

Become a Volunteer Tax Preparer!

Ranchlands Community Association (RCA) is in the process of planning to host tax preparation sessions for Ranchlanders in 2025. Through the Community Volunteer Income Tax Program, RCA will be able to host free tax clinics where volunteers can complete tax returns for people with a modest income and a simple tax situation. We plan to host these sessions in the spring and will have more details to share in the coming months.

To make this idea a reality we will need volunteers. Community Volunteer Income Tax Program volunteers can take on many different roles. Whether you prepare tax returns or provide support, you will be helping people who are unable to do their taxes on their own. Although it's helpful, you don't need experience doing tax returns to volunteer. All volunteers are offered web-based training on how to do taxes, using tax software, and determining their responsibilities. Online training can be supplemented with inperson training or virtual training sessions. We will need volunteers to host and review documents as well as prepare. And it is also possible to do the tax preparation online.



The Ranchlands Food Pantry

So far this year, the Ranchlands Food Pantry has filled roughly 90 hampers for 40 households in the community. This program is made possible due to amazing neighbours helping neighbours. The Ranchlands Food Pantry could not exist without the generosity of donations and the time that Ranchlanders give to the program.

Hamper Pickup Host

We are looking for a friendly and experienced individual to join us as a Hamper Pickup Host. Ideal candidates should have prior experience working or volunteering with confidential information. In this role, you will warmly greet individuals picking up their hampers, guide first-time visitors through the process, and put away any extra food items at the end of your shift. This position is a monthly commitment, occurring on the third Monday of every month from 4:15 to 5:30 pm. The location is the community association kitchen (7713 Ranchview Drive).

Hamper Drop-off Driver

We are seeking a reliable individual for this weekly volunteer role, which involves picking up completed hampers from the Ranchlands Food Pantry (7713 Ranchview Drive) on Monday evenings (or Tuesday evenings if Monday is a statutory holiday) and dropping them off at the doorsteps of Ranchlanders who have requested a hamper. Dropoffs are contactless. You must be available on Monday evenings (or Tuesday if Monday is a holiday) from 5:30 to 6:00 pm. We average one to two drop-offs per week, all within the Ranchlands Community.

Items in Low Supply

If you're looking to donate items to the food pantry, consider donating items in current demand, such as cereal, canned vegetables, fruits, meats, and soups. Drop-off donations are accepted at the Ranchlands Community Association RFP box, conveniently located in the foyer at 7713 Ranchview Drive NW. Operating hours are Monday to Friday from 10:00 am to 3:00 pm, with extended hours until 5:30 pm on Mondays. Your support is deeply appreciated!

Did You Know?

Seven Back to School Safety Tips



- 1. Don't stop or park within five metres of a crosswalk. It reduces visibility of people using them to cross.
- 2. Do not park or stop in an area marked with "No Stopping" signs. Obey time restricted zones.
- 3. Do not stop or park in a designated bus zone, even if it appears clear.
- 4. Do not make U-turns in school intersections or crosswalks. Go around the block if necessary.
- 5. Do not stop next to parked cars and leave your vehicle idling to 'quickly' run inside.
- 6. Never walk out from between parked vehicles. Always use the marked crosswalks.
- 7. Remember school zones are all designated as playground zones. The speed limit is 30 km/hour from 7:30 am to 9:30 pm whether it is daylight or not.

Ranchlands Edible Forest recently, you might notice something new!



Over the past couple months, our staff have been working hard on grant applications to expand the Edible Forest and were able to secure not one, but two grants to fund this!

We want to extend a huge thank you to ChangeX who provided the bulk of the funding through the AWS In Communities Calgary Fund, as well as the City of Calgary for additional funding through the Inspiring Neighbourhoods grant.

Over the September long weekend, ten concrete planters and three concrete benches were moved into position thanks to an amazing Ranchlander who volunteered their time to run the heavy equipment for us. Once the trees get a bit bigger, the canopy will provide a beautiful, shaded place to sit and enjoy some fresh air.

While our initial plans did also include adding fruit bushes, that portion had to be put on hold due to the water restrictions, so the remaining grant funds are being held in reserve until spring when we can continue with this work.

We are thrilled to make progress on this project and to have already had fruit produced on the trees this year. Though a guick reminder to please not harvest from the trees just yet, they are still quite young and require a very gentle hand for harvest to avoid damages. Also, please do not take cuttings from the trees.

Nose Hill Park is one of the largest urban parks in North America and is distinguished by its unique geological, ecological, and anthropological history (https:// inaturalist.ca/projects/nose-hill-park-bioinventory). With an abundance of remarkable flora and fauna, this project aims to record observations made by Park users. This information and a quick update were posted on our Facebook page about how the Nose Hill Park iNaturalist project is going. There have been many awesome observations this year. Since January over 2,600 observations have been added. We have nearly 10,000 iNaturalist posts made for the Park. Let's keep the momentum going! Hopefully, we will be close to 11,000 by 2025 and encourage everyone to share their photos of flora and fauna on the Hill. We recently surpassed 200,000 posts made within the City of Calgary municipal boundaries. Of course, you can post (on iNaturalist generally) your biodiversity photos from anywhere in the world, including your own yard and other favourite parks. All this data will help to guide the Nature Calgary updated "Green Book" which is currently in the data collection phase.

World Migratory Bird Day is on the second Saturday in October and again in May. The goal is to raise awareness of issues affecting migratory birds and to inspire action around the world to take measures for their conservation. Migrating birds may fly from 24 kms to 960 kms or more per day. Hawks, swifts, swallows, and waterfowl migrate primarily during the day, while many songbirds migrate at night. Calgary has over 200 bird species and is one of Canada's first Bird Friendly Cities certified by Nature Canada. Bylaws preventing off leash dogs and encouraging people to stay on designated paths can lessen disturbance and decrease the risks to sensitive grasslands species.
