Reflections For 2024 and Starting Off 2025

Happy New Year to all our Ranchlands residents and families. Our wish from your Board of Directors is for a safe and prosperous year ahead. Our community vision is that Ranchlands fosters a welcoming, vibrant, and inclusive community where you belong. Our board is committed to aligning our plans and governance with this vision.

We sure hope that the postal strike is behind us and that you have a copy of the January Roundup in your mailbox. Certainly, the effects of a postal disruption were felt in many small, medium, and big ways and had large impacts for people relying on the postal system for their livelihood. In the business of the association, we felt it in small but manageable ways, but impacted, nonetheless.

As I reflect on the past year, I see a strong community. Our Food Pantry program is great evidence of the caring and supportive neighbourhood we have. We saw a steady increase in the number of people reaching out for assistance. However, we also saw individuals making donations of food and money, businesses contributing, and the schools embracing this vision of an inclusive community, that help each other out.

Successes that we enjoyed included our Bee Hunt in May and Witch Hat Hunt in October. We hosted a Neighbour Day event in June. Very significantly, our mural was completed and unveiled in October. November started with a lively AGM with many people attending and finished with a very successful Winter Market. We will have a more detailed report of how our Holiday Light Contest evolved for the February edition of the Roundup.

For the year ahead, we will be focusing on ensuring that our Food Pantry is adequately stocked by having a food and donation drive to keep us operating with full cupboards. We will be hosting tax preparation opportunities for people in conjunction with the Canada Revenue Agency volunteer program and want to find ways to reduce vandalism and engage youth who may not have a good sense of community.

Finally, we have a chairperson for our Casino (June 6 and 7)! That is a big relief to have our main funding event underway and in hand. If you wish to volunteer, please email president@ranchlandscommunity.com.

If you have never volunteered at a casino before and are wondering what is involved, please reach out. We are anticipating a significant amount of money from that event to support our ongoing operations and programs costs.

Become a Volunteer Tax Preparer!

Tax season is just around the corner and Ranchlands Community Association (RCA) is pleased to help our residents with preparing their taxes. Through the Community Volunteer Income Tax Program, RCA will be able to host free tax clinics where volunteers can complete tax returns for people with a modest income and a simple tax situation. We plan to host these sessions in the spring and will have more details very soon.

To help us be successful, we will need volunteers. Whether you prepare tax returns or provide support, you will be helping people who are unable to do their taxes on their own. Although it's helpful, you don't need experience doing tax returns to volunteer. All volunteers are offered web-based training on how to do taxes, using tax software, and determining their responsibilities. Online training can be supplemented with in-person training or virtual training sessions. We will need volunteers to host and review documents as well as prepare. And it is also possible to do the tax preparation online.



The staff and students at St. Rita Elementary School wish everyone a very Happy New Year! Our Advent and Christmas seasons were full of excitement and joy.





Alberta's Provincial Parks Act, introduced in 1930 and amended in 2000, provides for preservation of provincial parks, wildland parks, and provincial recreation areas to benefit current and future generations. There are rules and regulations about certain activities and restrictions. Important sites for conservation management are the Wilderness Areas, Ecological Reserves, Natural Areas, and Heritage Rangelands. More information at https://albertaparks.ca/.

The original Plan for Parks (2009-2019) is archived online. A new Plan for Parks: Engagement guide and fact sheet were posted. The first phase of engagement collected feedback from Albertans to inform a Plan. In the second phase, Albertans review the draft and provide input. The proposed vision statement has added cultural benefits and Indigenous reconciliation. There may be additional fees, some partner groups, increased tourism, recreation, and campgrounds.

An Online Survey asked how often you visit parks, what do you most value, what will Alberta Parks look like 100 years from now? If you agree that Albertans should be informed and engaged in park issues, what ways are important to you: a) increase opportunities to provide input into decision making for provincial parks; b) establish clear deliverables and milestones in the new ten-year Plan for Parks; c) consistently report on progress and achievement?

