

Calgary's General Election will take place on October 20, 2025, and eligible voters can check if they are registered, update their information or add themselves to the Permanent Electors Register until August 1, 2025.

If you miss the opportunity to register or update your information in advance, you can register at the voting station during Advance Vote (October 6 to 11) or on Election Day (October 20). 

Hanson Ranch Update

Spring Safety Reminder for Hanson Ranch

Spring has arrived, and as everyone eagerly gets out to enjoy the warmer weather, we'd like to take a moment to remind our community about traffic safety in Hanson Ranch. With more children and adults out walking, cycling, and visiting our playgrounds and pathways, it's important for all of us to stay alert and mindful of one another.

To help promote safer driving, we've requested SLOWS (Speed Limit Observation and Warning System) trailers at four key locations in Hanson Ranch on Hidden Creek Drive, Hidden Creek Way, and both north and south of the traffic circle on Hidden Creek Blvd. These temporary radar-equipped trailers display the speed of oncoming vehicles, reminding motorists that the speed limit throughout Hanson Ranch is 40 km/h. While we're still waiting for confirmation on these requests, we want to encourage everyone to slow down, obey the speed limit, and set a good example by acting as a "pace car" when driving through our neighbourhood.

A Quick Reminder About Traffic Circle Etiquette

Since the installation of the now-permanent traffic circle at Hidden Creek Way, Hidden Creek Blvd, and Hidden Creek Heights, there's been some ongoing confusion about right-of-way rules. When it was first installed, signs instructed drivers to "yield to the vehicle on the left," which led many to believe that when two vehicles approach the circle at the same time, the vehicle on the left has the right-of-way. However, that's not quite accurate.

Here's how it works:

- Yield to vehicles already in the traffic circle they're approaching from the left as they circulate. Thus, you are yielding to the vehicle on the left.
- Slow down when approaching the circle and yield to both pedestrians and other vehicles as needed.
- First come, first served if it's safe to enter and no one is in the circle, the first vehicle to arrive goes first.
- If two vehicles arrive at the same time, the driver on the left must yield to the driver on the right.

Facilities Update

After a very successful winter on our outdoor rinks, where we managed to keep the gates open for almost two straight months, the ice is now since melted, and we've moved on to our spring and summer season. Some wondered why we kept the rink under lock and chain for so long, but it took almost six weeks for our ice to melt, and for the pipes to thaw out enough to drain the lake of excess water.

We've replaced the nets on all four backboards, so feel free to take advantage of the hoops in the rink. We've also left the hockey nets inside the rink, so the kids can fit in some street hockey over the summer months. All we ask is that everyone respect the equipment and leave it in the best shape you can for the next person that wants to use it.

Although we have pickup services contracted out for the three garbage bins that surround the rink, at times they can fill up quicker than expected. If you spot a full bin, feel free to contact me at facilitiesdirector@ hiddenhut.org and I'll arrange for an extra pickup. With that in mind, we ask that you don't put garbage from home into the community bins, especially cardboard boxes. As you can imagine, they tend to fill up the bins in a hurry. Thanks in advance!

It seems a little strange to talk about winter, when summer has yet to arrive, but it's never too early to start recruiting volunteers for ice maintenance next fall and winter. Give it some thought, and we'll remind you in the coming months. If we could put together a crew of about ten or twelve rink rats, committed to about an hour or two per week, it would make much lighter work for all involved. And, for parents of young kids, it's a couple hours of peace and quiet out flooding the rink! I'm happy to take your information anytime at facilitiesdirector@hiddenhut.org.

We are celebrating the 10th Anniversaries of the City Nature Challenge and of iNaturalist Canada. The 7th Annual Calgary City Nature Challenge was on April 25 to 28, 2025. So far, the previous year was most successful with 13,000+ observations. Other micro bioblitzes will happen all this summer. The iNaturalist platform is being used to help provide up to date records of the occurrence of the flora and fauna of Nose Hill with particular emphasis on the native vascular and nonvascular plants, fungi, birds, mammals, butterflies, moths, and bees.

Nature Calgary is a community that promotes the preservation of natural habitats, provides educational opportunities, and supports the collection of natural history observations. This year, the group is focusing their efforts on Nose Hill and Bowmont Park. We were contacted to encourage our members to take pictures of the Nose Hill biota (animal and plant life of a particular region, habitat, or geological period) and submit the photographs to https://inaturalist.ca/projects/nose-hill-park-bioinventory.

The goal is to publish an updated version of "The Green Book" in time for its 50th Anniversary and to monitor the changes in eleven Calgary Natural Areas. Whenever you visit a park, you can upload your observations to eBird and there are links to all these Parks at https:// inaturalist.ca/. The project is being spearheaded by Nature Calgary and the Native Plants Council of Alberta - Calgary Chapter. In 1980 "The Green Book" was called "Calgary's Natural Areas: A Popular Guide" as one of the City's most extensive repositories of biodiversity. The first of its kind when data collection began in 1975, it was cited during the planning and creation of several of our Natural Parks. Many contributions provided by citizen scientists will add to the accuracy of the new publication and are greatly appreciated.

In partnership with the Alberta Sport Leadership Association, Alberta's government is launching a new Safe Sport Strategy to promote quality programming in safe sporting environments. With a \$3 million investment, the strategy aims to ensure Albertans can participate in sports safely and confidently. It includes an independent third-party complaint process to address maltreatment in sports and a confidential 24/7 reporting system set to launch by fall 2025. This strategy is a commitment to respect and dignity for every athlete.

Since 2020, 134 film and television productions have been supported by the Alberta Made Production Grant, generating over \$35 million in spend and more than 450 jobs. With more than sixty percent of all Alberta-made projects filmed or planning to film in small cities, towns, and rural locations across the province, we are boosting the economy in all corners of Alberta. Budget 2025 is investing \$8 million in the Alberta Media Fund to help support locally produced books, magazines, music, film, and television.

Alberta's government has announced the 2025/26 funding for the International Language Teacher Bursary, awarding \$42,000 to ten teachers for language and culture programs in Spain, France, Ecuador, Brazil, and Mexico. Recipients from various school boards, including Calgary Board of Education, Elk Island Public, Lethbridge School Division, Edmonton and Red Deer Public Schools, will each receive \$4,200. This bursary supports teachers in enhancing international language skills to benefit Alberta classrooms.
