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

Rain Barrels: Make Every Drop Count

With another dry summer expected this year, we all need to do our part to conserve water and use it wisely. A rain barrel is a great way to do this. You can use what you collect to water your trees, lawn, and garden – even when outdoor water restrictions are in place.

Keeping Storm Drains Clear This Spring

Calgary has about 60,000 storm drains working to capture water and melting snow off sidewalks, streets, and roads.

If it's safe and possible to do, remove debris or snow blocking the drain. Create a channel, if need be, to help water flow.

In communities built after 1990, The City installs devices in the storm drain to control how fast water flows into the system. During and after a rainfall event, these devices allow water to pool on the road (usually in a low spot, called a trap low), until the stormwater system can accept the extra water.

If the storm drain remains submerged for more than 90 minutes or you cannot safely clear ice and snow away, take a photo and submit it via the 3-1-1 app or a web request. Attaching a photo goes a long way in helping our crews respond on a priority basis.

I've been hearing from people who are concerned about the healthcare system in Alberta and their struggles to find a family doctor. I have also heard from concerned parents worried about their children's education and future as Alberta's funding remains the lowest per student than any other province in Canada. This is why I am bringing together the Calgary-Foothills community associations to advocate for building the local schools we desperately need.

This is a very important time for the diverse cultures that make up our riding. I want to wish a Happy Easter, Happy Vaisakhi, and Happy Holi to all those that celebrate, and Ramadan Mubarak to all our Muslim neighbours. I had the privilege of attending the Alberta NDP Iftar dinner at Symons Valley United Church and brought greetings at Friday Prayer, where we discussed what matters most to the Muslim community.

It has been an incredibly busy session as the government rolled out the budget for 2024. Danielle Smith and the UCP have cancelled their promised tax breaks and once again, there was insufficient funding to address the issues in healthcare, despite staff shortages forcing emergency rooms to close for more than 38,000 hours in 2023. I will continue to work on the issues that matter to you, from diversifying our economy to protecting our environment and building transit.

It is tax season, and I hope you have received my annual "Tax Tips" for 2023 which contains information about tax changes. It is not a comprehensive list of tax-saving measures, nor is it tax advice, so for more information about specific deductions, please visit the Canada Revenue Agency website or seek professional advice. The deadline for individuals to submit their tax returns is April 30, 2024.

On April 1, the government will raise taxes on beer, wine, and spirits. This will happen without a vote in Parliament - for the eighth year in a row. I have tabled Private Members Bill C-266 to restore Parliament's power to set the tax and give elected officials the final say on taxes instead of letting the government raise them automatically.

I am a member of the Standing Committee on National Defence, and regularly question Canada's Senior Military Officers, bureaucrats, industry experts, academics, and the Minister of Defence. The Committee heard that a cyberattack in September shut down the Canadian Armed Forces' (CAF) re-location system for weeks. It is still unknown if CAF personal information was compromised during the attack. We also received testimony that rising rent and access to housing is driving people out of the CAF. In 2015 this Liberal government promised to be, "the most open and transparent Government in Canadian history" but after eight years the Minister of Defence admitted that his department fails to respond to 40% of Access to Information requests it receives within 30 days as required by law. Some requests are ignored for years.
