HIGHLAND PARK PLANNING AND DEVELOPMENT REPORT

You have another opportunity to provide input into a new Zoning Bylaw until May 31. This Zoning Bylaw aims to simplify and provide greater clarity for land use zoning in Calgary. It will replace the current Land Use Bylaw if and when it is approved by Council. Development of the new Zoning Bylaw is in conjunction with a new Calgary Plan that will replace the existing Municipal Development Plan. The City has also been developing the Calgary Parks Plan, a 20-year strategy to guide the development, redevelopment, and management of Calgary's parks and open spaces. The draft document will be presented to Council on May 27. See https://engage.calgary.ca/ parksplan for more information and to learn how you can contribute to the discussion at Council.

Council approved the following land use changes at a public hearing on May 6:

- LOC2024-0307 for a land use change at 4220 Centre St NE from R-CG to MU-1 to permit a residential and commercial redevelopment.
- LOC2024-0177 at 119 to 131 41 Ave NW for a land use change from M-C1 to M-H1 to potentially enable future construction of a six-storey 60-unit apartment building.

Application LOC2024-0181 for a land use change to MU-1 at 115 36 Avenue NE will be going to Council for a public hearing on June 10. The height limit on this LOC application was modified by the Calgary Planning Commission to better accommodate up to six storeys, which is the maximum under the North Hill Communities Local Area Plan. A concurrent Development Permit (DP) application is for three-storey rowhouses with some ground floor commercial space. The DP file reference is DP2024-06404.

In April, DP2025-01177 at 419 33 Ave NW was approved for a basement suite plus a large addition to the back of the existing bungalow. The Community Association and several neighbouring residents questioned the intent and purpose of the addition, as it was shown on the development plans. An appeal against the approval has been filed with the Subdivision and Development Appeal Board (SDAB). A preliminary hearing will be held on May 27. The plans for a new four-building rowhouse project at 425 – 439 37 Ave NW have been received. The file number is DP2025-02163. We believe there are significant deviations from what is allowed under R-CG land use and will be submitting our comments in opposition to the project as it is currently envisioned.

Several other significant projects still under review include:

- DP 2024-07824 to construct four rowhouse buildings with suites on the three parcels located at 4016 – 4024 3 St NW. As of May 13, it was still possible to submit comments via the Development Map.
- DP2025-01157 at 417 36 Ave NW where the plans are to build both a single detached and a semi-detached with suites.
- DP2024-09009 for a four-plex with suites at 423 33 Ave NW.
- DP2025-00515 for a four-plex with suites at 3827 Centre B St NW is pending decision.
- DP2024-08555 for two townhouse buildings with suites at 3703 Centre A St NE.
- DP2024-05781 for multi-residential buildings at 3923 and 3927 1 St NE. This is contingent upon a land use change application.

Every Thursday the City publishes Public Notices of DP and LOC applications that have been approved during the preceding week. See https://www.calgary.ca/ development/public-notices.html. Impacted residents can file an appeal to an approval to the Subdivision and Appeal Board (SDAB) up to 21 days from the date of posting. Please don't forget to include with any e-transfer a memo regarding who it's for (if your email is different from your name), and how many and what box sizes you want. 

The Good Food Box

The Good Food Box is a Community Kitchen initiative available to anyone, not just residents of Highland Park. If you are ordering for the first time, please register first, a few days before the order date, with our Lead Volunteer, Ellen, at our hall on the order date between 6:00 and 7:00 pm, or via email to GoodFoodBox@HPCA.ca, and provide your name and phone number. For new clients, we also need some basic demographics about how many people your box will help feed. You can pay for your box in two ways: 1) by e-transfer to our Board Member, Anne Naumann, at AnneNaumann@shaw.ca by 4:00 pm on the order date (please ensure you indicate what size box(es) you are ordering), or 2) with cash or a cheque at the hall on the order date between 6:00 and 7:00 pm. The pick-up date and time for the ordered boxes is always on a Thursday, ten days after the order date, at our hall between 6:00 to 7:00 pm.

Stop Apologizing Already

This is something that really took me some time and awareness to change. Maybe it's because I'm Canadian...sorry?! Over-apologizing can be rooted in people-pleasing, a fear of conflict, feeling like you're a burden, or that you don't have a place to express yourself freely. The good news is you can unlearn it by becoming more aware of when you say "sorry" and replacing it with more confident or accurate expressions.

Here's how to start:

1. Notice Your Patterns

Start paying attention to when you say "sorry." Is it when you:

- Ask a question?
- Express a need?
- Walk past someone?
- Take up space?

Awareness is the first step.

2. Swap "Sorry" for More Empowering Phrases

a). When you're late

Instead of: "Sorry I'm late."

Try: "Thanks for your patience." or "I appreciate you waiting for me."

b). When you didn't respond right away

Instead of: "Sorry I didn't get back to you."

Try: "Thanks for your patience while I got back to you." or "I appreciate your patience."

c). When you need something

Instead of: "Sorry to bother you, but..."

Try: "Do you have a moment?" or "Can I ask you something?" or "Are you free for a consult?"

d). When you accidentally bump into someone

Instead of: "Sorry!"

Try: "Excuse me." or "Pardon me."

e). When you disagree

Instead of: "Sorry, but I think ... "



Try: "I see it differently." or "Here's another perspective..." or just be curious and ask for more information on the topic.

f). When you're expressing emotion

Instead of: "Sorry I'm crying." or "I'm sorry I'm so angry."

Try: "Thanks for being here while I process this." or "I'm feeling a lot right now." or "Wow, this is overwhelming."

3. Use Apologies Intentionally

Apologize when you genuinely hurt someone or made a mistake. That keeps apologies meaningful. For everything else, aim for assertiveness and gratitude.

We are celebrating the 10th Anniversaries of the City Nature Challenge and of iNaturalist Canada. The 7th Annual Calgary City Nature Challenge was on April 25 to 28, 2025. So far, the previous year was most successful with 13,000+ observations. Other micro bioblitzes will happen all this summer. The iNaturalist platform is being used to help provide up to date records of the occurrence of the flora and fauna of Nose Hill with particular emphasis on the native vascular and nonvascular plants, fungi, birds, mammals, butterflies, moths, and bees.

Nature Calgary is a community that promotes the preservation of natural habitats, provides educational opportunities, and supports the collection of natural history observations. This year, the group is focusing their efforts on Nose Hill and Bowmont Park. We were contacted to encourage our members to take pictures of the Nose Hill biota (animal and plant life of a particular region, habitat, or geological period) and submit the photographs to https://inaturalist.ca/projects/nose-hill-park-bioinventory.

The goal is to publish an updated version of "The Green Book" in time for its 50th Anniversary and to monitor the changes in eleven Calgary Natural Areas. Whenever you visit a park, you can upload your observations to eBird and there are links to all these Parks at https:// inaturalist.ca/. The project is being spearheaded by Nature Calgary and the Native Plants Council of Alberta - Calgary Chapter. In 1980 "The Green Book" was called "Calgary's Natural Areas: A Popular Guide" as one of the City's most extensive repositories of biodiversity. The first of its kind when data collection began in 1975, it was cited during the planning and creation of several of our Natural Parks. Many contributions provided by citizen scientists will add to the accuracy of the new publication and are greatly appreciated.
