

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

September 17 is the one-year anniversary of the Ranchlands Edible Forest, and we could not be prouder.

The Edible Forest started as a bit of a "crazy idea" and through the hard work of our 2021/2022 Board of Directors, we were able to bring it to fruition. Over the year we spent planning and coordinating the forest, we had an incredible amount of assistance from the City of Calgary who sent in geotechnical engineers to test the soil for contamination and ensure our chosen location was appropriate. Our main sponsor, TreeCanada provided funding for both site preparation and purchasing soil, compost, mulch, and 11 fruit trees, while our other funding sponsor, TD Parks People Grant allowed us to purchase additional supplies to water and maintain the forest as well feed the amazing volunteers who helped on planting day.

We were absolutely thrilled by the number of volunteers who came out to plant the trees, armed with shovels ready to work, including Ward 2 Councillor Jennifer Wyness, Prasad Panda former MLA Calgary-Edgemont, and The Honourable Pat Kelly MP.

Phase Two of the Edible Forest was quietly undertaken at the end of July, when me and four volunteers from the community planted six additional fruit trees, which were donated to us by the City of Calgary Parks Department. These six new trees have brought us up to a total of 17 trees: six apple, six cherry, three pear, and two plum.

The exact details of Phase Three are still being determined, but our long-term goals for the Edible Forest include an addition of fruit bushes, raised beds for perennial herbs and vegetables, and even some benches so Ranchlanders can sit and enjoy the area.

Our dream for the Edible Forest is to make it a focal point of our community, something we can all enjoy and be proud of, not only because of the fresh, free fruit it will provide residents in years to come, but also because it was a project born from the efforts and hard work of community residents.


Did You Know: Noxious Weeds

The parliamentary session is on break until mid-September. I enjoy spending summertime in Calgary where I see many people at community events. Thanks to the local organizations for inviting me to participate, I had fun serving breakfast and engaging in conversations about issues that matter to you.

The current government continues to add fuel to the inflationary fire by increasing the carbon tax which raises the price of just about everything. On July 1, a second carbon tax called the Clean Fuel Regulations came into effect. These regulations will cause the cost of fuel to increase. There's no rebate for this new tax.

According to the Parliamentary Budget Officer, the tax will hit lower income families hardest, because people with lower incomes spend a higher proportion of income on necessities like home heating, transportation, and transported goods (such as food), making it a regressive measure.

There are better, more effective ways to reduce emissions than a tax plan, including Carbon Capture, Utilization and Storage (CCUS), hydrogen, nuclear, new emissions control technologies, and globally replacing coal with responsibly produced Canadian resources.

A Conservative government would repeal both carbon taxes and focus on better technology and displacing higher foreign emissions to meet Canada's global responsibilities.

Constituents are welcome to contact me with concerns related to federal policy. Feedback from constituents is critical and helps me know what constituents think about matters under federal jurisdiction.

If you are experiencing a delay in government services, and your application has passed the current processing time, my staff may be able to assist. The service standards vary over time, particularly for immigration-related applications, so please check processing times online.

It remains my honour to represent you at the House of Commons as your Member of Parliament.

What Happened 50 Years Ago to Preserve Nose Hill?

The Calgary Council of Women wanted a legacy. In 1973, the City created the park after a lengthy debate. Council rejected a development application when communities favoured a major natural environment park. "Citizens for Nose Hill" presented a "Citizens' Brief." Then a steering committee produced the "Nose Hill Design Brief."

A rezoning challenge was only one of the obstacles because much of the land was privately owned. It was urgent to preserve it because some was already sold to developers, with a parcel to a homebuilder.

Community leaders and concerned citizens collected over 5,000 signatures on a petition opposing the rezoning. They organized a march along John Laurie Boulevard in defence of Nose Hill. There was even a children's petition, and their voices were heard.

City Council voted against any rezoning. However, the City still needed more time to buy up the land. The Supreme Court of Canada gave Calgary the right to purchase land on Nose Hill at its own pace. The provincial government agreed and declared that the Nose Hill lands be retained as a public open space in perpetuity.