Since Parks conserve nature and connect people with nature, providing access to a variety of nature-based experiences will be important, so that building an appreciation for natural values is a key priority. Which of the following options would you support? a) create more parks to increase conservation and nature access; b) collaborate to improve how information about conservation activities in parks is shared; c) expand interpretive and educational programs to inform and inspire visitors; d) add volunteer opportunities to promote hands-on nature and conservation education.

I hope everyone had a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year!

In November, I spoke and laid a wreath at the Bowness Legion Remembrance Day service where we honored those who served, those who continue to serve, and the fallen. I was honored to speak at the Holodomor Commemoration in Calgary. I visited the Foothills Academy's Grade 9 student classroom to talk about being a Member of Parliament and the history and theory of the Parliamentary system.

This winter, I stood up for Canadians in both the House of Commons Chamber and at the Finance Committee. Last spring, Parliament voted to order the government to produce unredacted documents related to Sustainable Development Technology Canada (SDTC), a "Green Slush Fund" where whistleblowers revealed that connected insiders voted to give \$400 million of public money to their own companies, and hand them over to the RCMP. The government failed to do so. Each of my Conservative colleagues has spoken in the House of Commons on this very important motion to release the documents.

The Finance Committee has studied the effects of the Capital Gains Tax increase on Canadians and undertaken pre-budget consultations. This government's tax policy is killing jobs by driving investment and skilled Canadian workers out of the country. Business investment in capital like machinery, equipment, training, and intellectual property is shrinking, and productivity is falling. My Conservative colleagues and I will name a Tax Reform Task Force of entrepreneurs, inventors, farmers, and workers to design a tax cut that will allow Canadians to earn powerful paycheques and pensions and cut the paperwork and bureaucracy in the tax system by at least 20%.

Feedback from Calgarians is very important to me, please feel welcome to contact me through my Calgary office.

It remains my honour to represent you at the House of Commons as your Member of Parliament.

Polar Bears' Secret Colour



How to Be a Great Communicator

Just because we speak and understand the same language doesn't necessarily mean we are good communicators. One of the most common reasons couples seek my services is to learn better ways to communicate. The list below is for anyone who would like to hone their own skills.

Let's Start with Some Bad Habits in Communication:

- **1. Interrupting** This can make it seem like you don't care what the other person is saying. Yes, sometimes I get excited and blurt things out but it's important to acknowledge the other and be respectful to allow them to continue. This can also be an issue if you are neurodivergent, and the speaker doesn't know this.
- **2. Story-Topping** This can shift the conversation from connection to competition.
- **3. Bright-Siding** Always encouraging others to be positive or look on the bright-side can be invalidating. Toxic positivity is a thing, allow others to feel what they are feeling.
- **4. Being Right** The conversation becomes a debate or about being right. Try to listen to understand the other's point of view... you might learn something new.
- **5. Being All-Knowing** Explaining information without being asked for your expertise. This can sometimes make you look like a know-it-all.

6. Advising – Sometimes people just want empathy or just to be heard. They didn't ask for your advice. Do not offer it unsolicited. This can also be seen a boundary violation.

Here Are Some Habits of Good Communicators:

- **1. They create conversational safety** free from judgement, fault finding, or rejection. Just be there to listen.
- **2.** They validate other people's feelings with statements like; that makes sense, of course, or I get that. It doesn't mean you have to feel the same way, but you are showing that how they feel is valid.
- **3. They follow their natural curiosity** by asking questions that show interest and seeking to know more. Nothing feels better than someone showing interest in what you have to say or wanting to get to know you better.
- **4.** They listen with their whole body by being fully present while listening; not looking around or looking at their phone and are giving non-verbal cues that they are fully engaged such as eye contact and facing the speaker.
- **5. They hear what's beneath the words** by reading the speaker's body language, tone of voice, and facial expressions. This is an art form of attuning to another.
