



Nose Hill Park is one of the largest urban parks in North America and is distinguished by its unique geological, ecological, and anthropological history (https:// inaturalist.ca/projects/nose-hill-park-bioinventory). With an abundance of remarkable flora and fauna, this project aims to record observations made by Park users. This information and a quick update were posted on our Facebook page about how the Nose Hill Park iNaturalist project is going. There have been many awesome observations this year. Since January over 2,600 observations have been added. We have nearly 10,000 iNaturalist posts made for the Park. Let's keep the momentum going! Hopefully, we will be close to 11,000 by 2025 and encourage everyone to share their photos of flora and fauna on the Hill. We recently surpassed 200,000 posts made within the City of Calgary municipal boundaries. Of course, you can post (on iNaturalist generally) your biodiversity photos from anywhere in the world, including your own yard and other favourite parks. All this data will help to guide the Nature Calgary updated "Green Book" which is currently in the data collection phase.

World Migratory Bird Day is on the second Saturday in October and again in May. The goal is to raise awareness of issues affecting migratory birds and to inspire action around the world to take measures for their conservation. Migrating birds may fly from 24 kms to 960 kms or more per day. Hawks, swifts, swallows, and waterfowl migrate primarily during the day, while many songbirds migrate at night. Calgary has over 200 bird species and is one of Canada's first Bird Friendly Cities certified by Nature Canada. Bylaws preventing off leash dogs and encouraging people to stay on designated paths can lessen disturbance and decrease the risks to sensitive grasslands species.

North Haven Learning Grounds Update

Keen observers will have noticed some recent changes at the North Haven Learning Grounds. A beautiful, mounted sign including native plant information and drawings has been installed in the amphitheatre. The sign details and drawings were prepared by Grade 6 students as part of an Indigenous Residency supported by Kalyn Kodiak, of Kodiak Herbal Métis Culture. Many of the native plants featured on the sign are present in the Learning Grounds, including in native wildflower "islands" located in the meadow.

Area residents will also be pleased to note the return of the wolves! The wolves were the result of a previous Indigenous Residency with North Haven resident Chance Bellgarde of Redman Customs and installed in 2022. Individual wolf designs were a collaboration by each grade level and inspired by student interpretations of community. Our very own wolf pack was away for a few months to receive repairs due to weathering. Repairs were supported by area grandfather, Richard Swanson, Thanks Richard!

With the beginning of a new school year, we hope the Learning Grounds will continue to welcome students and community members to explore the space. Please join us in caring for the Learning Grounds by appreciating the trees with your eyes, or gentle hands. We would like all the tree branches to stay attached to their trunks to support tree health and eventually create shade in the school yard.

Learning Grounds Frequently Asked Questions

When will the fences be removed?

Our design and installation contractor recommended keeping fences up for three years following installation to allow vegetation to establish. The fence protects our small trees and shrubs while they develop healthy roots and branches.

The obstacle play area will be accessible following warranty work for safety relative to metal edging beside pathways.

How is the Learning Grounds doing with the water restrictions?

Just like gardens everywhere in Calgary, it has been a tough year for the Learning Grounds. Between the heat and the water restrictions this summer, the Learning Grounds has suffered. The hard-working North Haven Parent Association volunteers and their children have weeded and watered when restrictions have allowed, but it's been tough. We will water again when the restrictions are lifted and assess the Learning Grounds in the spring to identify shrubs and very likely, one sad looking lodgepole pine that needs to be replaced. There will also be additional spring planting of wildflower plugs and seeds in the meadow.

Can we visit the Learning Grounds if we don't have students at the school?

Yes please! The Learning Grounds is a community space that's meant to be used. Come on in and walk the pathways, take a closer look at the wolves, read about native plants, and enjoy the space.

Who made this amazing space possible?

The North Haven Parent Association did the heavy lifting with support and amazing student involvement led by the staff at North Haven School. We also received generous donations from community members, and local businesses, what an amazing community! We won grants to support Phase 2 construction from the Government of Alberta (Community Facility Enhancement Program), TD Friends of the Environment Fund, and Calgary Foundation (Neighbours Grant). We have also received continued support from Parks Foundation Calgary.

Halloween Safety

The members of Calgary's Partners for Safety: Calgary's Child Magazine, AHS EMS, Calgary Police, Fire, 9-1-1, Bylaw, and Transit would like to remind parents and trick-or-treaters of some Halloween safety tips as October 31 approaches. Partners for Safety vehicles will be out patrolling communities on Halloween night to provide a visible safety resource for parents and trick-or-treaters.

Trick-or-Treaters

- Remember: All regular pedestrian rules still apply. Be sure to cross the road at marked crosswalks, or well-lit corners only. It is safest to work your way up one side of the street, and then cross once to the other side.
- Avoid houses that are not well lit. Do not accept rides from strangers or enter any home you feel is unsafe.
- Let your parents know where you are going to be at all times (route) and advise them if you will be late returning.

Parents

- Be certain that young trick-or-treaters are accompanied by an adult. Older children should stay in groups.
- Pre-determine boundaries to trick-or-treat within and establish a firm time to return home.

 Advise children not to eat anything until they return home. Dispose of any items that appear to have been tampered with, or that are not properly wrapped.

Costumes

- Choose bright coloured costumes that are highly visible. Adding reflective tape to costumes further increases visibility.
- Consider sending your children with a flashlight for additional safety and increased visibility.
- When purchasing or making costumes, look for materials and accessories that are labeled flame-resistant.
- All costume accessories, such as sticks, rods, or wands, should be soft and flexible, with no sharp edges.
- Consider using hypoallergenic make-up kits instead of masks that may impair breathing, or vision.
- Be sure costumes are loose enough to be worn over warm clothing, but not so long that they become a tripping hazard. Costumes shuld not be longer than your child's ankles.
- Ensure your child is wearing adequate footwear that takes into consideration weather conditions and walking.


