

Cranberry Sweet Potato Breakfast Skillet

This hearty and delicious breakfast skillet combines fresh cranberries, ham, sweet potatoes, and a hint of orange for a perfect Thanksgiving morning meal.



Ingredients:

- · 2 medium sweet potatoes, peeled and diced
- 1 cup fresh cranberries
- 1 cup diced cooked ham
- 1/2 medium onion, finely chopped
- 1/2 cup orange juice
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1 tablespoon olive oil
- Salt and pepper to taste
- 1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon (optional)
- Fresh parsley, chopped (for garnish)

Instructions:

1. Prep the Ingredients: Peel and dice the sweet potatoes. Finely chop the onion. Dice the cooked ham. Set aside the fresh cranberries.

2. Cook the Sweet Potatoes: Heat olive oil in a large skillet over medium heat. Add the diced sweet potatoes and cook for about ten minutes, stirring occasionally, until they start to soften and turn golden brown.

3. Add Onion and Ham: Add the chopped onion to the skillet and cook for three to four minutes until it becomes translucent. Stir in the diced ham and cook for another two to three minutes until the ham is heated through.

4. Add Cranberries and Orange Juice: Add the fresh cranberries to the skillet, followed by the orange juice and brown sugar. Stir to combine. If using, sprinkle in the ground cinnamon for added warmth and flavour.

5. Simmer: Reduce the heat to low and let the mixture simmer for about five to seven minutes, or until the cranberries have softened and the sweet potatoes are tender. The orange juice will reduce and create a slightly sweet and tangy glaze.

6. Season and Serve: Season with salt and pepper to taste. Garnish with chopped fresh parsley before serving.

This Cranberry Sweet Potato Breakfast Skillet is a perfect way to start your Thanksgiving Day, combining savoury ham and sweet potatoes with the tart pop of cranberries and the refreshing hint of orange juice. Enjoy with a glass of fresh orange juice for a complete breakfast!

Here are some updates related to new City initiatives and programs.

Secondary Suite Incentive Program Launch

To encourage safe and accessible housing, the City has launched its Secondary Suite Incentive Program as part of our official Housing Strategy. It provides qualifying homeowners with up to \$10,000 to cover a portion of costs to develop and register a safe secondary suite. Only suites built within main dwellings are eligible to apply for the following:

- Egress windows
- Hardwired and interconnected smoke and carbon monoxide alarms
- Protected exiting
- Smoke-tight barriers
- Split heat/separate air

Additional funding is also available for accessibility and energy efficiency. View the full details and application process at calgary.ca/suite-incentive.

Welcome back, students, teachers, and support staff, to an exciting new school year. I hope your summer was filled with rest, reflection, and rejuvenation, and that you are ready to begin a productive year of learning.

Alberta's population is booming and causing unprecedented growth in our education system, adding a historic number of new students across the province for the 2024 to 2025 school year. Alberta's government recognizes and sympathizes with the challenges school authorities face with increasing enrolment, rising operational costs, and inflation. That is why it is investing \$215 million to help alleviate these pressures, beginning in the 2024 to 2025 school year. Through this investment, the Alberta government is creating up to 2,500 new spaces for students by building and installing up to 100 new modular classrooms.

50 modular classrooms will be relocated to rapidly growing communities in the Calgary Metropolitan Region and Edmonton, supporting up to 1,250 students. The Calgary Board of Education will receive up to 31 new modular classrooms, with up to 14 relocated, while the Calgary Catholic School Division will get up to 14 new modular classrooms, with up to six relocated.

School authorities can use this additional funding to hire more teachers and support staff, helping to manage class sizes and address rising costs without affecting student learning.

Moody's Ratings upgraded Alberta's credit rating outlook to positive from stable and confirmed the Aa2 standing, recognizing the province's commitment to balancing the budget, controlling spending, and paying down debt.

This is the fourth credit upgrade for the Government of Alberta in the past year and the fifth in 18 months. This upgrade follows Fitch's upgrade in June, reaffirming Alberta as Canada's economic engine. Meanwhile, the Alberta government has invested record amounts in healthcare and education, continues to pay debts, and saves for the future.



Another summer is winding down and students, teachers, and support staff are getting ready to head back to school. Recently, the Government of Alberta made an announcement of additional education funding. Unfortunately, this 1% increase in spending will be spread too thin to address needs in our classrooms and our students remain the lowest funded in the country.

Utilization rates across Calgary Board of Education and Calgary Catholic schools are at or approaching 100% in most areas of the city. We will run out of learning spaces soon if the government doesn't immediately address this space crunch. Portable classrooms are only a band-aid, we need to move quickly to build the new schools that our growing city needs. We can and must do so much better for our young learners. As your Opposition Education Critic, I will continue to advocate for adequate supports in our schools for students and teachers.

If you and your family have questions, concerns, or have a story to share about your school, please feel free to reach out to my office. I want to hear from you so that I can take these concerns directly to the Legislature.

As a teacher recently wrote to me - hope is contagious. Every day our educators work to provide the very best for our students, the future of our province. Despite the challenges we face in education, the persistence of these incredible people provides hope.

Thank you for all you do, and welcome back.

Fall Cleanup

With fall nearly upon us, it's time to start preparing your garden for the coming winter. Here is a list of fall garden activities to help you get your plants ready for the new season.

- 1. Fertilize your lawn (compost works for this too).
- 2. Transplant shrubs or young trees to new locations.

3. Cut diseased areas out of perennials. Do not compost and put into your black garbage bin.

4. Rake and compost any fallen leaves or use leaves as mulch for beds. If you have a mulching mower mulch them first.

5. Clean up garden debris. Remove all vegetable plants and fallen fruit. Amend the soil and consider fall seeding a few vegetables (see suggestions below).

6. Remove dead annuals from the garden, after a frost.

7. Cut back perennial foliage to discourage overwintering pests. Leave flowers with seeds for the birds and attractive plants that provide winter interest.

8. Continue watering trees and shrubs until the ground freezes.

9. Sharpen lawn mower blade and pruners before they are put away for the season.

10. Trim tall grass away from trees and corners of your home to discourage small rodents from creating nests.

11. Mulch your hardy perennial herbs like chives, sage, tarragon, and thyme.

12. Dig up tender bulbs such as dahlia, canna and gladiola, wrap them in moist material and store in a cool, dark space.

13. Turn off outside water connections and drain garden hoses before temperatures drop to freezing.

14. Clean fallen leaves in downspouts and gutters.

Here are some suggestions for good bulbs to plant at this time of year:

- Daffodil
- Grape hyacinth

- Siberian squill
- Allium
- Fritillaria
- Dog's-tooth violet
- Glory-of-the-snow
- Winter aconite
- Snowdrop
