

Controlling Foxtail Barley in Tuxedo Park (For the Dogs!)

Let's all make a push to make Tuxedo Park dog-friendly and foxtail barley free!

You may have seen the wispy seed pods of foxtail barley around the city recently. Foxtail barley is a native grass known for its potential hazards to pets, particularly dogs. The City of Calgary has recently updated its Community Standards Bylaw to better manage this plant. Previously, control measures were enforced when the grass reached 15 cm, but the new amendment mandates intervention at 8 cm. This change aims to prevent the plant from seeding and posing risks to animals, and the bylaw comes with a potential \$500 penalty if the foxtail barley is not managed on a property. Residents of Tuxedo Park are encouraged to maintain their properties and adhere to these guidelines to ensure the safety of the community's pets.

What You Can Do

On your property and in your garden:

- Cut foxtails short to prevent them going to seed
- Pull them out by hand
- Pour boiling water on plants to kill them

Tip: Property owners are accountable for maintaining the area next to their property, including boulevards up to the middle of the alley and the street.

For Your Dog

- Avoid walking through areas with foxtail barley if possible and reduce the risk by keeping your dog on a leash.
- Keep dog hair/fur short around paws, toes, and armpits.
- After walking: check dog for any foxtail awns, especially in ears, crevices or folds of skin, paws, and mouths.
- Remove awns with tweezers.
- If your dog is sneezing, shaking their head, scratching, rubbing, or chewing right after a walk, take them to a vet immediately to be safe.




Silent Pride:The Wordless Anthems of the World!

Accidental Poisoning

Emergency Medical Services (EMS) would like to remind parents and caregivers of precautions to prevent accidental childhood poisonings around the home. Ingesting prescription or over the counter (OTC) medications is a significant cause of accidental childhood poisonings. Other causes of poisoning include ingesting or coming into contact with household items such as dishwasher tablets, mouthwash, or chemicals such as paints, solvents and cleaning products.

Medication Storage

- Place all medications in locked containers and store in an area inaccessible to children.
- For easy identification, store all medications in their original packaging; do not mix multiple medications in a single bottle.
- Install child locks on all cabinets, or drawers where medications are stored.

Safety Tips

- Child-resistant medication bottles are not child proof. They can still be opened by a child.
- Take extra precaution with medicines designed to appeal to children such as chewable vitamins or flavored cough and cold syrups.
- Promptly dispose of any medications or toxic household products no longer in use.

Prevention

- Store household products, cleaning supplies, and cosmetics in locked cabinets or drawers.
- Install child latches on cabinets children might also access by climbing on counters or chairs.
- Label all plants in and around your home and garden.
- Antifreeze, windshield washer fluid, and pesticides are extremely poisonous. Even small amounts of these can cause serious illness if ingested.

Poisoning information can be obtained by calling the Poison and Drug Information Service (PADIS) at: 1-800-332-1414.

In case of a poisoning emergency, call 9-1-1. Provide the name of the product ingested and, if it is safe to do so, a sample of the substance for EMS to inspect on their arrival.
