,461! Leap day babies are better-known as 'leapers' or 'leaplings'. Hats off to these time-defying, once-in-a-blue-moon birthday legends!

### **Valentine's Day**

Valentine's Day, observed on February 14, has a rich history dating back centuries. Its origins are rooted in both ancient Roman traditions and Christian martyrdom, creating a celebration that has evolved over time.

One popular theory links Valentine's Day to the Roman festival of Lupercalia, celebrated in mid-February. This fertility festival involved rituals and activities that included the pairing of men and women through a lottery system. As Christianity spread, the church sought to Christianize pagan celebrations, and Lupercalia was eventually replaced by the feast of St. Valentine.

The identity of St. Valentine remains somewhat ambiguous, as there were multiple Christian martyrs named Valentine. One widely accepted account attributes the day to a priest named Valentine who defied the Roman Emperor Claudius II's decree against marriages for young men. Valentine continued to perform marriages in secret, believing in the sanctity of love. Another legend suggests that Valentine helped Christians escape persecution and was subsequently imprisoned and executed.

During the Middle Ages, the association between love and Valentine's Day gained traction. The poet Geoffrey Chaucer, in the 14th century, wrote of the day as a time when birds chose their mates. This notion of avian romance contributed to the idea of Valentine's Day as a day for expressing love.

The exchange of handwritten love notes became popular in 17th century England, marking the beginning of the tradition of sending valentines. By the 18th century, these notes evolved into commercially printed cards adorned with lace and ribbons.

In the 19th century, the mass production of Valentine's Day cards began in the United States, and the holiday transitioned into a more commercialized celebration of romantic love. Today, it has expanded beyond romantic partners to include expressions of love for friends and family, making Valentine's Day a widely celebrated and cherished occasion across the globe.

Some features produce a positive response in visitors, as a focus for passive recreation, education, and interpretation; they remain opportunities for interpretation of bedrock themes in the park. Among the landscape features are large sandstone boulders several metres across. Those in north slope coulees may contain fossil clam shells, as remnants of a wave cut terrace which tumbled onto valley glaciers.

The Nose Hill pre-glacial gravels in the eastern portion of the Hill extend throughout the hilltop. In the Burnco gravel pit - and the slopes leading to this area from 19 Street and from Charleswood Drive - several trails and junctions in the south-facing areas are where exposed gravel from the Hill use in the 1960s and 70s would have been visible unless remediation was done with nurse and native grasses, after re-rooting foot traffic while the repair was undertaken.

A review of land uses of Nose Hill revealed that areas more severely damaged by vehicles, horse and cattle grazing, and gravel extraction were slowly regenerating. Although rutted trails remained, some already had grass growing in them due to less traffic. Ravine trails were heavily overgrown by tall grasses, thistles, and nettles, so that people used them less.

Firefighting, weeding, and controlled burns with vehicles damaged the plateau and slopes above the Porcupine Valley bike path. Widened and two-track trails are from social use; trail braiding on steeper hillsides due to wet, icy, or poor conditions. An on-hill project was raking to prevent new desire lines. Work was needed on the old motorcross routes up the bluff south of Porcupine Valley and along the Many Owls Valley Road where the trails had been washed out or deeply grooved. Pedestrian use of old vehicle roads slowed regeneration and remediation was warranted.

Thank you to the teachers, staff, and parents for their continued work to support Alberta's world-class education system. The 2022 Programme for International Student Assessment (PISA) results underscore Alberta's excellence in education, ranking first in Canada for reading, science, and second in math, just behind Quebec. Globally, Alberta secured the second spot in reading, science, and seventh in math. We should also be extremely proud of the 1,300 students that participated for their dedicated efforts.

Recognizing primary health care as foundational, Alberta's government commits new, incremental funding of \$200 million over two years to enhance access to family physicians, aiming for widespread availability. A ten-year, \$24 billion health care agreement with the federal government in 2023 outlines the initial three years of funding. While beneficial, this funding falls short of requirements, prompting ongoing advocacy for increased federal health transfers aligning with the provinces and territories initial requests.

Alberta's government is taking decisive steps in addressing hate by expanding the Alberta Security Infrastructure Program (ASIP) grant to support Islamic and Jewish faith-based schools for up to 12 months with temporary access to funding for security enhancements. This expansion includes an increase of up to \$20,000 in grant funding to support targeted schools that identify short-term need for physical security on campus. Alberta Sheriffs will collaborate with law enforcement to bolster security presence at religious and cultural institutions where and when needed.

#### **City Building in Calgary**

The City of Calgary is updating the plans that will shape our future. As our population climbs, the City has to prepare to support the growth. Right now, we're gathering feedback on three key areas:

- The Calgary Plan will merge the Municipal Development Plan with our Transportation Plan.
- The new Zoning Bylaw (A.K.A Land Use) will simplify the rules of governing and form of buildings throughout Calgary.
- 3. The new Street Manual will give direction on supporting all forms of safe travel for Calgarians.

Each document is created with public feedback in mind, so please share your input over the next two months at calgary.ca/citybuilding.

#### **Secondary Suites Amnesty Extension**

City Council voted unanimously to extend the very successful Secondary Suites Amnesty Program until the end of 2026. Under this program, charges for development permits and registration fees are waived, enabling owners to continue building safe and legal suites at a reduced cost.
